CHAIRMAN'S NOTES:

Remembrance Sunday was very well attended and helped by the beautiful sunshine. Well done to those involved in the arrangements for the day which went off perfectly.

Our skate ramp is now open, having been completed very efficiently by our contractors. The total cost amounted to £55,000, plus VAT, all of these moneys were provided by the developers of The Lindens, Sport England and the Rowson Perpetual Trust. Hence, there was no cost to the parish.

The Parish Council's main priority going forward is to carry out improvements to the playing field car park. The Parish Council were fully supportive of previous proposals regarding this but unfortunately the funding required for that project could not be achieved. The Parish Council have therefore decided to undertake a lower cost project, and have appointed a working party to produce a revised specification which can hopefully be fully funded.

The Parish Council have recently appointed Councillors T Strudwick and R Edwards as a working party for the Gosfield Nature Reserve to work alongside Westover Woodlands, our warden/contractor. The GNR is a valuable asset which is owned by the Parish Council, and we are currently finalising a five-year plan and are seeking input from all parishioners as to how they would like to see the nature reserve used in the future. All input would be greatly appreciated. Please email the Parish Clerk with your thoughts.

The Parish Council are currently two members short and are actively recruiting persons who are interested in and want to help manage and guide Gosfield. If you are interested, please contact myself or, alternatively, come along to the next Parish Council meeting which is scheduled for Monday, 15th December in the Pavilion at 7.15pm.

PARISH PONDERINGS - FROM ST. CATHERINE'S CHURCH

Hello everyone,

By the time this has been published I will have been licensed and in the midst of the wonder that is Christmas in the Church of England and in that part of it called The Three Saints Parishes.

To be honest with you I have been raring to go and the waiting has been frustrating. Although we moved my Dad's, Roy, home and ours into one property you really can only unpack so many boxes before you start to feel more than a little strange.

I am told that I am a patient person, I did work as a Deputy Headteacher in a secondary school so maybe I am more patient than I think but during this time of waiting to be with you, I was suddenly struck by the impact of Advent waiting.

Advent is not meant to be a massive countdown to Christmas day, although it so often feels like it; or waiting for the 'Strictly Come Dancing' Christmas special; or waiting for the peace and quiet of normal life to resume. Advent is a waiting that is expectant, not passive. The kind of waiting that has you on the edge of your seat rather than slumped back and half asleep. We wait in the darkness for the Light to return, personally I find the fact that God left us the Holy Spirit while we wait for Jesus to return quite breath taking.

There is plenty of waiting in the Bible. Israel waits for the Messiah - Imagine that wait, knowing only what the Old Testament had taught about him and you have to spot him. Moses waited in the wilderness. Simeon and Anna waited in the temple and Mary waited for her child, our saviour, to grow inside her and all of us waiting on Christ's return.

Waiting is not always a bad thing but in a society that has become so driven by instant gratification - with Amazon packages sometimes arriving on the same day they were ordered, films only just out of the cinema on demand on our televisions and food delivery apps whipping a beefburger round to our homes before the idea of it has really left our heads - not that I am complaining about any of this but waiting in faith, like we do at Advent, is a good thing.

The wait of Advent creates a space in us for God to work. The wait of Advent exposes our hunger for control and forces us to give that back to God. The wait of Advent makes God's gift to us even more meaningful when it does arrive.

I hope your Advent wait was God filled and that your Christmas is or was (depending on publication dates) Merry and Bright.

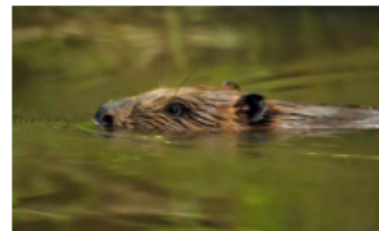

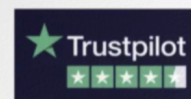

MEMORIES and such like from LINDA. (Marlow, Richardson) KEMP

I have recently been given an incomplete memoir that was amongst my late Aunts papers, it was penned by one of her friends a brother of Kenneth Sewell one of the WW2 soldiers remembered on our War memorial. Ironically it was during the Remembrance period of November that I came to read it. His is a name on the Gosfield War Memorial that once caused interest as he was not a Gosfield person. He was a Londoner

The following explains how he came to be called up from Gosfield.....the partial memoir was written by Kenneth Sewell's younger brother Len 'in his later life' which of course Kenneth never had.

Their Father still working on the North Woolwich docks during the bombing arranged for the family to be relocated to a small Thatched cottage in Braintree Road , Gosfield. He noted the AA book told him the population was 200 or so, less than half the number in the street where their lives had been spent to date. The cottage had 4 rooms, an outside sink, a water pump and convenience/ wash house. It was on the edge of a track leading to Hopes farm.

//Off the six of us went travelling to the local station then Bus to the village. We had packed some of our bits and pieces and stood looking at 4 rooms. One with a cooking stove. One with a fireplace and 2 bedrooms. Mum said "females in one and you males in the other". There was a table and 4 metal slatted chairs. Although it hadn't been occupied for some time it had been kept clean by Mrs Bacon across the main road. The Garden was stocked with vegetables and cared for by Mr Bacon.

Father would travel down with more furniture, pots and pans. Some of which luckily was moved before the house took a big hit. The Hall we had been sheltering in had taken a direct hit after we left. Many deaths we were told. Mother and sister Lil soon got things sorted in the cottage. Dad met a man in the Kings Head who delivered to the Docks so Father arranged with him to collect some more of our stuff.(just in time). Our 2 brothers were in the forces already and Ken would be next, then 'me' and youngest brother Fred but surely War would be done with before they needed us. Fred and Winnie attended the local school, I was a few weeks away from working age of 14 so just cut the firewood etc(Dad would come with me at weekends and fill an old pram with any wood we could find) Then I got a part time delivery boy job temporarily with Halstead shop ' GREENS' but by then I was old enough to go with Ken to start work full time in Sible Hedingham at a wood working place called RIPPERS opposite a Cinema called The Plaza.

Mother started work part time at Gosfield Hall after a while. She noticed an empty Lodge House by the Hall road entrance adjacent to the School. This would be convenient for Win and Fred going to school next door etc. She made enquiries and within a couple of weeks we were moving in. My married sister husband and daughter took over the little cottage. My sister Lil started working at Crittalls Factory in Braintree welding panels for BAILEY BRIDGES. Hard work.

On the day, Ken and me started at Rippers we couldn't get inside the gates as some men were striking outside. They were asking for the wage of 4 pence an hour to be increased by a penny. The bosses later agreed and so in we went... we had a wage increase before having started! We were to become Sawyers mates, and there was a canteen of sorts in 2 old WW1 Nissen Huts. These were bombed one day and so proper Brick ones were built and it became a good canteen and later in 1943 when the Americans were local it became a NAAFI. Ken had yet to be called up but it was good in Gosfield playing Snooker in the 'Coffee Room / Reading Room' opposite the Kings Head and having a game of darts. Ken left Rippers after an accident that cut the top of his finger off but soon started working for The Feltham Sand and Gravel Company (there were several gravel and sandpits in the area.) Twice a week Ken had to go back into London with Reports and other documents for them. Meanwhile me and Fred made friends with village boy Johnnie Brooks. Then the war caught up with us...the Americans arrived to build an Airfield just behind us and the Foe soon found out and attacked. \ To be continued in the next issue.

Meanwhile Thanks to Roger Smith for correcting my error on the group photo Keith Nokes not Richard Noakes. Roger thinks the girl I couldn't name is Mary Tarbin. I was good friends with Mary she was my age group but that girl seems younger, I'm sure someone would know. Also, the young boy hasn't been named as yet. Could it be James Lee or Keith Hunt?

As this magazine goes to print the joint Funeral of two Gosfield friends will be taking place. Malcolm Osborne and his wife Jo (Johan) have sadly passed away and within a couple of weeks of each other. I sat with Jo remembering our good times over the years. Selfishly willing her to pull through but sensing she would go to her husband of over 6 decades, the pairing of souls embarking on their new journey together. I like to think so.

T'is the season to try to keep warm and well. It will be 2026 before you get rid of the Christmas Tree needles but the Iced Fruit Cake might last much longer, but not if you let me near it. It's my favourite. All Good Christmas and New Year Wishes to you all.

Hedge and Tree Pruning – Cutting:

Most trees and hedges by roads are on privately owned land.

Landowners are reminded that trees, hedges, ditches and other vegetation close to the highway needs to be maintained with summer drawing to a close.

Overgrown vegetation can prevent roads and paths from being safe when wetter weather, and shorter days draw near, blocking paths and restricting clear view of the highway.

Grass cut in wet conditions can also lead to clumps being deposited by lawnmowers onto highways. Therefore, grass cutting is ideally carried out when the weather is drier.

Landowners are responsible for maintaining foliage on their land, even if it is close to a road or pavement. They have a duty of care to take reasonable steps to prevent risk.

Overgrown vegetation can restrict paths, reduce sight, and cause floods when ditches and drains become clogged.

Now bird nesting season is over, landowners should carry out work such as:

- removing overhanging branches that obscure the view of the road
- removing overhanging branches that lower the road's clearance for tall vehicles, such as double-decker school buses
- trimming or removing trees that are in danger of falling onto the pavement or road
- removing overgrown shrubs that block lighting or traffic signs
- clear trenches on private property to prevent flooding when it rains

Residents with hedges abutting the pavements: please ensure that hedges, etc, do not encroach onto the pavements/roads to help ensure clear visibility on our roads and footpaths for pedestrians and road users alike.

Village Life

As with the proverb "it takes a village to raise a child" here in Gosfield we are lucky to have that luxury. [are we lucky or do we create our own luck]

I recently was told a story of two little girls who loved to go to the Nature Reserve to have breakfast with the fairies, what a lovely magical childhood for these young people. Now they can also enjoy the new skate ramp and the open space land top of Meadway which will shortly be officially handed over to the village. The Parish Council has facilitated all the above.

Being a parish councillor comes with its own challenges but also rewards. I cannot relate the feeling of elation that comes from being able, in any small way, to bring about changes that better the lives of Gosfield residents. And the feeling that I am helping to be seen working with people instead of doing things to them.


