

PARISH PONDERINGS - FROM ST. CATHERINE'S CHURCH

I cannot be the only person who finds the first three months of the year a struggle, with cold, grey days and long, dark nights? Over the last couple of weeks, though, we have had some beautiful bright mornings, with clear skies and sunshine, even if it has still been frosty. As we look around our gardens and the local countryside we can enjoy the welcome sight of the spring flowers, with daffodils, crocuses and snowdrops giving us hope that the warmer weather is on its way.

Within the church calendar we are marking the season of Lent, a time that mirrors the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, after his baptism in the river Jordan. For Christians Lent is a time of reflection, waiting and hoping as we move towards the events of the Easter weekend – Jesus' arrest and trial, his life sacrificed on the cross for us all, and his glorious resurrection from the dead, on Easter Sunday.

Self-sacrifice is part of Lent, and many test themselves by giving up something they really enjoy – chocolate, cake or alcohol, perhaps. Remembering the sacrifice made by so many service personnel who gave their lives for our safety and freedom will also be the theme on May 8th when Gosfield, along with many other communities, will be celebrating the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe.

As we watch and listen to the news, though, it may seem that humanity has learned nothing from two world wars. Then I look at the diversity we see in Gosfield – the many different clubs, groups and pastimes people pursue - and, still, we have been able to come together to plan, and will celebrate the 80th anniversary of VE Day as an inclusive and united community. That, too, is worth celebrating. Would it not be amazing if that way of living could be emulated across the globe?

GOSFIELD NATURE RESERVE

The nature reserve continues to be a place for dog walkers and others to enjoy, and the spring flowers are putting on a good show, with several large patches of snowdrops almost over, and the primroses just coming in to bloom. Sadly, Muntjac deer are busy destroying the excellent display of Male Ferns. Several dangerous, dead Alder have been felled this winter, some hazel coppice cut, and tree surgery to oak and ash along the footpath from Greenways have been reduced to remove potentially dangerous branches. One of the footbridges has also been repaired.

The Parish Council is in the process of updating the 5-year management plan. If you have any particular ideas about how the Nature Reserve might be improved, your comments will be welcomed.



Many stories were told in the village by the adults in those post war days, and children were seen but not heard. We heard a lot by just being seen in GOSFIELD and listening. The village was very much still a bomb site in PLACES and we knew of them because you were told NOT to go there, but some did. Recollections may vary. The village policeman was of the silent breed ...No sirens, a Bicycle with a rusty Bell little used. The look- out rarely heard him approach ears got boxed with a pair of leather gloves or if you are a girl the warning of "I know your Mother young lady sufficed"... Interrogation took place on the spot'. NOW then, where are the boys? What boys sir? (They had of course done a runner across the field before a word was spoken). ME? I was an intrepid lone explorer. Totally innocent but of course some Recollections may Vary.

Back to the present day and as always in Spring especially in March I think about the birthdate of one of the gang of village explorers Brian Williams. So do go sit on his memorial bench and glance about at this village. His family heritage was Pilgrims' and Newcombs' much a part of Gosfield Social History through centuries past. Did we ever break rules around the forbidden deep WELL?. Did we explore the back part of Dial House by the old laundry cottage in our search for the enemy behind the broken timbers? NO of course not... However..... Recollections may 'WELL' Vary.

"Anyone for a game of Pétanque?"

A number of residents banded together to raise funds and organise having a petanque court made next to the pavilion on Gosfield Playing Field.

This has now been completed and is ready to be used and enjoyed by anyone wishing to play. The court is large enough to enable two matches to be played simultaneously. In the event of there being a queue to play, it would be appreciated if those on the court could limit their play to 2 games.

MEMORIES ...from LINDA. (Marlow, Richardson) KEMP.

RECOLLECTIONS MAY VARY...as our much-lamented late Queen Elizabeth 2nd is quoted as saying. Whereas now it seems it was first uttered by Prince William's aide and later said to Her Majesty by (the then) Catherine, Duchess of Cambridge. However that's an example of a memory varying yet again and if so should one 'never' say anything about anything ever again? Acting on the side of caution perhaps, waving goodbye to debates, comments, opinions hearsay and LOCAL HISTORY.. which is sometimes also based on recollections. Possibly, but looking for the fact is sometimes a grey area. Am I Older and Wiser? YES and NO. Although it can be uncomfortable just sitting on the fence. I prefer to jump off...regardless of stinging nettles. Ouch.

I remember quite clearly my curly haired young sister screaming as my mother yet again tried to brush her hair "keep still or I will get a pair of scissors and cut your curls off "she told her.. Now my sister was still heaving with sobs and unable to toddle away, so I saved the day. I went to the sewing basket and picked up the scissors and started to snip at the curls. She would never have to go through that ordeal again, poor little mite. That's my story. The version that my mother told everyone probably even the milk man Mr Shadrack was that she left the room to take the kettle off the stove and returned to see my sister happily sat whilst I chopped her hair off because' I was jealous' of her curls. Recollections may vary.

My sister was half paralysed at 6months of age in 1950 from the Polio Epidemic that hit this area in the late 1940's early 50's. Halstead and villages had many casualties varying in severity. But it had created a protective instinct in me. Her tiny curled feet were nightly placed into straightening boots affixed to a metal bar and a nut tightened. Much to her great upset and groans of distress. A Great Notley Hospital's physio boot torture spanner was kept on a shelf downstairs but I could reach it easy enough. First though, my military training kicked in (recollections may vary). It was just after the war and we raiding parties were jumping off dead trees in the village and partially standing walls whilst wearing old Gas masks and parents uniform jackets and caps .. So with such experience I would creep down the stairs avoiding 5th and 7th creaking tread and cautiously push the lounge door open to reach the spanner to set her free. My brother (14 months older than me) taller and stronger but not a rule breaker (recollections may vary). muttered it was too much risk and returned to reading his Beano Comic. A smack was permitted parental punishment in those days. Our Head Mistress used a wooden ruler across the back of a leg, or hand.(It hurt for a while! so I'm told) I digress...and SO Back to my night manoeuvres to rescue my poor sis. Many a good sleep she had thanks to my success. But getting the key back in place was the biggest risk as I replaced it onto the shelf just one time too many. My arm was part through the gap in the door and a rather big hand grabbed it and pulled me in. I had sight of trouser legs but my Father was a 6'4" ex CMP in the Army and after night missions in Italy he was wise to insurgents in the dark. Not I confess usually wearing PINK WINCYETTE PYJAMAS with ROSEBUDS on. It was a long way up to see his face so I meekly looked at the floor. Afterwards I ran into my brother's room and shouted 'I had a smack'... "SO" he replied you are used to it "I quietly left the room ... I think Mum ironed his crumpled Beano comic later.. Recollections may Vary. continued


