Once again, I have to thank our treasurer Russell Couch for all he does in producing the hall's monthly and annual accounts. The problems Russell experienced last year with Octopus Energy continue and Russell has now agreed to complete the hall's self-assessment tax return for which I am most grateful.

I also have to thank our very long-term secretary Bill Pasfield for all he does for the running of the hall. Bill has to be congratulated for still having the enthusiasm to turn out on cold winter evenings to attend our meetings and for preparing the minutes and agendas for our meetings.

Finally, I would like to thank all the committee for their dedication in attending our meetings and contributing to the smooth running of this superb village asset for all the residents of Gosfield and neighbouring areas to enjoy.

MEMORIES and such like from LINDA. (Marlow, Richardson) KEMP:

I am thinking about my uncle (Owen) Mick Drury. Currently in Larchwood Residential facility. He will be 90 this month, August. His career as a Carpenter in the locality, Tennis player, brilliant Ice skater and Bridge player, also a village helper wherever it was needed often seen repairing the Pavilion or helping to get the Fete 'set up' and indeed 'taken down'.

Tales people can tell about their area over the span of decades reminds me of another Drury. We are 'Gosfield' residents from a couple or three centuries ago. Also, Sible and Castle Hedingham as well as Halstead and Sudbury. My late friend Dave Osborne a Local Author, ex Sports reporter for Gazette etc until retirement was a dedicated searcher of archives etc for Local History he also excelled in the Old way of oral language for this area. The late Fred Pawsey DFC and Local Teacher was also brilliant and funny at giving talks in our 'dialect'. I digress as usual. SO, Dave and me sat at the table with old papers and he said 'Lindy Lou here's a good 'un - another Bloomin' Drury wouldn't you know it. WILLIAM DRURY and his memories". One of the eldest local inhabitants after the Great War, having spent his whole life around hereabouts. So let me take you back.

In his late 90's as he spoke of his memories. He was about 8 years of age and already at work, his hours were from Daylight till Dark. For this he received 2d a day. From his recall of that time he never really thought he was under paid. The men he worked with on the land had the same hours. Go to work in the dark of morning and go home in the dark at night for which they were paid about 9 shillings a week (45p). His own Father worked for this wage as they had 5 sons and 3 daughters to care for. William worked on a large garden. Where the Railway later stood (for the new folk in our area that was adjacent to the current Public Gardens) the land was then owned by a Mr Cook..Nowadays the area is a block of Flats behind the Garage filling station. As William grew older he took a position at SLOE HOUSE, where he finally got a man's wage of 9 shillings. William spoke of his Mother's struggle to feed them all. Her main supply was Potatoes sold by local farmers for 3d a peck. When times were good she would buy a piece of the fattest Pork available, which cost a shilling. She would melt it down and make dripping to pour over the potatoes, making what the children thought was a very good dish.

One can imagine she did not pause to consider vitamins or proteins but just hoped it would fill them up.

Bread at the time was 1 shilling a loaf and tea a luxury at 3d a twist. One spoonful used over and over for several brews. The children were lucky if there was any pudding but at that time in the 1840's Rice could be obtained for about 1 penny per ½ pound. It would be boiled until very soft and flour would be mixed in until quite solid and with a little sugar added was the mark of a good time but not to be indulged in lightly. (like my Mum's steamed Suet Plum Duff with custard.. ooooh..)

Another side of those days was the law. Ten shillings or seven days hard labour after a flogging with a whip type instrument with several wires attached to a heavy wooden handle.. William remembered some people who received 30 or 40 lashes for crimes that today would merely be fines. The local prison stood where the day centre is today in Bridge Street. William recalls as a child playing on the land in Hedingham Road before they built the Workhouse there. Gosfield people would be sent also . It was later demolished and where The Courtauld Homes of Rest now stand. In the winter the outside workers on the land were unpaid and the workhouse was the only place for them. He said that inmates were just herded in there with little to do and roughly fed.

The 1880's brought more stability to William. He became Coachman and Gardener for Charles Portway.

Our Church had a stove in it made at the Portway foundry I knew his Grandson Major Michael Portway, TD.until his death. He was the President of The Halstead and District History Society for many years and a lovely man. With a connection to Gosfield at one time in his ancestry.

William Drury remained working for Charles Portway for 32 years until his employer's death in 1912. He had many memories of driving that devoted Local Politician around as he carried on with his activities and many business duties. Also, he remembered a time when landowners decided to cut labourers wages. So many men in the streets without work, cast out from rural employment so they were shipped to Canada and other Colonies to work. At our Museum in the Queen's Hall we occasionally get people from across the world visiting to do their family History. I escorted a couple to Gosfield one time. Not Drury's Jeggo's. Luckily the Museum rang me to help them.

Lastly William Drury mentioned remembering a Dr Taylor who had a large garden and orchard opposite Trinity Church. He commenced a distillery of the Lavender blooms that he owned (acres of them). In the due season it was a job for the local women to gather the crop so that he could make oil from it and Lavender water. I think that might be the Dr Taylor I have a picture of. Who came so often to Gosfield Hall to tend to Mrs Ruth Lowe that she married him but never took his name.

I'm giving the magazine editor a school photo to print and hoping the gaps in my memory can be answered. I'm sure Justine and a few others can help.



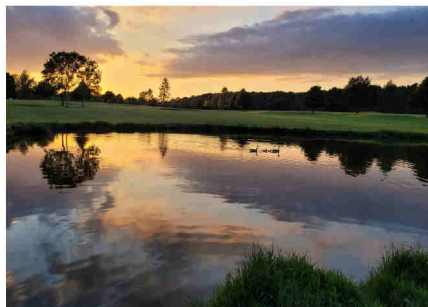
THE LAKES COURSE
