# **CHAIRMAN'S NOTES**

There will be no Annual Parish Meeting this year. We don't have to have one because of the lockdown and it would have to be a video conference which not all can manage.

#### **New Community Shop:**

This is a progress report on the proposed new Community Shop. The committee of the Community Benefit Society which runs the shop felt that the proposed design for the extension was not big enough so the Parish Council has submitted a variation to the original design which increases the length of the extension by 1 metre. Hopefully, BDC planners will grant this.

Meanwhile, fund raising is largely on HOLD because of the National lockdown, but applications for grants are in progress.

#### Children's Play Area:

The high rainfall in February forced us to close the area for a while because it was turning into a mud bath and ruining the grass. Apologies to all those who were affected. It is now open again and the muddy areas have been re-seeded. Meanwhile a new fence has been erected along the back of the area to stop children getting into the farmer's field next door.

#### Vandalism in the Nature Reserve:

In March we had an incidence of vandalism in the Nature Reserve when a waste bin and a life belt were thrown into one of the ponds. Also a memorial bench which was broken from its fittings and two of the leg supports broken. Stephen Westover, the Nature Reserve Warden has recovered them and will repair the bench and re-fix it. Thanks to all who reported these incidents. The quicker the response, the quicker we can report it. It may have been connected with some vandalism which took place in Russell's Road on the same day. I reported the incident to the police, not with any hope that they would find the culprits, but because their computer might throw up a pattern of vandalism. In fact the response of the police was to visit me to reassure the public that they were taking notice and would patrol the area sporadically.

# **REV. ROSE'S RAMBLINGS**

Hello, Gosfield!

So, are we just going back to same-old, same-old once this wretched virus is pretty much under control? Well, clearly not if it's cost the life of someone we love, or we've lost a job, or are bearing long-Covid, for example. We are forced to make changes, changes we may hate, and it's important that the lucky ones among us don't assume everyone is as happy as spring rabbits – we must continue that caring and sharing spirit which the worst brought out among us, thank God.

But do we want to go back to same-old, same-old anyway? Was it that great? I seem to recall we moaned (a lot!) about all sorts of things, so now's perhaps the time to change from the rampant consumerism and me-first-ism ("because I'm worth it", she said, fluttering her eyelashes) to something softer, more caring, more sustainable, more emotionally enduring and fulfilling. If not now, when? We've been rudely reminded of the limitations of human planning in the face of natural disasters, so planning to change our lives "in twenty years" or "when I retire", or something like that, may not be within our command. St Augustine, who was born in 354 and died in 430, is reported to have prayed "Lord, make me chaste – but not yet!" I wonder when that was – for most of us, a prayer for radical change of attitudes and life might have been sort of towards 430.

Among the changes at St Catherine's will be decisions about how many "in real life" services should be held, and when, and how many online: online we can sing (a lot!), in real life, we can't at the moment. How can we link our online worshippers with those who can come to St Catherine's? How can we encourage those who are housebound but not zoom-savvy or who hate tech, to join online worship? The list of services and events in our parish and Area over Easter will (I hope) be in this issue of Grapevine, but this is a longer-term question. Online isn't going to go away, with an ageing population and youngsters who live on their screens, is it? Does that mean you don't need to bother to go to St Catherine's and can stay at home in your pjs with a cup of coffee? Or is that not OK?

Like most businesses, we also face a financial black hole: how long can we continue to pay the running expenses of St Catherine's with the current rate of giving? (People don't realise that the costs fall entirely on us – each parish is a separate charity and we cannot call on any central body or a magic money tree!) A moment's thought shows that the whole cost of keeping beautiful but ancient St Catherine's as a living church to serve, to celebrate, and to mourn with the community, cannot be borne by the 30-odd people who worship on any particular Sunday, can it? What would happen if (heaven forefend, but it depends on our community) the PCC can no longer pay the basic costs of ministry and insurance? We have made one decision: we've introduced online giving to supplement the standing orders / direct debits and cheques and envelopes and cash in the plate – thank you for asking, it's either:

# ANNUAL REPORT to PARISHES in the GOSFIELD & GREENSTEAD GREEN WARD by DISTRICT COUNCILLOR PETER SCHWIER

It has been around one year ago that we last met face to face, and it has been a year like no other in the memories of most members and residents reading this.

Some of us have learned new IT skills to allow to continue the best we can. Some of us have even learned how to mute and unmute our Zoom meetings.

Over the last year over 10,400 residents in the Braintree District contracted Covid-19 and regrettably over 360 related deaths were registered. I am sure I speak for all of us in expressing our condolences to the family and friends of those who have died or been seriously ill.

The District Council itself has faced many unique challenges.

Facilities for staff to work from home have had to be provided, arrangements for Council businesses to continue together with those of Parish Councils and voluntary bodies, have had to be put into place to hold formal decision making remotely. This has highlighted very clearly some of the deficiencies in internet connectivity in parts of our district.

The Covid expenditure to the Council has cost in excess of £3.55m with some £2.24m from loss of income. This includes other less obvious expenditure such as the need to financially support our leisure provider which operates on a not for profit basis and have had no income to maintain the swimming pools and other leisure facilities in a safe and sustainable manner in order to prevent them from closing down.

Officers and Members have aimed to keep Parish Councils and local businesses informed about the incidence and spread of the disease and what financial support is available for those financially affected. The Council has invited, administered, and distributed government grants to around 7,200 local businesses with a total expenditure currently awarded at £39,838,458.00.

Council staff have had to learn new skills to carry out work in addition to their usual duties.

- EHOs have been seconded to operate the finer details of the test and trace initiative.
- Economic Development and Revenue & Benefits Teams have been responsible for distributing government grants to individuals and businesses affected by the pandemic.
- Council Officers and Members have aimed to keep parishes informed about the very latest developments in the incidence of Covid, and the vaccination rollout and details of any financial aid that might be available to those affected financially due the lockdown.



Despite these considerable financial and staffing pressures, the Council has continued to develop its environmentally friendly initiatives. We have established and earmarked reserves of £500,000 to take forward our 'green' priorities. We have maintained the popular Councillor Community Grant scheme for 2021/22. New expenditure also includes a new artificial grass pitch at the Halstead leisure centre at a cost £750,000, and £100,000 for children's play areas. We aim to support the future of the District by creating new jobs and making financial investments. Work on the creation of a three storey £14m Enterprise Centre on the new Horizon 120 Business Park and Innovation Park at Great Notley has started. This will provide a state- of- the- art energy efficient complex with shared meeting rooms, flexible workspaces, conference and training facilities and offices for smaller businesses to grow into. The Business Park also boasts the first all solar-powered electric vehicle-charging centre in the UK, to supplement the 16 new dual electric vehicle charging points being installed across the District.





Additional funding has also been made available to improve the Town Centres of our three major towns.

The Planning Inspectorate finally approved part 1 of the Local Plan, and at the same time confirmed that the number of houses we have to provide for in the Plan period 2013-2033 is 14,320, or 716 per year. Disappointingly, Part 2 of the Plan is not due to be examined by the Inspectorate until July 2021.

The financial commitments and our ambitions towards maintaining service standards have been set against a background of prudent financial management. We are not intending to increase carparking charges to help support our town centres as life gradually returns to normal, and unlike many other local authorities across the country, we did not increase our share of the Council Tax for 2021/22.

I have been immensely proud of the numerous voluntary organisations across our Parishes who have supported the vulnerable by delivering medicines, food, and other basics during the lockdowns.

The Covid epidemic has affected people in a variety of different ways and as we come out of the lockdown, there will be lasting problems of social isolation, loneliness, emotional instability, and health. The Council supported by our communities will continue to do whatever we can to help ease these problems.

# Census 2021

A census has taken place in England every ten years since 1801 (with the exception of 1941 – a register of people in the country was taken). A census gathers information about our society so that appropriate services can be put in place for everyone to enjoy now and in the future. The census is run by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) which operates completely independently of government and of any private sector interests.

Fans of TV programmes such as "Who Do You Think You Are" will know the value of historic census data to family historians and genealogists, but data from the census impacts our lives every day, often without us even realising it.

Did you know that water companies use census data to anticipate peak water demand ? Or that the NHS uses census data to plan a wide range of services such as hospitals and GP surgeries, mobile chiropodists and home support ? Everything from schools to care home places are planned using census data to make sure that the needs of all age groups are met.

Many aspects of our lives are impacted by the census, so it is vital that everyone participates to ensure the best possible understanding of the structure and needs of our society. By taking part, you can make sure that your community is represented and gets its share of public and other funding to ensure the provision of services now and in the future.

The next census official census date was Sunday 21st March, 2021. It will be the first time that everyone will be able to complete the census online. You should have received a letter with your unique access code in order that you could complete the census. Guidance was available in a range of languages and accessible formats, and the paper option will still be available if needed.

All information submitted for the census is stored securely and anonymised. No personal data is ever sold, nor is it shared with any other government department. However, information from the census is released after 100 years when your descendants may be tracing their own family history!

Every week, for over 100 years, Scouts give almost half a million people aged 6-25 the opportunity to learn the skills they need in life. #### 3) How often do you meet ?:

Each section meets weekly on a Wednesday providing a wide range of exciting and interesting activities. The meetings take place both inside and outdoors (subject to current restrictions) giving our young people a variety of life experiences. Events and camps are run throughout the year to consolidate skills developed during weekly meetings.

#### 4) How will my child benefit from Scouting ?:

Parents tell us their children benefit hugely from the adventures, fun and friendships they experience. It can help develop your child's social skills and independence, and give them access to some amazing and memorable opportunities.



#### 5) What activities can I expect to do ?:

Try over 200 activities: from archery to acting, being a Scout gives you the chance to get stuck into loads of activities you wouldn't normally get to do.



**Make new friends:** at your Cub or Scout meetings you will have a chance to meet up with your mates, have a laugh and do lots of exciting activities. You'll meet adventurous people just like you who want to do something a little different.

**Have fun:** Chief Scout Bear Grylls says life is about grabbing opportunities. We agree ! Above everything else, Scouting is all about enjoying yourself, whatever you're doing – and there'll always be plenty to do!

# **COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT:**

The Pump House Surgery, Earls Colne was designated the Covid-19 Vaccination Centre for the north of the Braintree District. The programme is being led by Essex NHS and is being supported by 400 volunteers from the Earls Colne area. I have been delighted to meet and thank many of the volunteers supporting this service. Essex County Council is working with Essex NHS Services to make the case for another Centre in the north of our district as the Vaccination Programme is rolled out.

In March, I attended, via Zoom, the Essex County Council Budget meeting and voted in support of the Budget 2021/22. I believe that the Budget was a 'steady as you go' budget to meet the challenges of the current Pandemic climate. We agreed a Council Tax freeze and a 1.5% Adult Social Care increase to support the most vulnerable residents in Essex. An extra £2.5M went to flood prevention, £1M on the environment (specifically to reduce waste), £500,000.00 for summer clubs, £2M for post-Covid business support, £1M for children's mental health, £1.5M for education and £0.5M to support key workers to grow community resilience.


The Braintree Local Highways Panel received an extra £0.4M for the next three years (year on year). This will make a tremendous difference to delivering many of the local highway improvement projects and is something that I have lobbied for, over the past 4 years. I have put forward the following Gosfield Highways Improvement Schemes: A new salt bin at The Limes (at the junction with The Street). A '20 is Plenty' speed calming scheme at Gosfield Primary School. A new hard standing for the Halstead Road bus-shelter. 3 new wooden bus-shelters at the area of Gosfield School (Cut Hedge). I have also put forward schemes for speed-calming in Hedingham Road and Braintree Road, the schemes will be subject to a highways traffic survey in both locations from this April. On general highway maintenance and improvements I have processed all of the village potholes for repair (most of which have been filled – if fitting the 50mm Essex pothole criteria). I am currently working with Essex County Highways to make sure that the road surface water-drains are jetted and repaired, following a wet winter. I have also received confirmation that the Hedingham Road footpath will be cleared from vegetation following agreement with traffic management.

Planning number: 17/01066/OUT – 20/00653/REM - 35 homes at Hedingham Road. I have written an objection to Braintree District Council on highway grounds. I believe that an alternative plan should be found to stop any construction traffic from using Meadway as an exit from the development site. I am concerned about the disruption and potential danger any construction lorry could cause to local residents, schoolchildren and frequent users of Hall Drive.

The Coronavirus restrictions are set to ease. Soon you can meet six or two households outdoors. Although we still need to keep safe and take precautions, we know how long-awaited these moments are.

Gosfield Parish Council has formally applied for the designation of Gosfield Parish to become a Neighbourhood Designated Area which now means that you can see all of our statutory progress on the Braintree District Council website. It also means that we can draw on funding from BDC to engage with expert consultants and help raise awareness & encourage even more engagement with the community.

Check out the map (courtesy of Braintree District Council) on pages 20 and 21 – the thick dark line indicates the Parish Boundary and what has been designated as the Neighbourhood Area for our plan. The slightly thinner black line that encompasses the more residential area in the village represents the 'Village Envelope' which is particularly significant when considering development.

Don't worry – everyone will be able to tell us what you think about planning matters, development of the village and how we can continue making the village 'great'.
