Applicants are banded (a) to (d) in order of priority as follows:

- a) If you live and have lived in the Parish of Gosfield continuously for at least two years
- b) If you have lived in the Parish of Gosfield for not less than five years during the immediately preceding ten year period
- If you are employed full time in the Parish of Gosfield and have been so employed for a minimum period of two years immediately prior to make application
- d) If you either live or are employed in the Parish of Gosfield and have done so for a period of less than two years or are a member of the family of a person who lives in the Parish of Gosfield

Applicants must then meet certain financial eligibility criteria as per the attached leaflet.

PARISH PONDERINGS - FROM ST. CATHERINE'S CHURCH Thoughts for the month:

The daffodils in the Rectory garden are looking better than ever this year. Somehow they have multiplied and there seem to be many more than last year, especially under the trees at the bottom of the garden. They are a blaze of colour, and draw the eye even on a gloomy day. I have put no effort at all into cultivating them, but there they are, pure gift and grace!

At the moment, it can be very easy to feel dismayed and pulled down by so much of the news from the world around us – wars and disagreement and conspiracy theories and injustice. And it can make us anxious to look ahead as well, with a general election on the near horizon in the UK, as well as the presidential election in the United States which we know can have such an influence on the wider world. It is good that we look up and out and are engaged in the society and world of which we are part, caring about issues and doing what we can to make a difference. But sometimes, especially when it all seems a bit too much, I think it gives our minds and spirits a break to look down, to look at the small things close at hand, and let some of the big and difficult things recede for a few moments.

Those small, cheerful, comforting things might be different for each of us. For me it is the daffodils, or sitting next to my sleeping cat watching him snooze – preferably while I have a big mug of my favourite coffee to hand! For others, it might be taking time to get engrossed in a favourite creative activity – gardening or crafting or model making. For yet others, listening to music – properly listening, not having it on in the background – soothes and uplifts.

There's a world of difference between unhealthy escapism where we cease to engage with our world and seek continual distraction to stop us feeling things; and healthy "mini-breaks" where we take time to care for our minds and emotions and spirits by setting aside our burdens for a moment, whatever they may be, and immersing ourselves in something that gives us joy. Those moments may only need to be brief to make a difference, but they require that we are fully present for that time, using our sense to soak it all up, letting our shoulders drop and our breath get deeper and our hearts smile.

For Christians, connecting with God in prayer and contemplation can bring those moments as well, and those of other faiths and none find refreshment in meditation and contemplation as well. All it takes is a quiet space, for whatever time we have. Apparently, the mother of the Methodist minister John Wesley used to sit on a chair in her busy family kitchen, and lift her apron up over her head when she took time to pray, as a sign to the rest of the family not to disturb her – even in busy lives, there are moments of peace to be found or created.

Do take care of yourselves, mind, body and spirit. God bless.

Memories, continued:

I had a boyfriend Peter, there were a few Peters in the village. Pete Robinson from the Kings Head his Dad Frank ran the pub. Peter Roope, an altar boy who lived near the Drury House in Braintree road. I hope that he and his sister Rosemary are still around. There was Peter Clanford. I know he is about as we spoke not so long ago. There was Peter Patmore and Pete Castle from just out of the village. Are you reading this Pat Warner (now Clarke)...are you remembering all the names? Do you recall how we all piled into the row boats on the lake?

There used to be 2 yachts on the Lake back in the 1850's cared for by an employed regular Sailor. The Lady of the Lake and The Aerial were the yachts. Swimmers were a common sight at weekends.

I saw on the news a couple of weeks ago that Donald Campbells Hydroplane was restored and taken back to be displayed. It was such a tragedy at the time. I can remember the hydroplanes on Gosfield Lake roaring about ... I'm not sure there was anywhere local that they couldn't be heard.

A memory from 1913 was the Elizabethan twisted chimney at Dial House. It became unsafe and had to be pulled down and rebuilt. That was not my memory! but I remember when at the OLD Record Office in Chelmsford I read a document with the account of a Last Will and Testament, a man had left money for his Landlord to repair that old chimney. The Lee family lived there when the Ox Yard was still thatched. I have a photo of my teenage Mum standing in the doorway of Dial House before a band of Hope meeting. I remember old Miss Pepper living by there too ...but she probably wasn't as old as I thought. I spent a lot of time in the cottage where Maggie has her hair Salon, there was also an Antique shop there and before that a cobblers (the retired village policeman Mr Norman repaired shoes there after WW2) and before that it was a sweet and tobacconist shop where the tobacco was weighed using a penny, one man always sought out the newest penny so he got the maximum amount of ' baccy'. I spent time at the far end of that cottage (it was 2 dwellings then) reading to a lady called Miss Springall who had a very bad heart. Her bed was raised right by the window so she could see everything. Another window bed like that was for a London actor, I think in the 1930's, ill with consumption his bed was raised so he could see out of the Gable Cottage roadside window. He and his friend lived there and show business friends from London would come and visit for weekends. Famous ones like Noel Coward and Ivor Novello too. The grave for him is in our churchyard across the path from my Drury Grandparents' grave. Ironically another famous person's grave is across the path from my Mum n Dads grave several feet from the Porch is Jack Hylton and his wife's grave. Born' Hilton' in 1892 and died in 1965. He was a pianist and composer as well as a Big Band Leader ironically he grew up in Staley Bridge Lancs... where my Dad as a teenager lived. Who knew one day they'd be buried nearby each other? Maybe he knew my Grandfather's Pub or my Gt Grandad's bakery. Back in my youth the Easter choir would have been practising the Anthem for Easter Sunday service and the voices so distinctive of Mr Pye and Ted Dyson would be heard by all, they were both small in stature but not in voice. I won't be spending April in Paris but The Empire in Halstead of which I am a Trustee will have plenty to entertain locally. It will be 109 years old in May, From April 1st all films will be £5. Children's cinema still £3. Enjoy.

MEMORIES with Linda Marlow, Richardson, Kemp:

Memories are not always my own. We all of us will have some inherited from those who shaped our lives...sometimes reshaped by our own ambitions or contentment with our lot. I am a Gemini . I have had a life thus far with one foot in the village that I love and another part of me in Theatre. I loved dancing in shows, I danced with Miss Foster's academy just down the road from The Empire theatre in Halstead I wrote plays that myself and Susan Brierly from school acted out. I love the Spring.

I love April. I loved April in Paris many moons and many memories ago. Walking at 00.04am after everyone had left The Olympia Theatre on Boulevard des Capucines. Walking past Place Vendome with the musicians and tech after a couple of hours spent unwinding with carafes of Red Wine and much discussion on how the show went. I remember I was seated beside Henry Mancini's mother and family that night instead of by the sound console. Henry had the floor above the performer that I did charity work for. He was based in Hollywood. Henry was a lovely man and it's no surprise that he was an amazing composer and orchestra leader.

My memories of Paris I hope will always stay with me and also ones of Hollywood high in the lighting box overlooking the outdoor seating in front of the Greek Theatre ' High' in the Griffith Park near the famous Observatory there. Watching wildlife scampering around the rows of seats eating whatever had been dropped. Always much to be done when an audience has gone from wherever in Paris or USA or a basement in Spain listening to an ex chart topper ...retired... with his own mini stage to entertain old friends or until Covid I would still be in another cellar in London with OLD Rockers as am I. Happy to be invited to their 80th birthdays or 70th Dave Edmunds, Vince Eager and others. American Charlie Gracie who sadly passed away after Covid. I wasn't selfish all those years of here and there. I took my husband or brothers and sisters, Mum n Dad, friends my dear Cousin who idolised Charlie G as a teenager and going back to April in Paris I was as usual straight back into my village life on return. My husband Richard approached me with a request. Would I consider taking his Badminton friend (and a friend of mine too) Eileen Whiting from Petersfield Farm to see her idol in concert at the Paris Olympia....it was the nearest that year on a tour he was appearing so would I, could I? maybe arrange it? Luckily I could and off we went. I spent some time as usual at the sound desk with a lovely young man who turned out to be Tom Jones' son.... Mark Woodward I took Eileen to some of my favourite places and I hope she is still with us and remembers... it's all about memories.

As a young child I spent time in the garden with Dorothy Lewin's father. Such a nice man until he ruffled my hair, He was a retired Lloyds Bank Manager in Leigh on Sea near the house where my Nan grew up. He bought Gable Cottage after WW2. It had just been renamed from The Limes Cottage. Most of the trees along that part of the street when he bought the cottage were cleared to build The Limes Estate the building work started around 1949. The Cedars were also built. Much change to the village but it was happening throughout the area. The Coldnailhurst estate in Braintree and White Horse Avenue in Halstead etc.

There was in Halstead The Savoy Cinema built in 1918 and The Empire/ Theatre Cinema 1915. The Plaza in Sible Hedingham 1927 and Braintree had The Embassy and in the High Street was The Central with the rear doors opening onto Sandpit Lane. Goodwins Fish and Chip Shop at the top end by Rayne Road. Halstead had a Fish n Chip shop too, in the row of old houses leading to the Bridge.

In Gosfield, my friend Mick's Dad (who owned the Greengrocers shop in Halstead) 'Doug Fleet' was coming around with a Fish n Chips Van...stopping in I think 3 places. By the Green Man is the one I recall.






