

# CHAIRMAN'S NOTES:

The Parish Council have been very active dealing with various matters on behalf of the parish.

All planning applications to Braintree District Council have been reviewed and commented on accordingly. One application which is of particular note is that by Gosfield School to construct a new eco-centre and open air amphitheatre within their grounds. Your Parish Council have considered and fully support this application.

The Kings Coronation Garden committee have now finalised the garden at the side of our new community shop and must be congratulated as it looks superb and is a real asset to the village.

We are hopeful that after many delays, mainly due to weather conditions, we will soon be in a position to have a final specification for the resurfacing of the playing field car park. This will enable us to obtain quotations and start the fund raising process.

We have recently been reviewing an application regarding proposed diversions of public footpaths and in formulating our response we will take into account the views of both parishioners and the landowner.

The land at the top of Meadway opposite to the new development is to be transferred to the Parish Council as part of the planning agreement and the Parish Council will also be receiving a sum of money to be placed in trust for the upkeep of that land. This matter is currently with solicitors and, until the land is transferred to us, we unfortunately cannot deal with or make any bye-laws in relation to this land.

The Parish Council own the playing field and pavilion but delegate the day to day management and maintenance of those areas, excluding the children's play area, to Gosfield Playing Field Management Committee which is a separate body of volunteers. The relationship between GPFMC and the Parish Council has recently been formalised in an agreement which was recently approved by both parties.

The Parish Council understand that there has been some recent speculation and discussion in relation to the Kings Head Public House. At the last Parish Council meeting, the matter was discussed and it was agreed that the Parish Council would lead and undertake whatever steps that it was able to do in order to help preserve the future of the Kings Head.

Finally, a huge thank you from me to all who have made me so welcome here in Gosfield. I will hold you in my prayers in the months to come.

# Lord Nugent

Tony Sale's wonderful aerial photo of the South West Front of Gosfield Hall on the front cover of last month's magazine, reminded of just how much Gosfield Village or at least its geography owes to Lord Nugent.

Lord Robert Nugent came from an aristocratic Irish background though he spent all of his life in England. He had been married originally to Lady Emilia Plunket but she had died in childbirth in 1731. In 1736 he then married Anne Craggs the owner of Gosfield Hall. Anne had already been married and widowed twice and through her marriages and family inheritance was quite rich. Though contemporary accounts said that she was 'fat and ugly' that was no barrier to Robert Nugent who was described by a contemporary as 'a jovial and voluptuous Irishman who had left popery for the Protestant religion, money and widows.'

Anne had a personal fortune of some £100,000, a huge sum in those days and also the patronage of a parliamentary constituency of St Mawes, Cornwall which enabled Robert Nugent to enter Parliament where he made many speeches but never attained high office. He could also use his wife's fortune for the remodelling of his new estate and Hall at Gosfield (In recognition of this good fortune he changed his name to Craggs-Nugent in honour of his wife.) Anne may have been 'fat and ugly' but she was an excellent hostess and Gosfield Hall welcomed many distinguished MPs and authors like Hugh Walpole.

Gosfield Hall is a courtyard house with 4 fronts. The original Tudor front survives but two of the other sides had already been remodelled, one by Anne's second husband John Knight. Lord Nugent now remodelled the South East front in the contemporary Georgian style which you can see from the windows and white painted facade.

To give the Hall a fashionable view he had an ornamental lake constructed by damming the Bourne Brook. He then set about creating a landscaped park along the lines of the designer Capability Brown. That meant planting clumps of specimen trees many of which still survive. (The Cedars at the top of the Playing Field and some Wellingtonias on the Golf Course.) So that the views would not be interrupted by fences and hedges, a Ha Ha wall and ditch were constructed which would keep the cattle out and the deer into his Park and a subsidiary one round the Hall itself. The one along Hall Drive still survives though in a sad state of disrepair apart from that bit in front of the Playing Field owned by the Parish Council.

Anne died in 1756, and in her memory Lord Nugent had memorial erected in Gosfield Church. It was by a famous 18th century sculptor called Riesbrack so no expense was spared, although it is a rather elaborate memorial for a simple Medieval church like Gosfield. (Incidentally, I discover that there is a similar memorial to Anne's sister in St Germans church in Cornwall by the same sculptor, presumably paid for by Lord Nugent).

Lord Nugent then married a third time, again to a rich widow but he left behind no sons only daughters and Gosfield Estate then passed to this son in law the Marquess of Buckingham.

# The King Charles III Coronation Garden.







# MEMORIES from Linda (Marlow, Richardson) Kemp

I am hoping some of you read Tricia Edwards suggestion that you can submit articles you think would be of interest to Grapevine readers. It was part of her council report on the first page I do not know Tricia but she speaks for the council so I hope you do show an interest. Snippets from your memory bank be they long ago like mine or more recent years. It all creates a tale of village life. An Historical record. You might think it is worthless, but Local History builds a wealth of information for the future of the village long after we have left it to the ' babes in prams' of today and so on.

Mentioning people, etc., helps future Family searches. Social History is as valuable as grass roots history. We hear about Elizabeth 1<sup>st</sup> visiting Gosfield Hall but in depth we find she was just calling in on her friend from childhood Lady Maltravers en route elsewhere.

We know of a French Duke escaping France to England with his poor suffering wife pushed from pillar to post but staying a good while at Gosfield Hall thanks to the benevolence of the then owners. Indeed becoming the King of France whilst staying there.

A landowner in the village actually risked the wrath of an earlier century English King by marrying his daughter who had simply fallen in love with him There was much slapping of wrists to put it mildly .loss of lands and banishment to the tower, but then the King needed the fella so sent him off to fight for him.

Gosfield had a few Manors, as you probably know, each Manor would provide for the King or Queen a Knights quarter regards provision of men, etc., for battle and they did have a few battles. The Manor of Hodings was the area surrounding the old vicarage. Then you had Shardlowes. Bellhouse. Biggs which in the future became the area around Ox Yard and Gosfield Place The Hall house with a Kings beam is Street Farm. All these parts of history of the village can be easily researched but something ' however small' that a dear old villager recounts that their Gt. Gt. passed down to them is worthy of being written and told over and over.

Land was always being swapped about or sold off. The land around the Kings Head belonged to Sir Richard Jepson. Who is he when he's at home? Or maybe it was never his home? There's someone to track down for a keen sleuth.

People of standing like the Vicar of the Parish were not always where you expected them to be. One Vicar resided in a pleasant coastal town having installed a lowly and little paid Curate to see to the Gosfield souls. The errant Vicar meanwhile retaining the stipend of course. Others, like Henry Lettisom Elliot took the Parish to his heart with his family and was much appreciated.

Village fetes before the Park were held in the Vicarage grounds, quite extensive to the rear also in the area now of School Park Estate or beyond the Bourne Brook (Sparrows Pond) and Gosfield Place. Large events were held sometimes in Royal celebration. We have photographs of wonderful ladies in costumes and Pageantry. I mustn't forget that Fetes were held at Cut Hedge too.

# D-Day 6<sup>th</sup> of June 1944 - 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the Allied landings in Normandy, 6th of June 1944, the successful invasion of the beaches, codenamed Operation Neptune, and Overlord. The Normandy landings made up the largest seaborne invasion in history and played a crucial role in liberating Western Europe from Nazi occupation.

D-Day altered the course of history, signalling the beginning of the end for Nazi Germany when Allied forces shattered Hitler's Atlantic Wall, opening another major front.

On the 5th and 6th of June 2024, the UK will commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day with a series of major commemorations and events across the UK and in France to honour the brave service men and women who risked their lives in the cause of freedom and peace, there will be a special 80th Anniversary flag at St Catherine Church from the 31st of May.

Here in Gosfield we commemorate Albert Edward Williams [see photo opposite], Guardsman 2722670 of the 3rd Battalion Irish Guards, killed in action on the 3rd of August 1944 at the age of 29, the son of William and Maud Amy Williams of Gosfield.

The battalion landed in Normandy at Arromanches on the 23rd of June and served throughout the Normandy Campaign, both the 2nd and 3rd battalions served as part of the Guards Armoured Division and took part in Operations Goodwood and Bluecoat, the attempt to capture the town of Caen (Goodwood) and the battle to take Mont Picon. It was during Operation Bluecoat, one of a series of offensives designed to pin down as many German divisions as possible to enable a breakout further into Normandy and beyond, that Guardsman Williams was killed.
