Maldon District Council has been given the opportunity by Open Road to use the Colchester SOS and Community bus as part of a trial to provide a mobile Winter Wellbeing hub within the District.

On Thursday 12th December, our Climate Action Team, Energy Champion Coordinator, Health and Communities Team, and other partner agencies will be in Heybridge, and Maldon, providing a safe space for residents to access support during the winter months.

Residents will be able to access a range of services including health and wellbeing, and community support, as well as the opportunity to speak to our energy champions about energy saving advice, home energy grants, and other available support.

Councillor Richard Siddall, Leader of Maldon District Council, said: "I am delighted that the Council has been able to use this opportunity to provide a mobile Winter Wellbeing hub to our residents. This trial demonstrates our commitment to tackling the challenges our communities face during the winter season.

"This trial is a great way to promote health and wellbeing services within the District, as well as providing residents with access to vital energy saving advice and support."

Update from Maldon District Council

December 24

In the lead up to Christmas there will be free car parking in the town centre car parks, from 2pm on Thursdays in December, and all day on Christmas Eve.

Jade did apply for parking restrictions on the layby on Walden House Road, and unfortunately the Essex Parking Partnership refused the application. Jade and I are happy to apply again next year, however we need a gap of time before we apply again.

I have raised the dangerous condition of Braxted Park Road, with ECC, the cabinet member and our MP Priti Patel. The road has deteriorated dramatically over the past year and is back to the condition it was a few years ago. I am also working with Heybridge Councillors to get the speed reduced on Broad Street Green.

We have recently unveiled the new play equipment on the Promenade park and in other areas of the district. We are also investing in our skate parks.

The council is support Hertfordshire and Mid Essex Talking Therapies 'Talk for your Health: Emotional Support for Long Term Conditions (LTC)' mental health campaign. It is common to feel anxious, stressed, and low in mood when living with an LTC.
