Church Letter - April 2017

As Easter approaches I am aware of how fortunate I am living in the Northern hemisphere.

Because of the changing seasons we have the opportunity to experience something of what Christmas and Easter mean. With the darkness of the winter nights we see the Christmas lights that go up in our towns and villages reminding us of the light of Christ that came down the first Christmas. Then, of course, as the spring flowers arise from out of the bare ground and our naked trees sprout new greenery and blossom forth we experience the resurrection promise of Easter and are given hope as once again the land prepares to produce fruit and seeds for harvesting and planting.

During the long winter months words from the hymn *Abide with Me* might seem appropriate, *Change and decay in all around I see*. In the dark times of our lives we are aware of the need of God who if we ask will abide with us. The line that follows our quotation goes, *O Thou who changest not, abide with me*. A reminder that in spite of all the changes that can happen in our life, particularly the difficult ones, faith in the constancy of God can make a difference. This constancy brought life out of death at the resurrection. What appeared to be the most disastrous thing that could happen and the greatest failure, the crucifixion of Jesus, became his glorification. His faith in his Father helped him to overcome his fears and he was able to face his public humiliation and crucifixion courageously, even forgiving those who caused it. From out of that situation arose our salvation and his resurrection giving us hope for the future.

Last month Caroline reflected on failure and there is another line of music that reflects that which came to mind as I thought of the first and that is *Up from the ashes, grow the roses of success!* The line comes from lyrics written by the Sherman Brothers for

Chitty Chitty Bang Bang and there is the recognition failure can be turned around.

Every bursted bubble has a glory!

Each abysmal failure makes a point!

Every glowing path that goes astray,

Shows you how to find a better way.

So every time you stumble never grumble.

Next time you'll bumble even less!

For up from the ashes, up from the ashes, grow the roses of success!

In many ways that too reflects resurrection. Jesus would appear to have failed when he is crucified on the cross and yet we know how he was glorified in it and of the resurrection which promises us new life and hope.



For the March meeting, Brian Beaumont, assisted by Pauline Beaumont, treated us to a music quiz,


