A hidden gem nestling by the Chelmer and Blackwater Navigation, Langford, Maldon

A rare opportunity to visit this historic mill - part of our industrial heritage Free guided tours by the enthusiastic and knowledgeable members of the Beeleigh Mill Restoration Group

Beeleigh Mill is a unique steam powered mill under restoration. Until 1875 it was part of one of the largest flour mills in Essex. A fire destroyed the 5 storey water-driven mill leaving the steam mill almost entirely intact.




