Personal Injury	Parish Councillors Volunteers Members of the public Employees of the Parish Council	Grassland • Must be inspected regularly with any hazards identified & reported to the Parish Council • Where a hazard has been identified, with the use of signage & hazard tape, the hazard must be clearly marked to warn other playing field users • The Parish Council shall ensure that the hazard is removed or mitigated as soon as possible • Signage can be used to warn users of poor walking conditions – i.e. ice/heavy mud/ deep puddles. Trees • Must be inspected regularly ensuring there are no hazards. Any hazards identified must be reported to the Parish Council. • Where a hazard has been identified, with the use of signage & hazard tape, the hazard must be clearly marked to warn other playing field users.	In the event of serious mole activity, the Parish Council will seek guidance from a pest controller. The public shall be encouraged to report any diseased or damaged trees to the Parish Council.			

		Other hazards • The footpaths will be regularly inspected to ensure overgrown hedges, bushes & other vegetation are not causing a hazard. • If any chemical (or any harmful substance) treatment is being used on the playing field, signage must be erected to warn users of the playing field. Fixed Furniture (e.g. Benches, bins etc.) • All benches & equipment shall be inspected regularly to ensure that they are in good & safe condition & firmly fixed to the ground/wall. • Any hazards relating to benches or bins etc. must be reported to the Parish Council. • Where a hazard has been identified, with the use of signage & hazard tape, the hazard must be clearly marked to warn other users. • The Parish Council shall get any damage remedied as soon as possible. • Any damage to dog bins must be reported to the Parish Council	If cutting back is required, the parish council will ensure works are carried out to prevent the hazard. If necessary, signage will be erected to warn users of a hazard. If at all possible, the Parish Council should look to 'close' or 'cordon-off' the playing field whilst these treatments are being applied. The Parish Council will undertake a quarterly check on all benches & report & action any hazards The Parish Council will report any hazards with regard to dog bins to Braintree District Council.			
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		Posts/Fencing • Must be inspected regularly ensuring there are no hazards. Any hazards identified must be reported to the Parish Council. • Where a hazard has been identified, with the use of signage & hazard tape, the hazard must be clearly marked to warn other footpath users. • The Parish Council shall get any damage remedied as soon as possible. Dog Fouling • The Parish Council will help to educate the public through regular communications & signage Drug Use or Anti-social behaviour • Any reported hazards including the discovery of drug use paraphernalia to the Parish Council must be passed on to the relevant authorities. • Under no circumstances should a Parish Councillor, employee of the parish council or a member of the public be requested to remove any such hazard. • On the reporting of these hazards, signage & hazard tape	If not owned by the Parish Council, the Parish Council shall contact the landowner to report the damage.			
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		shall be used to warn other footpath users. Children's Play Equipment • Regular inspections carried out – annually by ROSPA, but also regularly by the Parish Council. • Any item of play equipment found defective should either be removed or cordoned off immediately & signage displayed informing that it is not in use. • Any hazard that is reported (e.g. potholes etc.) will be actioned appropriately. • Any age restrictions (e.g. with the Zip-wire) will be prominently displayed using signage • COVID – MITIGATION – signage must be displayed to require supervising adults to take responsibility for sanitising play equipment that children are using.	Any maintenance must be carried out by a competent person according to manufacturer's/ installers instructions. Repairs shall be carried out as soon as is reasonably possible by a competent person NOTE: The Parish Council will erect signage with advice on sanitising equipment, making hand washing facilities available (e.g. the public toilets) and social distancing, but the ultimate responsibility will remain with the parent/guardian.
