

Church Letter - September 2017

The arrival of September marks for many of us the end of summer as children return to school and our summer holidays seem but a distant memory. Even those who are lucky enough to be able to take holidays outside of the school holiday periods may have taken them already or plan to get away soon, before thoughts turn to Harvest Festivals or, dare I say it in September, to Christmas.

But what is the point of a holiday? To get a sun-tan (no chance if you went away in England this year), to see new sights and try new activities, to relax away from the pressures of work and home or to indulge in eating and drinking without feeling guilty for a couple of weeks?

Holidays can be any of these but I believe they are also about relationships. They are a chance to spend time with friends and loved ones. In order for any relationship to work we need to invest our time and service to it. If we neglect to make and maintain that investment in a relationship, then all too often we find the other person (or people) has changed and we no longer recognise the bonds that once held us together. Our children grow up so quickly and change so fast. Holidays provide an opportunity to spend time enjoying their company (not easy with teenagers, I know) and re-establishing important family values of communication, love and trust - which help us to recharge our emotional batteries.

As we read the Gospel accounts of Jesus we see that he, too, takes time out to nurture and nourish his relationship with his Father. He leaves the crowds to be alone with God and pray. He takes time to renew the Father to Son relationship, to gain encouragement and comfort by spending time in prayer. For many Christians prayer can be a huge source of strength. It is like taking a short holiday out of the business of a day and spending time investing in our relationship with God. Prayer breaks, like holidays, are never a waste of time. In fact, both are essential to our emotional and spiritual well-being.

So, although our summer holidays may be over, we should make the conscious effort to set aside time to share with our families and, in prayer, to share with our Heavenly Father. By doing so, we equip ourselves to face fresh challenges, supported and refreshed by stronger relationships with those who love us.
