### COMMUNITY INITIATIVE FUNDING

Recently there has been an increase in available community initiative funds, and although Great Braxted Parish Council have come up with some potential ideas as listed below, it is felt that this should also be opened to our community to think about improvements that they would like to see in their community.

The typical funds range from £1000 - £10'000, so there would be a limit to how ambitious the ideas could be, but if you have some relevant ideas please feel free to email these to <a href="mailto:greatbraxtedpc@gmail.com">greatbraxtedpc@gmail.com</a>, the parish council would then consider all ideas, and potentially progress these to an application for funds.

Separate to these funds, the parish council have also looked into applications to the local highways panel, for additional traffic calming measures, such installation of white gates on the verges when entering Great Braxted from either direction, automated electronic speed displays and other traffic calming measures.

# **Example ideas already put forward for initiative funding:**

- Additional benches in the cricket field
- Local Senior keep fit classes
- All Weather surface for the outdoor gym equipment area
- A community shop, to be run from The Pavilion
- Improvements to the Pavilion car park (to include better surface, increased parking and height restriction barriers)
- Printing costs for The Braxted Bulletin
- Braxted in Bloom 2022

# **Braxteds Community Playground Project**

# August 2021 Update

# Playground Approval

After several years and months of planning, research and fundraising it is with enormous pleasure that we can announce that on 15th July and 28th July 2021, the Great Braxted Pavilion Management Committee and the Great Braxted Parish Council respectively, unanimously agreed to formally approve the preferred supplier and design proposal for the Braxteds Community Playground Project.

The preferred supplier and design proposal (originally Design B) is Playsafe Playgrounds Ltd (www.playsafeplaygrounds.co.uk)

This formal agreement allows the project team to start collecting all the funding pledges made so far (albeit we still need a further £9000 to deliver the total project) and liaise with Playsafe to ascertain a potential start date (which we will advise in future updates).

## Playground Final Design


Following feedback and comments shared by residents as part of the design preference exercise, the project team arranged a further site visit with Playsafe to (1) revise the location (2) review equipment requirements and (3) finalise colours of the eco-mulch all weather safety surfacing.

The final design is illustrated below (further imagery will be displayed in the Noticeboard and will be available via Facebook and/or email requests)



Following the site visit the following changes to the design proposal were made (1) relocate back to current equipment position & footprint, (2) double toddler swing instead of single, (3) removal of the recycled slide mound, (4) post & rail fencing with green safety mesh, (5) safety barriers between junior tower and junior swings and (6) 3-Seater bench inside playzone and x3 picnic tables outside play zone (x1 DDA).

You will see that the design concept and style remain the same, with linked paths between each piece of appartus and as much natural grass as possible.



# Moving Forward

Some of the key tasks to progress are:

- Agree a potential start date with Playsafe
- Ongoing fund-raising efforts and collecting pledges made.
- Ongoing ad-hoc research tasks including signage, recycle/general waste bin, hedge & tree trimming, new gates and more.
