CHAIRMAN'S NOTES:

On Friday, 20th September, I met with Chris Siddall, our Essex County Councillor and Tom Cunningham, Essex County Council Cabinet Member for Highways, together with several residents who live on Braintree Road. The meeting was to discuss the speed limits between Foley Corner and the 30mph limit near Street Farm. Residents, together with the Parish Council, wished the 40 mph then 60 mph then 40 mph restrictions to be changed to 40 mph from Foley Corner to Street Farm. We were able to witness at first hand the problems these residents have to face with the traffic and getting their children to the bus stops without any paths. I am pleased to report that Cllr Cunningham agreed that the speed limit should be changed to 40 mph and indicated that this could happen sooner rather than later.

Whilst Cllr Cunningham was in the village, I asked him about the possibility of a zebra crossing in The Street. He and Cllr Siddall have agreed to look into the reasons why this has never been approved in the past.

Could I please ask again for residents with hedges abutting the footpaths to cut these back. Some are causing serious problems to residents with prams and wheelchairs.

The pétanque court has been approved and is awaiting construction on the playing field.

It's that time of the year again for the members of the Gosfield Carpet Bowls club when playing for pleasure on a club night is now joined with playing competitive matches against teams within the North West Essex Division.



St. Cedd:


Cedd's life began in the Kingdom of Northumbria under the tutelage of Saint Aidan of Lindisfarne. The oldest of four brothers (Chad, Cynibil & Caelin), Cedd in particular would be unwavering to the Celtic Rite imbued to him by Aidan.

Four years after Aidan's death in 651, Cedd is said to have been consecrated by the hands of his successor, Saint Finan, of Lindisfarne.

In 653, Cedd was sent into Essex to aid King Sigeberht of the East Saxons. Again Cedd's evangelism was highly successful, and Essex was thoroughly Christianised. For his efforts Cedd was ordained Bishop of the East Saxons and is now the patron saint of Essex.

The chapel of Saint-Peter-on-the-Wall in Bradwell-on-Sea is said to have been built by Saint Cedd after his ordination.

MEMORIES, from Linda (Marlow, Richardson) Kemp

It's that time of year again. Officially 'Autumn'. Back to school, those few who attended still wearing summer clothes dried quicker in class after a vicious spot shower than those who trudged up the drive in new winter style woollen items that were often a size too big and slow to dry. The sizing to be grown into for economy.

Looking for the best 'CONKER' to use in games after school. It is now frowned upon. But historically it was great despite a few sore knuckles. From an early age we knew our HORSE Chestnuts from our SWEET ones. We knew Conkers were poisonous to eat. But they also scared off Spiders in the house.

Later on November / December usually as we took the short cut home across the park from school we would start to see the fallen SWEET Chestnuts. Using the park as a short cut in the mornings was frowned on by Teachers and Mr. Caretaker. Muddy shoes when we walked in on clean polished wooden floors.

It was always best to wait for that Chestnut drop as that's when they're ready. Seasonal, wild and free. So much to pick or pick up. The Bullace fruit, or Crab Apples, Laden Elderberry bushes. Beech nuts, Rose Hips for making syrup for the young (or itchy powder!) Sloe berries for your Gin. Admittedly we grew up knowing what was edible so today I recommend reading or going on line to familiarise yourselves.

In the 1860's a man visited Halstead and Gosfield. A letter from him came to light at the Halstead and District Local History Society and my late and much missed local Historian colleague and ex. Halstead Gazette journalist Dave Osborne wrote about it. The letter was from Mr Harry N. Lee of Fulham and he was comparing his 1930's visit to memories from that previous one. He wrote about walking across the fields from town to village and stopping to pick Beech Nuts from the hedges en route. Expressing surprise at the houses built since his previous visit as he approached Cut Hedge and he continued on to the Kings Head for a rest opposite the Coffee Rooms. He enquired of the Publican if anyone of the name of Lee was still in the village and was told a George Lee lived nearby and then actually pointed to the man sitting on a bench outside. It was 65 years since Harry had last seen him. Later walking around the village he noted several houses had been built and that they added to the already 'picturesqueness' of the village.

On visiting the Churchyard he noticed several stones denoted that members of the COURTAULD and SPARROW families were buried there. On walking to the Lake he noted accommodation for bathers and a goodly number of people fishing.

Returning to Halstead he called at The Bull Hotel where he found great alterations had taken place. He told the Landlord that, many years before the OLD ARMY and NAVY PENSIONERS had been paid there once a quarter, his own father being included.

After walking around some familiar routes Harry ended up at The Bird in Hand to bid farewell to its Landlord who surprised him by pointing out 'someone he might know' and there just behind him sat an old cousin that he hadn't seen for 69 years.

It's a small world, but was definitely smaller in that era as folk weren't so tied to a specific area with their jobs linking them to their homes. Continued 15

Nice reading about Maurice Rowson in last issue, Thanks Bill.
