Human Library

Please see below the contents of an email that I have received recently, would you like to take a part in this event?

Dear friends,

As a collaboration with Essex Police, Essex Faith Covenant and Essex Mind and Spirit, we would like to hold a Human Library Event.

If you've not come across a human library before, the idea is that people serve as books, and attendees can choose a book to go to. The "book" will then tell their story and answer questions from the "readers". The hope is to have faith "books", as well as books with mental health stories - so we would need people confident to tell their own personal story of faith/living with mental health issues/both and to hopefully answer any questions on this, which may be quite personal.

The aim of the library, is to combat stigma, ignorance and discrimination so we'd want books specifically from these groups, but could also include LGBTQ+, people from ethnic minority backgrounds, and others.

I have booked St John Payne School in Chelmsford as a venue as it's nice and central, lots of parking and a big space to hold this event — and it's been offered for free. I have booked 4th July 16.00-19.00 (entry from 15.00 to set up) and the real perk of doing this in the school is that students will be able to attend straight after school finishes, so a great opportunity to get youth engagement, which I know we all want. We can have stalls from all 3 of us at the event, as well as Healthwatch, who are also hopefully attending, to promote what we do, in addition to the books.

As part of the Covenant or Essex Mind and Spirit, please let me know if you feel you could serve as a "book" at the human library – it would be great to have some really wide representation. And if you feel that you could do this, but on a different topic please do get in touch.

The report gives a snapshot of house price data at ward level as of February 2024. This information is designed to provide information on the current housing market pressures within the district. Information is taken from the web-based analytics company Hometrack (hometrack.co.uk) and is based on sales and valuation data.

Context, Property prices in Uttlesford are higher than figures for the Eastern region due to the district's proximity to London and Cambridge. For example, the average price of a property is £416,596 for the Eastern region compared to £561,261 for Uttlesford. For further details go to: -
