# **Maldon District Councillor News**

After the very successful events on the Promenade park, the plan is to hold more events throughout the year. I will keep the ward updated, about those events and where there are opportunities for local businesses to get involved.

As part of the district now being classified as level 1 of the government levelling up fund, we have applied for funding to develop the Hythe Quay and to construct a heritage centre. We will find out later in the year whether we have been successful.

# Remembrance Day Service Under threat!

Do residents support Wickham Bishop Parish Council's decision?

Our War Memorial was unveiled on 26 March 1921, having been given to the parish by Mr and Mrs Wilson of Heath House, Little Braxted, the parents of Charles Oscar Wilson who is commemorated on the memorial. Remembrance Day Services reflecting the great sacrifice made by residents of Great Braxted, Little Braxted and Wickham Bishops have been held around it ever since with many parishioners and members of the Scouting Community in attendance.

Prior to 2019, the annual service was organised by the Wickham Bishops Branch of the British Legion, which folded in 2019. In the absence of any other offers the service has been organised by Little Braxted Parish Council.

The sole costs of the event are related to the very essential road closure to ensure the safety of those attending the event; whilst safe to do so in 1921 it is no longer safe in 2022 to let attendees stand in a fast road at a busy junction. In 2021 these costs were £142 to Maldon District Council to administer the Road Closure Notice and £540 for contractors to physically close the road (unqualified persons are not permitted to close a public highway).

This cost has been always been split between the three Parishes on a prorata basis based on number of residents as on the 2011 census – 29p per head.

Wickham Bishops Parish Council is refusing to contribute its proportion in 2022 – apparently this sum (£535 for the whole Parish) is not acceptable. They have suggested holding a service away from the War Memorial which would not require a road closure. However, we believe this to be disrespectful, both to those who gave their lives (descendants and relatives of whom still live locally), and to those who gave the memorial.

We do not believe that, faced with this information, residents of Wickham Bishops would support their Parish Council's stance, which, if not overturned soon will mean that no Service is likely to be held this year as the two smaller Parishes cannot fund the event alone.

Wickham Bishops Parish Council had, at the end of the 2021/22 accounting year, over £16,000 in the bank – surely they can spare £535?



# THE MALDON DISTRICT COUNCIL (DOG CONTROL) PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER 2019

Maldon District Council (in this order called "the Council") hereby makes the following order under section 59 of the 2014 Act

The Order comes into force on the 18 July 2022 for a period of 3 years until 18 July 2025.

#### General provision:

A person who fails to comply with any obligation imposed by this order is guilty of a criminal
offence by virtue of section 67(1) of the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 and
liable to fine of summary conviction not exceeding level 3 of the standard scale.

#### Obligations on person with dogs:

#### 2. Fouling

If within the administrative area of the Council a dog defecates at any time on land to which the public or any section of the public has access, on payment or otherwise, as or right or by virtue of express of implied permission and a person who is in charge of the dog at the time fails to remove the faeces from the land forthwith, that person shall be guilty of an offence unless

- They have reasonable excuse for failing to do so; or
- the owner, occupier or other person or authority having control of the land has consented (generally or specifically) to his failing to do so.

#### 2. Dog on leads

- 2.1 A person in charge of a dog on any land to which the public are permitted access within the District of Maldon must put their dog on a lead when requested to do so by an authorised Officer unless:
  - they have reasonable excuse for failing to do so; or
  - the owner, occupier or other person or authority having control of the land has consented (generally or specifically) to his failing to do so.
- 2.2 A person in charge of dog must keep that dog on a lead at all times in Maldon, Heybridge & Burnham cemeteries in the areas edged blue on Maps 1,2 and 3 unless;
  - they have reasonable excuse for failing to do so.
- 2.3 A person in charge of a dog must keep that dog on a lead at all time in Promenade Park, Maldon around the lake and by the cafés and on the path to the statue of Brythnoth as delineated on

Map 4 in blue and marked areas A and B. This applies between the dates of 01 April – 30 September only unless;

- they have reasonable excuse for failing to do so.
- 2.4 A person in charge of a dog must keep that dog on a lead at all times in Burnham on Crouch Quay Front West, Quay Front East and Quay Front adjoining Riverside park as delineated on Map 5 in blue and marked areas B, C and D. This applies between the dates of 01 April 30 September only, unless;
  - they have reasonable excuse for failing to do so.

# 3. Dog Exclusion Areas

Areas where dogs are excluded at all times are:

- 3.1 All children's play site to which the public have access within the District of Maldon.
- 3.2 Enclosed sports pitches which are artificially surfaces or any enclosed bowling green within the District of Maldon
