Church Letter - December 2017

I wonder what your most memorable Christmas gift was. Over the past 69 years I have received many and my most memorable are quite an eclectic mix. I remember from my childhood having a Christmas pillow case which

was filled with all sorts of items, particularly satsumas, nuts and chocolates. The satsumas and chocolates disappeared quite quickly if I remember but the nuts must have had to wait. Later we had our larger presents, one of which I remember was a large walky-talky doll, a favourite for many years. Later, when courting, I remember a delightful brooch given by Peter. So many wonderful memories but perhaps one that will surprise you was a gift I received on my return from the Midnight Communion one Christmas morning. Right by the door lock and clearly displayed by a light was a moth that I had not seen before: one for my collection of photographs and literally a God-given gift for a very special morning.

I have often found throughout my life that it is the unexpected and sometimes unwanted gift that has proved the best and most beneficial. One birthday I remember receiving a Pentax camera although my initial reaction was what do I want that for? Many of you who know me would be surprised at that as I am now a very keen photographer but at the time I really wasn't impressed - terribly ungrateful - and yet it was this that eventually led to a very fulfilling hobby which eventually incorporated my interest in moths and butterflies and taking photos of them.

Sometimes we may think we want one thing only to find that it is the unexpected, unwanted gift that is what is needed. And, of course, that in many ways is what Christmas is about. The people of Jesus' time wanted a kingly leader who would overthrow the Roman occupation. What they received was a baby born in a stable of poor parents. Of what possible use is a baby to people who want to be set free? Well the baby grew up and because he is the Son of God he showed us how to live, in amongst the homeless and refugee, reaching out to those with skin diseases, those considered unclean, healing the sick and restoring those who had died to their loved ones and even mixing with those who had got it wrong, forgiving and restoring them. He showed us how to live by refusing to be defeated by those who sought to destroy him, unwilling to do their will but doing his father God's will, even accepting a most horrible death from which he rose again. By so doing he has set everyone who wishes to follow him free from fear of death and the reassurance of an eternal relationship with his Father through him and he sends us the help of his Holy Spirit to guide and comfort us.

I think there is no better gift than coming to know Jesus Christ, the baby born that first Christmas Day, and my prayer is that some of you will find him for yourselves this Christmas or renew your acquaintance with him. There are several opportunities to come and learn more about him at the services that will be held over the Christmas period and even if I am not present because of the treatment that I am at present receiving you are all very much in my thoughts and prayers
