CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

The future of the Community Shop.

Many of you will be wondering what is happening about the Community Shop. Well, the situation is that all the planning permissions, building regulations and internal design of the shop have been secured. The next step is to go out to tender and then we will know what the final cost is going to be. This is likely to be well above the amount we have already secured.

It has been a very difficult period for fund raising because it has been impossible to arrange events. At the same time, there has been an enormous demand for grants nationally. So the plan is to officially launch the "Community Benefit Society" to run the shop. Brief details of the CBS are included in the flyer within this magazine and it is hoped that as many people as possible get involved as members.

Key points which I want to emphasise are:

- Membership is a minimum of £10. There is no maximum. Hopefully we will receive a lot more to help build the extension.
- Regardless of the amount invested, each membership will only carry one vote
- Investments can be withdrawn after three years
- The shop is profitable and very popular there is every reason to suppose it will remain so

The money raised through your investments will be used to secure match funding from grant giving organisations.


We need to get the new shop built this year. The present shop building has an enforcement order for closure on it due to come into force in October. With your support, we can have the new extension to the pavilion built by then. Gosfield has a reputation for getting things done and for its community involvement. Let's hope we can live up to our reputation.

REV. ROSE'S RAMBLINGS

Hello, Gosfield!

We're in that "betwixt and between" time as I write: between Covid restrictions and their lifting: between clear rules (OK – not everyone likes/understands/keeps 'em, but rules...) and relying on "everybody's good sense" (er...); between ogling the seed catalogues and actually having to get out and garden; between watching tennis from Oz and pulling out the whites from wherever they were flung last autumn...you get the drift.

So today I want to think about constancy. There are always some people who obey the rules (20/30/60/70 mph anyone?). There are always some out in the garden or allotment in all weathers; always some out doing winter tennis, or wild swimming, or mud-rugby... and they are an example to us all, aren't they? We don't always admire them, indeed we sometimes think they slow us down/must be crazy, but we have to acknowledge their spirit of determination and willingness to put up with what we often wouldn't tolerate.

And one of the most constant people imaginable? Has to be our Queen, as she commemorates 70 years since the death of her beloved father, and so her own accession to the throne on 6 February 1952.

That's so long ago that 80% of our people now were not even born: and everyone who was around then is now officially old. I remember the announcement on the radio (I was making a racket because I'd fallen off a chair and got told off because my mother couldn't hear the radio clearly) but then I am *very* old!

Imagine how many presidents we might have had in the meanwhile (and imagine who they might have been! Aaaarrrgghhhh! 14 British Prime Ministers and counting).

Princess Elizabeth had made her 21st birthday public promise of her lifetime's service to the people only 4 years before: It cannot have occurred to her that she would be called upon to make that promise good so quickly. Her father was then only 51, and she must have expected another 25 years of her own life before she would have to surrender it wholly to the Crown. Think of how your life has changed over the last 10/20/30/40/50/60/70 years – would any of us have had the tenacity and constancy to stand up to those pressures faced by the monarch? OK, the jewels and houses are great, the family is, well, like most families, and money's a worry at a different level I guess! – but to live that public life, bound by duty and tradition, knowing so much yet being able to say and do so little about it, must be a constant burden. Imagine the tedium of all those thousands upon thousands of receptions and visits (so exciting for those received and visited, but surely so repetitive for her!) And imagine sticking to your word, and faithfully clocking up those duties even after 70 years.

So although the grand celebrations will take place, God willing, in June this year, let's take a moment this February to thank God for the stability, wisdom and fortitude of our Head of State, the Queen, the Supreme Governor of my church and your church, the Church of England.

God save the Queen!

Communities 1st Help International NHS Nurses to Feel at Home

Communities 1st is helping local NHS Trusts to retain their international nurses, to help fill the UK's shortage. In order to settle down in a new place, these professionals will have to deal with new customs and unfamiliar places that could persuade them to return to their own countries.

It is recognised that with appropriate ongoing support, the positive experience and rate of retention of these health professionals could be significantly higher.

Communities 1st has launched the "International Nurses buddy" project, to help international nurses feel more at home in our communities. The nurses will be offered both one-to-one outings with a Care Giver Companion as well as the option to join the monthly programme of evening and weekend group outings. Here, the recruits can meet each other in an informal setting, make friends and build support networks.

Nurses will receive help and support not only on the social level but also in their day-to-day lives. They will be introduced to places of interest, for example parks, bus stations, landmarks etc. They will be shown how to travel both locally and outside Hertfordshire, and helped in learning local customs and local history. Communities 1st will also be setting up English classes, and offering help with finding accommodation.

Since the December issue I have deviated somewhat from what this issue on My Memories would contain, my reason is referring to the school photo shown on page 12 in the previous issue.

I grew up knowing many of those pupils and as the magazine was issued for December another had just passed away. Dorothy Beadle (nee WEGG). 'DOT' to her school friends but always Dorothy to anyone else. Her sister married Jack Simper my Mum's school mate.

I'm going to go through that line up from my memories. I know those still living can maybe do a better job. Back row L to R we have Dorothy Jeggo, known always to me as Dobbie, a beautiful gentle soul, when as a young mother of 2 she was tragically killed in a road accident when a lorry hit the family car. So sad. Slightly behind Dobbie stands 'Dick' Everitt, a twin, his sister 'INA' stands in front of him (middle row) I was told growing up that Mrs Ruth Lowe, adopted daughter of Samuel and Ellen Courtauld at Gosfield Hall was overjoyed to hear of twins being born and insisted on them being Christened IAN and INA (a play on letters). He was always known as Dick. The Everitt's, like the Drury's and many other families during war time were gracious to the Various Forces stationed in the village, Sunday tea, etc. The USAF soldier the Everitt's hosted also played the Guitar and sang. Dick was a keen observer and had a good voice so the soldier taught him to play the guitar. On leaving Gosfield the Airman gave Dick the guitar. Many folk can recall Dick Everitt singing and playing guitar. Further along the back row of the school picture I recall the Turbin family and George Cook but next is Ken Wiseman who I knew well and his son Paul and family too. Father and son sadly died in the same year. Next is Bob Boyton, I recall Hubert, Bob's Dad telling me that he and his wife worked for rival village estates! Gosfield Place and Gosfield Hall, so it was quite a 'thing' when they wed.

Middle Row. 'INA' the 'twin' later Valerie Radbourne's Mum. Next is Dot 'Dorothy' Wegg. The Weggs' lived in one of the lodges at Cut Hedge. He grew amazing flowers. Next is Beryl Hall (nee Lock) and still with us so she can speak for herself and then Alma Pasfield (nee Brazier) also still with us. In spite of the restrictions that the COVID pandemic has placed on the playing of carpet bowls during most of 2021 the Gosfield Carpet Bowls Club continues to thrive.

In December 2021 the club held its Christmas lunch at the Gosfield Golf Club restaurant which had been beautifully decorated in celebration of Christmas. Some twenty members and partners enjoyed the traditional Christmas lunch which was followed by a short quiz.

The club had been looking forward to a re-start of normal playing activities at the start of 2022. Membership was increasing and two club nights per week had been resumed. The Essex CBA had cancelled both the Winter and Summer league fixtures for the forseable future but were hoping to hold individual championship events during the early summer period. These are still in the preparation stages at present but we are hopeful that they may come to fruition.

Providing that the clubs observe these restrictions we can continue to play, but it is up to individual members whether they wish to play under this restriction. Some members do feel uncomfortable playing whilst wearing the masks and prefer not to attend club nights until the regulations are eased again.

This has resulted in a slight reduction in membership at present, but we are fortunate to still have sufficient members to enable the club to continue to run the regular two club nights per week, Monday and Wednesday evenings.

Our club continues to develop and we look forward to the time when all restrictions are lifted and all members may return to playing carpet bowls again without any restrictions.
