Update from Maldon District Council

Business and community organisations across Maldon District are invited to apply for a new grant scheme. Funding is available to improve productivity and to strengthen the rural economy and rural communities.

Maldon District Council, in partnership with the Rural Community Council of Essex, will be distributing capital funding received through the Rural England Prosperity Fund into projects with beneficial outcomes for businesses and communities throughout the district.

Applications will need to focus on one of three key areas:

- Rural circular economy projects
- Impactful volunteering and social action projects to develop social and human capital in local places
- Small scale investment in micro and small enterprises in rural areas.

Applications are now open, with guidance and the application process on the Maldon District Council website at www.maldon.gov.uk/repf.

St Peters

Given the position we are now facing, the Council accepts that the most important thing is to prevent further reduction of NHS services within the Maldon District. Maldon District Council is committed to working closely with the NHS to ensure those services remain in district and we will do all we can to support the NHS should services need to be re-located. This includes using the councils buildings.

As the council has adopted flexible hybrid working, it means that we have the opportunity to enable the use of our buildings. Currently, we are identifying which buildings in the town and the district could provide a home to the out patient services. However, at this stage these are only potential options and are subject to commercial sensitivities.

The Council has assets that already act as a community hub; therefore, we must look at our estate. All discussions with the NHS are commercially sensitive and would be subject to robust governance and scrutiny.

Have Your Say!

25 January marks the beginning of an eight-week period of consultation about specific health services in mid and south Essex.

The local NHS is seeking views and ideas on proposals for future arrangements for inpatient services at our community hospitals, freestanding midwife-led birthing unit, and other patient services provided at St Peter's Hospital, Maldon.

The consultation will run from 25 January to 21 March 2024.

The proposals we are asking people to consider are:

- potential changes to the places where we provide some community hospital intermediate care and stroke rehabilitation services,
- making permanent the temporary move of the freestanding midwife-led birthing unit from St Peter's Hospital to, Maldon to the William Julien Courtauld Unit at St Michael's, Braintree.

the possibility of moving all other patient services at St Peter's Hospital, Maldon to other locations, mostly in and around Maldon.

- Joining one of six online discussion sessions.
- Joining a public consultation hearing that we're holding in Maldon. This is a formal event, and people will need to submit their questions in advance.
- Joining a session being run by a voluntary sector organisation. These sessions are for people that might find it difficult to attend one of the other public events, and/or for people that need extra support to understand the proposals and share their views.
