CHAIRMAN'S NOTES:

First of all, a massive thanks to Becky and the Social Club for their wonderful Christmas tree and decorations. It certainly brightened up the village during the festive period.

The Parish Council met recently and approved the budget for 2023/24. They agreed a 5.9% increase which is a £3.74 per annum increase based on a band D property. In setting this year's precept, your councillors have set budgets as low as possible while still attempting to retain a similar level of services. Unfortunately, they were faced with reduced grants from Braintree District Council and rising costs.

The last remaining village pump, which is situated in front of The Cedars, Church Road, is in a poor state of repair. Councillors recently met with Eastlight Community Homes, on whose land the well stands, and they have very kindly agreed to undertake the necessary repairs.

I'm very pleased to advise that Stephen Sudbury has again volunteered to oversee the village celebrations in relation to the King's Coronation in May. More details will follow but if anyone is interested in getting involved, please contact Stephen on 07885-467712.

Also in May will be the local council elections. Please do think about becoming a Parish Councillor. If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor (see page 4). the nominations period opens on 27th March and closes at 4pm on 4th April. Please contact BDC - elections.team@braintree.gov.uk - direct for further information. Full details and nomination forms will be available on the BDC website nearer the time.

Councillors appealed to our Essex County Councillor at the last Parish Council meeting in relation to traffic calming measures through the village. Cllr Chris Siddall has agreed to put forward a 20sPlenty application in relation to speed limits in the middle of the village near the primary school.

It is very pleasing to see that the village shop is progressing well and not a lot of time has been lost despite the very poor weather recently. Now the roof goes on, one can see the outline shape of the extended pavilion building.

PARISH COUNCIL AND COUNCILLORS:

What is a Parish Council and why Become a Parish Councillor?

A Parish Council is a local authority which makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish. Itis the level of government closest to the community. As it is the authority closest to the people, parish councils are invariably the first place people will go to with concerns or ideas. For this reason, they are a vital part of any community.

What powers to Parish Councils have?

They have a wide range of powers which essentially relate to local matters, such as looking after community buildings, open spaces, allotments, play areas, street lighting, bus shelters, car parks and much more. The council also has the power to raise money through taxation, the precept. The precept is the parish council's share of the council tax. The precept demand goes to the billing authority, the district council, which collects the tax for the parish council.

What decisions do Parish Councils make?

Parish Councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), crime prevention, managing open spaces and campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities.

It is true to say that on their own Parish Councils have limited powers to make decisions. But they do have the ability to negotiate with and the power to influence those other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the district council, health authorities, police, etc.). In this respect, Parish Councils are extremely powerful. The organisations that make the final decisions know that a parish council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something and its views will be taken seriously.

How much time does it take up?

Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings may last two or three hours depending on the agenda set for the meeting to discuss. Some councils have committees to deal with specific subjects. In addition to regular meetings, councillors are required to attend other meetings representing the council. For example, acting as a representative on an outside body, community activities or helping develop a new project for the community.

How long does a Parish Councillor serve for?

Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years. If they then want to stay in the post, they can stand for re-election.

Parish Duties

Gosfield Parish Council has nine councillors who stand for election every four years. It meets every month and considers planning applications and any other matters referred to it by local residents, Braintree District Council and Essex County Council. All meetings are open to the public and there is a forum before the start of the meeting at which members of the public can raise concerns and ask questions. There is also an annual meeting which all parishioners are invited to attend. All meetings are advertised on the council notice board and our website. Residents can bring to the attention of the parish council anything that concerns them, either directly or through the clerk. If matters raised are not the responsibility of the council, the clerk can bring them to the attention of the proper authority.

If you do become a parish councillor, you will have to sign up to the Code of Conduct and disclose your interests.

The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now. Come along to a parish council meeting or speak to one of our councillors and find out that they think of the job.

FROM THE VICAR - ST. CATHERINE'S CHURCH

Dear all,

In these first weeks of the new year, I'm sure I'm not alone in spending time reflecting on the past year, and looking ahead to this one. We've been through a challenging few years, as individuals, church families, communities and indeed globally. Last year, I think many of us were full of hope for a better year as we came out of the worst of the Covid pandemic, but then the invasion of Ukraine happened, the cost of living started to rise sharply, and that sense of optimism took a blow. As a result, there's a certain wariness about this new year, and a reluctance, I sense, to be too optimistic or hopeful for what it might bring, in case we are disappointed.

But even in the midst of that sense of anxiety and indeed trepidation, I have been reminded that it is always possible to find hope. And perhaps, when times seem difficult and the dark clouds loom large, it is in the smallest things that we can rediscover that hope.

I came across a picture I took a few years ago of some tiny cyclamen flowering in the shade of ferns: a small cheerful display in what otherwise might seem a gloomy space. They poke their heads up from the leaves confidently, shining bright white, and touched with colours of deep pink. Their circumstances might seem unpromising, but there they flourish. They are so small, but nonetheless are resilient. Along with other winter flowers, they make their appearance at a time of year when most of nature lies dormant, and they remind us that life is still bubbling up, even out of sight.

There's a bible verse that came to my mind along with the picture of the cyclamen flowers. The prophet Jeremiah, agonising over the suffering of God's people, reminds them of this:

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

The assurance of the Christian faith is that, whatever is going on around us – or even inside us, in terms of our thoughts and feelings – there is one constant in which we can trust, and which always gives us hope and confidence. God's love never changes. It is unconditional, unwavering. He never leaves us nor forsakes us.

Whatever faith we hold to, or none, I hope that as we step further into 2023 we will be able to find hope, joy and reassurance – in the natural world around us, in our spirituality, in our relationships, in making our contribution in our communities. Like the cyclamen, may we have the chance, and the courage, to shine bright.

GOSFIELD CARPET BOWLS CLUB:

Gosfield club continues to expand and we are close to having a full complement of playing members. We hold club nights twice a week on a Monday and a Wednesday evenings. Both are well attended with an average of 16 attendees on a Monday and 9 on a Wednesday evening.

Club nights are generally social evenings but with playing Carpet Bowls still being the priority . During the evening we play on average two mats at a time playing 9 ends during the first half and 5 ends after a break for refreshments of coffee and biscuits. These games enable the members to improve their skills and helps to teach new members the rules plus the playing skills necessary for them to progress to playing more competitively in the Winter Leagues and individual Essex County Championships held throughout the year.

As well as leagues games and normal club nights we also play "friendly "matches against other local clubs that do not play in the league matches but play solely for the fun of playing carpet bowls. These can be fun nights but they are also played with a degree of competition.

Gosfield play in the North West Essex Division of the Essex Carpet Bowls Association. This season is the first since the COVID lock down with the number of clubs playing in the leagues reduced due to closure of a number of clubs due to the effects of of the COVID lock down. Members from some of the closed clubs have joined other clubs that survived the Pandemic. This has had the effect of reducing the number of clubs playing within the Winter League but has not reduced the competitiveness within the leagues

The Winter League closes at the end of March and Gosfield has 4 more games to play before the termination of the league . At present we are in a mid table position and hopefully we will finish around that position as the league ends.

Normally this league is followed by a Summer league with a reduced number of clubs competing . Not due to COVID for once , but because many club members play out door Lawn Bowls during the summer period , plus of course some prefer to go on Summer holidays.

Now is the time to start to boost your training levels!

MEMORIES by Linda Marlow (Richardson, Kemp)..... cont'd.

Now we are into 2023. My goodness and what a world we appear to be living in but was it similar in the days gone by ?

I watched an old documentary on the year 1922 quite an eye opener of issues betwixt the 2 World Wars and much severe unrest in Ireland. That era was the time my Mother was a year old and a boy in America called Wendell Kelley was also in his first year of life. Neither knew Gosfield would be where their lives would be remembered in the future. Wendell served in the USAF during WW2 and Sylvia was called up (the only girl from Gosfield) to serve her country too, but with feet firmly on the ground. I'll bet she now has her wings for all the good deeds she did over the years.

Gosfield recently held a commemoration service at the site of the then 42 yr old Col Wendell J Kelleys' Jet crash site in 1963. Sylvia's husband an Ex. Military man himself but then an Essex County Ambulance Medic was asked to assist the USAF medical services in the area of the crash. He never disclosed to me any details of that day nor did he of many other things, some sad, that he was called upon to help with in the village.

I remember one day PC Johnson banging on our door asking for Dad to follow him to a motorcycle accident asap and another time to attend a lady after being knocked off her bicycle in the main road both instances while they await an Ambulance ... which when it arrived 'George' of the Halstead crew saidoh! "Hello Doug and what have we got here?" I won't go into all the babies he delivered, some in desperate circumstances but I would like to mention one case, the WJ Courtauld Maternity Unit in Braintree sent for an Ambulance (Braintree crew) to transfer mother with birthing difficulties, Bells ringing (no blue lights then) to St Johns Hosp. in Chelmsford but soon en route a decision was made and Doug safely delivered her of a son. She did say Douglas would be in his names when christened. I do recall as a teenager Mum quietly saying to me 'go put your father's uniform shirt in the bucket of cold water and add half a cup of salt in the water, a common solution in those days before Vanish etc. to remove 'certain' stains.

I said I would tell you one day about the pollution of Gosfield Lake during the war by the Americans billeted nearby to the Lake. ELVER LANUM was serving as a cook with The US Army/ Airforce 647th Bomb Squadron flying out of the village airfield. Elver had a worry with vermin etc., in his supplies for the kitchen so one day he took a load of DDT and scrubbed out all refuse cans and spread it all about the camp. He had no idea it would wash into the Lake and that it would kill all the fish until it was reported but by then he and his company were moving off to France. It was a tragedy indeed and hundreds of fish were dead and thousands swarming by the edges of the lake gasping. This was in 1944. I wonder though what the Americans were burying in the area beyond the now Cedars houses where a village lad saw lorries and soldiers digging at night and he quietly crept up to spy on the proceedings but was rumbled by American soldiers.


