In March, Year 6 had the opportunity for outdoor learning; there were a variety of activities that we all found enjoyable.



Update from Maldon District Council

UFest will take place on Friday 16 August. The festival received so much positive feedback last year, and the team behind UFest are planning an even bigger and better festival this year. Ufest provides the opportunity for you to find the support you might need in dealing with the cost of living, or family and personal support. It is also a great free fun day where all members of the family can have the chance to enjoy themselves and try new activities and interests.

The festival will feature an exciting day of activities, running from 11am to 4pm, with live music, stalls, and events for the whole community, focussing on health, wellbeing and fun. There will be music and bands, a fantastic selection of games, sports, and activities to get involved with throughout the day.

LEVELLING UP CULTURE PROJECTS FUNDING - Maldon District Council has been provisionally awarded up to £5 million of capital funding as part of the Spring Budget, to support local culture projects in the area. This provisional funding recognises the crucial role culture can play in levelling up and supporting pride in place. As the council gets more details, we will work with stakeholders on how the funding can be used. This is the largest ever fund given to MDC, and we hope that it will make a huge difference to the district.

The Secretary of State has given his approval for the King Charles III England Coast Path Stretch in Essex, connecting Wallasea Island to Burnham-on-Crouch. This is an important part of linking up our communities, with all three sections of the Saltmarsh Coast (Wallasea Island to Burnham-on-Crouch, Burnham-on-Crouch to Maldon and Maldon to Salcott) now regarded as open. They form part of the longest managed coastal path in the world, King Charles III England Coastal Path will provide opportunities for visitors and residents to explore our beautiful coastline.
