Remembrance

This year Remembrance Sunday falls on Sunday, November 12th. There will be services of remembrance in both St Mary's Church, Little Hallingbury, and St Giles' Church, Great Hallingbury. The services begin at 10.50am to include a 2 minute silence at 11am. Everyone is welcome. We start the service at the war memorial (opposite the school entrance) in Little Hallingbury and at the back of the church in Great Hallingbury.

The word *remember* is a familiar one used in everyday speech. We remember our lunch money at school, we remember to do our homework, we remember a birthday. Yet what we remember at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month is so much more. It is more than just a passing nod to those servicemen and women who have died in the line of duty. It is about honouring them, saying a proper thank you, being still and silent for 2 minutes out of our busy lives.

It is not a political statement, it is not a racist slur against other nations and it is nothing to do with British pride. It is, simply, an occasion to show gratitude to those who put others before themselves; who were prepared to run out of the misery of the trenches, armed with a gun they were not sure would work or that they even how to fire, and into certain death. And they did this because they believed in fighting against an enemy and saving all those whom they knew and loved, but equally those whom they did not know, back at home. Such acts of bravery and self-sacrifice are surely worth more than a quick *cheers mate* or passing nod of the head.

Jesus asked us to remember him at the Last Supper in the act of Communion. We break bread and share wine to remember that God sent his son to die for us so that all our sins might be forgiven.

Symbolism and ritual has developed around this special act but, for a Christian, it is the most important act of worship, to share in the bread and wine which is to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to remember and honour.

So this year please support the Royal British Legion and wear your poppy with pride; pride in people who were prepared, and still are prepared, to fight on your behalf and for the peace of this nation. Brave men and women who will sacrifice their own lives for the lives of others. Remember in that 2 minute silence. Remember and honour and give thanks.
