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Spread of Covid- 19 Coronavirus	Members of the public Employees Cleaners Volunteers Vulnerable Groups (elderly, those with existing underlying health conditions)	Frequently cleaning & disinfecting objects & surfaces that are touched regularly, particularly in areas of high use such as door handles, light switches, taps, doors using the appropriate cleaning products & methods All paper towels or cloths must be disposed of in the proper way When cleaning, employees/volunteers must wear gloves & a mask	Must ensure a plentiful supply of cleaning materials available for cleaning Rigorous checks will be carried out by the cleaner to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed Displaying a clearly visible cleaning schedule to give confidence to the general public Consider increase in waste receptacles & increase waste removal frequency Keep the facilities well ventilated by ensuring door open whilst unlocked Ensure an adequate supply of gloves & masks are available for cleaner/volunteers & ensure that the correct procedure for removing gloves safely is known
