MEMORIES by Linda Marlow (Richardson, Kemp)..... cont'd.

Well I hope you are all well and managing to enjoy the Summer thus far.

I was hopeful there would be no further mourning here but I spoke to soon. A couple of weeks ago my brother Doug's wife Doris suddenly passed away and it has been very sad indeed since.

I was going to ask him to give me some memories of what he and his mates got up to in the school holidays in our village but haven't had the heart to trouble him. I said this to my youngest son and he said well my memories in the 70.s were swimming in Lake or Pits or going over to the Park to watch the cricket. Going on bike rides and having fun at the Fete....loving ice lollies and Coconuts.

So as the Wimbledon Tennis ended with a sight of my baby sister Wendy's ex-boss seated near The Princess of Wales watching the Men's Singles final and what an amazing match it was. Stan Smith a past winner of that illustrious trophy in the early 70's having beaten Nastase. My sister Wendy worked and travelled the world circuit of tennis with Stan and his family for many years and they still live close by to her in USA. He is 'the name' on some Adidas trainers etc. He visited Gosfield during one Wimbledon season 'day off' to have tea with my parents and see our village. But back to the reason I went to work with Wendy after 7 am her time and lunchtime here as she was facing a 110 degrees hot day but used to it there. She worked as a Park Ranger at Sgt Jasper Park in South Carolina when she had school age children. Now she runs the visitors centre, less dangerous than searching through the woods trying not to tread on deadly snakes etc. looking for lost visitors at gate closing time. I love it in Sth Carolina where you can buy bags of Pecans or huge Peaches roadside.

She was driving to work and had me on speakerphone and could only say that her Gosfield summer memories always seemed so sunny and she didn't remember rainy days but there must have been some. Again cycling came into the mix. Roaring into the Spinney and the dips of an assault course. For many of us post war folk, it was the bomb damage that created the massive pits. She still had to attend piano lessons though regardless of school hols. The 2 teachers in the village were Molly Hindes and Jean Howard, both equally good. Ladies who worked but Molly ran the Guides and Jean 'Church Organist' in their spare time.

Wendy recalled the Lake and Park for fun and picnics... and the Fete and Gymkhana. Also entering exhibits from school or separately with her pal Carolyn Everitt. Her Dad, entered veg and flowers in the Horticultural Tent. Wendy recalls holidays away for a week some as 'distant' as Gt Yarmouth. Most were local sea fronts unless we went to visit our Grandpa in Lytham St Anne's, Lancashire.

Why wasn't I on the holidays with them? Well, our Grandad Drurys' sister went from owning a shop in Bexley Heath, to buying a 12 roomed house in Eltham, South London but had later developed Parkinson's disease and I was sent on the London coach (pick up by the Green Man) to go stay and look after her so that her daughter and family could take their 2 weeks in Weston Super- Mare. Eventually taking my own sons along until Gt Aunt died in 1981... She grew up by the Mill in Alderford Street, Sible Hedingham.

All my activities were very Church organised as I've written before but still it's 'The Park, The Spinney, Cycling and rambling across fields and of course The Lake' but I was also helping at Gosfield Hall aged 12 when my Mum was ill, working with lovely Barbara Mason. Or I was up at the Drury House helping Nan to 'salt' runner beans in earthenware pots (no freezers) or bottling lots of fruit just picked and being in the Pubs 'both them', but that's another tale.

PS. I watched the planting of the trees on the Green. Such a shame one has gone.



Gosfield Pits Nature Reserve

The Nature Reserve continues to provide a pleasant haven for informal recreation, particularly dog walkers, and a limited amount of path clearance has been undertaken in July, to ensure that it remains accessible. More will be done in August.

Some essential tree work was undertaken in late winter, to ensure that trees do not cause any foreseeable safety concerns, and a little more is to be done this Autumn. Keep an eye out for warning signs, and please respect any path closures that may be necessary during the work.

Unfortunately, we have had two vandalism events this year. The restored and replaced notice board just inside the entrance to the reserve from The Street was ripped out, broken, and thrown in the pond, by a person or persons, of reasonable strength. Now the board has dried out fully, it will be restored and replaced again very soon.

A less costly event was the equally senseless act of throwing one of the life belts in to the adjacent pond. They are there to be used for saving life, and must remain easily accessible for use if ever needed.

It is tempting the suggest that the perpetrators of these two actions should be ripped up, broken, and thrown in the pond without a lifebelt, but I simply ask, "please do not do it again!"

Finally, in early July, a young lad was found with a small campfire in the reserve, well made, and well under control. However, the surroundings were tinder dry, and it is all too easy for a fire to spread. Having seen the consequences of major forest fires in Spain, Portugal and France (and having been close to a small one), I can assure you that we do not want such an event on the edge of the village. Build dens, go fishing, watch birds, climb trees, but please, no fires in the reserve, unless they are part of an organised management operation.

Interested in Taking on an Allotment ?

The allotments are located in the village opposite Greenfields in The Street, Gosfield.

Once a plot is allocated the tenant must sign and return one copy of the agreement before any activity commences on the said plot. Rents are payable in arrears.

Plots will be inspected at frequent intervals to see that plot conditions are being complied with in accordance with the agreement, by our allotment Officer Councillor, Bob Waters.
