

PARISH COUNCIL AND COUNCILLORS:

What is a Parish Council and why Become a Parish Councillor?

A Parish Council is a local authority which makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish. It is the level of government closest to the community. As it is the authority closest to the people, parish councils are invariably the first place people will go to with concerns or ideas. For this reason, they are a vital part of any community.

What powers to Parish Councils have?

They have a wide range of powers which essentially relate to local matters, such as looking after community buildings, open spaces, allotments, play areas, street lighting, bus shelters, car parks and much more. The council also has the power to raise money through taxation, the precept. The precept is the parish council's share of the council tax. The precept demand goes to the billing authority, the district council, which collects the tax for the parish council.

What decisions do Parish Councils make?

Parish Councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), crime prevention, managing open spaces and campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities.

It is true to say that on their own Parish Councils have limited powers to make decisions. But they do have the ability to negotiate with and the power to influence those other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the district council, health authorities, police, etc.). In this respect, Parish Councils are extremely powerful. The organisations that make the final decisions know that a parish council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something and its views will be taken seriously.

How much time does it take up?

Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings may last two or three hours depending on the agenda set for the meeting to discuss. Some councils have committees to deal with specific subjects. In addition to regular meetings, councillors are required to attend other meetings representing the council. For example, acting as a representative on an outside body, community activities or helping develop a new project for the community.

How long does a Parish Councillor serve for?

Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years. If they then want to stay in the post, they can stand for re-election.

Parish Duties

Gosfield Parish Council has nine councillors who stand for election every four years. It meets every month and considers planning applications and any other matters referred to it by local residents, Braintree District Council and Essex County Council. All meetings are open to the public and there is a forum before the start of the meeting at which members of the public can raise concerns and ask questions. There is also an annual meeting which all parishioners are invited to attend. All meetings are advertised on the council notice board and our website. Residents can bring to the attention of the parish council anything that concerns them, either directly or through the clerk. If matters raised are not the responsibility of the council, the clerk can bring them to the attention of the proper authority.

If you do become a parish councillor, you will have to sign up to the Code of Conduct and disclose your interests.

The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now. Come along to a parish council meeting or speak to one of our councillors and find out that they think of the job.

FROM THE VICAR - ST. CATHERINE'S CHURCH

Dear all,

All around us new life is starting to spring up. Although we've had some cloudy and rainy days recently, we do need the rain and it will help all the plants just starting to show their young shoots, whether in our gardens or on our local farms.

In the Bible, Jesus often uses images drawn from farming and cultivation. Thinking about the name of this magazine, the Grapevine, reminded me of that he often refers to the Kingdom of God as being like a vineyard. We think of a vine connecting us; it is also a plant that, when healthy, is very fruitful. It needs to be well rooted to flourish, and pruned at the right times of year. We have several vineyards across our part of north Essex now, producing local wines, and their orderly rows of vines are very pleasing to see.

The image of the vineyard prompts us to reflect on what helps us to grow well. We too need to be well rooted, knowing where we find security in life, and choosing well the values that shape our lives: the type of soil we are rooted in will affect the fruit we produce! There are times in life when we seem to be being pruned, cut back, and while painful at the time, many of us would say that during times of darkness or struggle, we know that we have also grown. Ideally, we will find that we are fruitful, able to contribute to our family, our community – but if there are times when we feel we can't achieve much, when life is hard, we hope that a patient gardener, or vinedresser I should say, will tend us, fertilise if needed, and wait until we are able to grow and produce fruit once more. And vines need support, being grown on trellises or wires. We need support too, and that's where being a community comes in. We are able to keep an eye out for each other, come together to mourn and to celebrate, and help each other grow and flourish.



GOSFIELD CARPET BOWLS CLUB:

Our club is gradually recovering from the affects of the Covid Pandemic that occurred over the last two years or so. Membership is now back to 25 members, the same as it was before the lockdown. We lost some members because of the long period of inactivity and new members have joined in their place. Many of these members were new to the game of carpet bowls but are proving to be very enthusiastic and keen to play club games and competative matches within the Essex CBA, league program. We enjoy also, playing social matches against local clubs that do not play in the Winter League program of the Essex CBA.

Our main activity and enjoyment however, is meeting twice per week throughout the year to play our normal club style carpet bowls. The Winter League program for 2022/23 finishes at the end of March 2023 but will commence again from September 2023 to March 2024. together with the Essex Championships for singles, pairs, triples and fourball. Members of the Gosfield club can play in these championship competitions as individuals the winners of which can play at a higher level against other areas in England before finalising in the National competitions played each year at Potters.


With the worst of the freezing weather behind us, we can start to look forward to warmer days ahead.

GOSFIELD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

By the time you read this, the Spring Show will probably have been and gone. If not, please exhibit or visit. The Show is open to the public between 2.00 pm and 4.00 pm. As well as displays of spring flowers and seasonal produce, we will be hosting the "Intervillage Floral Competition", where several local villages enter a floral display of spring flowers from their own gardens. Gosfield won the shield last year.

Although it has been an unsettled couple of weeks, weather-wise, Spring is definitely here. The earlier varieties of daffodils are in bloom, Primroses and Wood Anemones are out in surrounding woodlands, bees are out and about, and the birds are signing well and busy building nests.

This all means that it is time to start planting and sowing the summer flowers and vegetables. Seed potatoes and onion sets generally go in the ground around Easter time. The ground is warm enough to make outdoor sowing of vegetables such as parsnip and carrots, and salads such as radishes and early lettuce. Under glass, sowings of leeks and more lettuce can be made, and it will soon be time to sow courgettes, squashes and beans.

Remember to protect just about everything from the pigeons, but try not to disturb nesting birds, frogs and toads. Keep a small part of the garden untidy for insects, partly to feed these creatures, but also as essential pollinators.

MEMORIES by Linda Marlow (Richardson, Kemp)..... cont'd.

Back at Fishers Farm (do keep up) Travelling Gypsies of the old style with ornate wagons and their families would camp in the fields nearby at Harvest Time to help local farmers , these wandering folk had been visiting Gosfield for generations bringing in crops or root veg like Swedes and Turnips. They were there and working when War broke out and all the able bodied men signed up to fight for their country, leaving the women and children and the elderly to remain at their camp by the farm to help with the work. A stray bomb one day nearly destroyed them all and the Orchard as well.

Old Reg Burder and I sat one day talking of olden days of farming and he gave me a photo taken of him with his scythe after the final threshing of the corn harvested on Hall owned fields before the Red Combine Harvester took the job away from the men. Reg Burder was a village cricketer back in the day as was Barry Broyd and his Dad Ken.

Dear JOSIE, I can see you and Buster both swirling around a dance floor or rock 'n' rolling. The King and Queen of the Jive. I am so sorry for your loss. I can remember the wonderful 'hands of pork' from your farm that I slow cooked to get every piece of meat off when times were hard and Richard and many others were on a 4 day week. I remember when you Josie knocked at my door saying you had brought me a stinky present !! and there stood my son Mark in a 'mucky' state, to put it politely, whilst his wellington boots stood beside you stuffed with newspaper after he and his pal 'stub' (you know who you are) had been chasing about on the Farm with your own much missed Mark and of course my boy had to be the one that stepped into an old cess pit. ... Memories.

Some good and some funny and some very sad and some are stories never to be told, but that's life and it blooming well hurts sometimes. As I type this another cricketer, a Halstead one, and twice Halstead Mayor and a respected teacher and town councillor for many years, David Hume, is being remembered at his memorial service at St Andrews, which reminded me again of Barry Broyd taking over as the Gosfield Councillor after my Dad retired. They have much to discuss up there. A lady called Janet Turner wrote in the Hasltead Gazette about how kind David was to her mother who lived in Gosfield. I remember Janet fondly her parents the Whybrews ran a small Nursery opposite the Church. Janet also had the longest plaited hair I could never compete ... if she should ever read this then Janet I remember you so well.

Another cricketing family the Chinnery's are also mourning the loss of their Uncle David Wiffen . A Gosfield boy, his sister Janet married cricketer Barry Chinnery. As a girl she was my Aunt Iris' bridesmaid. Finally the recent death of Anne (South) nee Jeggo a Gosfield girl born and schooled in the village (her twin sister is Doreen Clarry). Their late brother Tony Jeggo was also a Gosfield cricketer. May all those having departed 'Rest in Peace' I remember you all and will do until I go away with the Fairies from whence I camesupposedly.....but Oral History is like that.

MEMORIES by Linda Marlow (Richardson, Kemp)..... cont'd.

I am heart sore at the loss of another friend from the village. Barry Brovd. Barry his wife Sheila and son Daniel were at Richard's funeral only a few months ago and this news has really made me think again of the fragility of life. I virtually watched Barry growing up from starting school. His brother Geoff and myself were that bit older and my heartfelt sympathy goes to all his family.

Years ago when Barry and Sheila first married they rented a lovely bungalow along the Lake road to Beasely End (also Beiseley or Beazley). Always having been interested in history I was told by Barry that the property was built using the very last of the bricks made at Sunnyside brickworks along the road from the Lake. The old brickvard there had to have its fire kilns put out during the war as the glow would direct the Enemy bombers to the aerodrome beyond the lake, which on a moonlit night was also a give away to enemy aircraft as was the Church tower but I digress (aet used to it). Further along Beasley End Rd. was 'Fishers' Farm, with the lovely pond in front. It was then owned and farmed by the Parmenters. ..Old Reg Burder (as he was by then) would on a wet day when little could be done outdoors sit down on an upturned bucket in the barn cleaning and oiling tools (pre stainless steel) and the damp clay mud he gathered he would mould into little animals.

Kit Parmenter kept one of a squirrel I think it was on her mantel piece above the fire where they dried solid for years. She told me there was a secret door under the old carpet behind where I sat. She rolled away the carpet to reveal a wooden hatch type lid and of course I knew that was to a cellar as I had been down the one in the Church (that had ancient coffins in it) when I was a member of the Young Communicants. At the farm Kit said this is not over a cellar. How about a secret tunnel then? I was told by an old relation in Castle Hedingham that there was a secret tunnel from the Castle opposite our cottage that ran to Colchester Castle so the soldiers could escape attackers when it was under siege etc. back in the day. Fact or Fiction?

Well, I was also told the fairies left me for my Mum to find and I believed that!! Maybe I will go away with them one day, who knows.

So what was under that cover in the middle of a busy farm house to walk across? It was a deep well, quite a scary one too and I had seen down many a well in the village but never inside the house. We played about the Ox Yard well and told off for lowering the bucket on the chain as it was not a toy. (No, but it was guite fun) at that memory as I type it is our late Ox Yard friend Brian Williams' March birthdate. His Mum Doris taught me so much regards knitting. Which I am busy doing now for my Gt Grandson who is almost 2 mths old.

The depth of our village WELLS in the Hedingham Road were the deepest and the one in Ropers Row was dangerously deep.. It stands now in the garden of the house built much later at Gosfield Corner after the demolition of many a thatched and old property. This demolition took place in villages in the late 1920's and early 1930's. I think I wrote about them before in either this or the Halstead and Local History magazine. When I sold Gable Cottage the Well there was still the only source of water for the property. The well was about 8' deep. And beautiful water. 26


