

The King Charles III Coronation Garden

During January you may see some groundwork being done in the playing field to the left of the Community Shop in front of the 2 green sheds. We are planning to create a Community Garden for Gosfield and its visitors to enjoy. This is a joint project between Gosfield Community Shop, The Coronation Team, who provided all the entertainment over the Coronation Weekend last May, and Gosfield in Bloom, assisted by Matt Jarvis, Chairman of The Gosfield Playing Field Management Committee and supported by the Parish Council.

Matt will be doing the groundwork and hard landscaping for the garden, which will include paving the area with trellising in front of the sheds enabling us to grow a selection of climbing plants to screen them. As the spring comes in we will be planting the climbers, a central standard tree and a variety of tubs within the area. We will also be re-siting the original Gosfield village sign into the garden, which is at present being renovated, and providing some seating.

We have been lucky enough to secure a grant for £3,000 from the Community Gardens and Open Spaces fund, administered by Braintree District Council, which will help pay for the initial work and the rest of the funding will be supplied by the three main groups involved with the project.

It's an exciting project, which we plan to have completed by late spring, and we hope you enjoy watching it develop.

I was lucky enough to spend some time with an elderly relation of the Sparrows'. An old servant there had said that the entrance hall in the mansion of the 'Place' was so wide you could drive a cart down the corridor to the rear of the building. There was a boat house down by the river (Sparrows pond) where the insides of the walls were covered in Oyster and sea shells. The old original house 'Biggs' was left to become a ruin when plans to extend and improve were refused at the time and a legal battle ensued but regardless the mansion Gosfield Place was built.

Here's a recipe from one of the kitchen home demo parties written in the back of the diary. 8oz Self Raising Flour.1 ½ oz of butter, 4 oz Grated Cheese, ¼ pint of Milk, pinch of Salt and pinch of Cayenne Pepper. Heat Oven to 425deg F. Method...SIFT the Flour into mixing bowl add the Butter and rub it in 'lightly'. When the mix is crumbly then add the Cayenne and salt now add the grated Cheese mix it in and add the milk to make a soft elastic dough which should leave the bowl clean .. the amount of milk can be adjusted (and it wouldn't have been semi skimmed in those recipes) ROLL the dough out to approx. ¾ inch thickness and using a 2 inch cutter once you have the rounds just lightly brush the tops with a little milk and bake for 10 – 15 mins once cooked split and spread with butter and fill with some cooked bacon or not...that's up to you. Enjoy.

Oh and for Christmas 1973 I was given a Transistor radio... in a lovely Orange and Cream hard plastic casing. To stand near my orange units. But a Big surprise was Miss Lewin my Mum's friend bringing a box of sweets in for the children and her mother's sewing machine for me as my ancient Treddle was constantly causing problems. The prettily decorated machine was in perfect running order and with it came a bag of lovely soft material that she would like (when I have the time to make her a blouse. Which I duly did and gave to her for her birthday on 23rd January she was born in 1902 the same date different year as a scouting friend of mine which leads me into Scouts and Cubs briefly.

We have lost another old friend of the Scouting Family. At a time when groups are being amalgamated with other areas. Gosfield now comes under Braintree. I attended along with Steve Sudbury and Peter Dyson who were Flag bearing and Karen Howlett a retired Cub Leader like myself to the Memorial of Paul Hailey. His dedication to Scouting was well documented at the Memorial and over one hundred attended but I have another memory of Paul and his Father a soldier from London serving here during WW2 and marrying a local girl. They loved going Fishing, very early in the morning. Walking from Halstead across the back way into the old grounds of Gosfield Place and down to the river to guietly fish. It was misty above the ground very early and suddenly Mr Hailey said to his son DO NOT turn around lad. Just keep looking across the water but Paul, like us village children playing in the half dilapidated houses which have notices warning of dangers after the war, he just couldn't resist turning and never forgot what he saw. It was an old lady who was walking across behind them above the mist and going towards the waterfall (oh! you didn't know Sparrows pond had a waterfall? Well you do now.) The old lady had a shawl over her head and a quiver type sack on her back full of twigs but what Paul noticed was she walked above the low lying mist her feet not touching the grass beneath and he never forgot it. I am typing this on All Saints Eve but it's a true story. Investigating years later when myself and Paul Hailey were members of the Halstead History Society we delved into things people locally were told about, such as the clock still chiming long after it had been dismantled and the 'Place' demolished.

There was once a little gate lodge by the old entrance of the original position of BIGGS later The Place. The old lady that lived there was 'smoked' out one year as she would not re locate. When they finally got her out she cursed all sons of the Sparrow family that none would have a long life ...and she was seen many times wandering in the fields near where her cottage once stood. Regards the curse I suggest you read up on the Sparrow lineage of sons as it is quite tragic. One son after the Boar War however survived his injuries. He drove his sister and a friend in their horse pulled open cart to visit other friends at Dynes Hall betwixt Halstead and Castle Hedingham .They approached Doe's Corner a smaller much sharper junction than now and high banked. There they would drive the cart straight across and up the lane leading to Gosfield. But suddenly at the last minute decided to go the opposite way (left) and into Halstead via North Street (now called Hedingham Road) the sudden turn surprised the horse and the cart's wheel caught and rose on the bank turning them over and the curse of the old lady robbed the Sparrows of another son.

MEMORIES by Linda Marlow, Richardson, Kemp.

I pulled out some old DIARIES 1973, 74 and 75. In the 1973 one The Young Wives were getting Christmas sorted bazaars and the trip to the Pantomime for after Christmas.

The children went to The Civic Theatre in Chelmsford to see MOTHER GOOSE.... Ticket money due in by the 8th December. '73. My friend Johan paid for her and Geraldine and my two eldest and me. There was a Hannays Book Sale on the 6th up at the school. I spent part of my wages there and set aside money for my friend Margaret Kirk who's sadly no longer with us nor her husband Tony but both fondly remembered, she had hosted an at home sales party on the 4th I met up with Johan and paid her for the Pantomime tickets too . On 14th December a frightful GALE had blown, howling wind and trees bending, it rained so very hard. This was in the 3 day working week and the POWER strikes with cuts of power often hours in length but luckily none on Christmas Day , even so I baked and cooked on 'the power times' just in case.

The beginning of '73 was much brighter, we (the country) entered the COMMON MARKET on the 1st. but I had dithered too long in '72 to book for us to go on the trip to the Panto so on the Thursday 4th I took my boys to London to the Pheonix Theatre and saw some named greats like Michael Hordern (later SIR) as the donkey in a production of WINNIE THE POOH..... the boys loved it, and the Underground and the Train ride a carriage to ourselves, and all I could hear were their little voices 'Isn't it Funny How a Bear Likes Honey' ... doesn't make sense to you ? Maybe you have never read 'Winnie the Pooh'

We played Badminton at Bocking and Gosfield, my late husband Richard was very good player and his friend the late John Butcher was too.

On April 23rd we set off to RIPPERS the WOODWORK suppliers in Hedingham with a friend to collect the most gorgeous tangerine ORANGE coloured kitchen units. Specially made and measured in the factory there. It was a new line they were producing. Another choice of colour was Avocado, Marsha and Watson (my school pal whose dad owned Aylwards Farm) chose the Avocado. I had already papered the dining area with modern swirling Orange coloured wall paper SO it had to be the Orange for me. Is it really 50 yrs ago Marsha? You upgraded decades later but I could never part with mine it was Keith Broyd that papered and emulsioned the ceiling and another friend George Archer came along and fitted all the units. He was the go to carpenter living along Braintree Road. Dick Morgan who lived in the Cedars my Mums' friend Betty's husband always helped us out with electrical problems.

We WIVES attended numerous parties (not the drinking sort) those selling ladies items (remember PIPPA DEE ?) ... I know you do Gladys and Heddy and Dee Minor childrens wear oh and one that the late Ann Clark and Pauline Holmes jointly hosted where the lady just tipped piles of things on the floor in the lounge and we literally kept reaching into the pile ... I chose a pair of Orange checked trousers, oh how I loved Orange or RED. I wore them until they became stuffed animals for a Bazaar at the school years later. I never wasted material.

Sometimes shopping was hard once the 3 day week kicked in. I had to sometimes still get essentials. Mark needed new shoes £1,75, Lee needed an Anorak that cost £2.35 and Paul needed Boots £1.50 and the socks were 64p a pair. And my Mum saw some trousers for them at 68p half price in a sale. Now that's pure JOY when you are struggling. One thing they never lacked were BOOKS we were a book mad household and for all school sales we sent lots of books and toys for resale and scoured the event for ones yet to read. Lee was reading very early, destined it seemed for his adult career in education. But if I gave him a shilling to buy things he' bought back' what he had donated. My needlework skills helped pay for things as well and I accepted challenges like making a Denim jacket and jeans for a friends son. Maternity wear for friends and altering this and that when folk bought something that wasn't quite right. My relations had retired from running the Green Man and I acquired a lovely smiling honorary son while his Mum Janet learned skills in the kitchen there that made it famed for its catering. Mr and Mrs Arnold new licensees.




