We started the Church New Year last week with the four weeks of ADVENT, (from Latin adventus, "coming"). In the Christian church calendar, it's the period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. In Western churches, Advent begins on the Sunday nearest to November 30. Thus, the season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the physical nativity in Bethlehem, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the eschatological Second Coming.



December News

I have raised the poor condition of Loamy Hill Road and Braxted Park Road, with the cabinet member at Essex County Council. These roads are in a very dangerous condition and at the national speed limit are not safe to navigate. A survey will be carried out on the roads, to assess the damage and then identify both short and long term solutions. I will keep residents updated

In the lead up to Christmas on Thursday afternoons, there will be free car parking in the town centre car parks. The car parking will be free from 2pm onwards, it is a great opportunity to support our local businesses.

At the district planning meeting, I voiced my concerns about the block of flats that were being located on Broad Street Green Road, as part of the next phase of development at the garden village. This application has now been deferred and I hope it will come back with revisions.

I also attended a meeting at Braxted park for the Country Food Trust. This is a charity which is feeding people in need. They donate to over 3.500 charities throughout the UK. If you would like to know more or would like to donate you can find details at www.thecountryfoodtrust.org
