#### Maldon District Councillor News

**January News** 

The district is one of only 3 councils in the country that has been selected to take part in a trial of food wrap and plastic kerb side collection. This will happen during 2023, unfortunately only part of the district will take part in the trial.

I am working with the tree trust to get sights assessed within Little Totham for new trees in commemoration of HM Queen. This will also help towards the climate challenge we all face.

The council has been applying for levelling up grants, and has been successful in the bid. News of how this money will be spent across the district will be announced later in the year. We have also applied for rural grants, which if successful, will benefit the community and small businesses in the area.

The Bellway application for Broad Street Green was approved, after the developer came back with revised for the apartment blocks. They are now 2 storey and in keeping with the surrounding properties.

The changes to the speed limit outside Great Totham Primary School, along with safety measures and the walkable footpath has been approved on School Road Little Totham. I hope that these will be implemented in 2023. I will keep residents about other applications, when they have been approved.

Sarah Mann Secretary Ken Hornett Chairman A special message from a member of our community: the family of Philip and his Mother Jean from Stoneylands, Kelvedon Road, Little Braxted. Their home was lost to fire on the afternoon of November the 5th. The response from the village was kindness and their family asked for this to be sent on so they could be thanked.

"Hi all. Sorry that this is late coming. As you can imagine, we've been chasing our tails over the last few weeks trying to get things as straight as we could and make sure that Mum (and Philip) are as comfortable as we could get them – as well as chivvy people along to get things done.

It's hard to believe that the fire at Stoneylands was only just over 5 weeks ago. And some very grateful thanks are due – overdue in fact – to some really great people:

To Mandy Chapman for "taking charge" and liaising with the firemen over traffic control and acting as a go-between from the firemen to Mum and Philip and myself. Since then, she's also acted as my go-between in terms of acquainting everyone about movements to and from the property – and there have been many of those over the past few weeks. She also made sure that the place looked "lived in" by putting bins out and parking her car on the drive at times to simulate occupation; whereas the only occupants have been the mould growing on the walls and the asbestos in the fabric of the building – and Bill and Lesley's cat who decided, for reasons known only to him, to take up temporary residence by sneaking in, ending up on the roof, from where he had to be rescued! I gather he's since tried to get in again and clearly has never heard of the phrase "Curiosity killed the cat"!

Thanks are also due to Marion Stephens, who I've kept updated as much as possible, since she's "Johnny-on-the-spot" – and for allowing me to use her drive on occasions (and the loo!) Marion also comforted Mum and lent her a blanket while the fire was still raging – and they (Mum and Philip) were parked on her drive – before they moved up to the Green Man car park. Marion was one of the first to call the fire brigade and she was the one who alerted Philip as to the smoke squeezing out from the roof tiles. She, in turn, had been alerted by Bill and Lesley Howard, who didn't have a direct number for Mum and Philip – a salient lesson in having complete lines of communication! Bill and Lesley also called the fire brigade anyway – there can never be too many phone calls at that sort of time. Philip called them too, I believe.

Anyway, the early warning enabled Philip to get Mum out of the house and into the car. Here, I must thank James Barke, as he spoke to them both as they were leaving and gave words of encouragement. He also took some very helpful photos and a short video, which he duly sent to me. These were provided to the loss adjuster to assist with his assessment of the case for the insurer.

Several other people offered and/or gave help later on; The family at Mulberry House, next to the Green Man, made dozens of cups of tea and coffee for the fireman, Mum and Philip—and I was even lucky enough to get one myself. Hayley at Longlands also offered food and drinks for the emergency services—and Connie Bateman from Garth End offered to house Mum and Philip until something more permanent could be arranged; and of course, at that time, none of us appreciated the extent of the devastation.

And there were many more people who came out to offer help; trouble was that Mum's mobility issues meant that she really needed accessible accommodation- which we found for a few days at the Travelodge in Maldon; however, they moved from there to the Premier Inn in Colchester for about three weeks – and now they're in an adapted rented bungalow in Tiptree for the duration of the repairs to their home – at 37 Station Road, Tiptree CO5 OBB. There's no landline phone there at the moment – that should be installed on Wednesday, together with broadband internet, using the same phone number as before. 891799.

In terms of the property – it's a wreck. The insurers have accepted the liability and have paid for all Mum's accommodation in the two hotels and will pay ongoing for the bungalow. Everything in the loft was incinerated – as could be seen from afar – and the roof almost completely destroyed. Tiles collapsed inwards and, combined with the water used by the fire-crew, and the loft insulation which comprised vermiculite, brought down most of the ceilings into the upper floor bedrooms. All that formed a mush of debris that has been difficult to negotiate. However, all the paperwork was retrieved from the first floor with the help of the firemen – photos, financial stuff, etc etc etc – and that now resides in my living room at home.

Ceilings have also come down into the kitchen, dining room and lounge and tiles have fallen off the walls in the kitchen. Most of the hardwood furniture is safe, but all their clothes, carpets, curtains, and fabric covered-furniture (sofa, armchairs, cushions) are all a write off because the whole place is riddled with asbestos and that has to be cleared before anything else is undertaken.

So, the whole house has been cocooned in scaffolding, water-proof material and corrugated iron while that work takes place. It's all likely to take upwards of a year to complete – but hopefully, a lordly butterfly will emerge in due course from the cocoon and Mum and Philip will come back to a new house; inside, at any rate.

So, very many thanks to everyone for their help, their offers of help and their interest. It's all been very heart-warming to see how much people care. And I know that Mum and Philip are very grateful too. They'll be OK. They're a lot happier now in their bungalow. At least it gives a greater autonomy over movement and eating. And it's a cosy place inside.


