
News from Great Totham Primary School

After that, we got a piece of cloth and hammered the colour from the leaves on to the cloth. When we finished and took the cloth away, it had leaf prints on - this was called 'The Hapa Zome'.

We really enjoyed all the activities, especially when we got covered in mud!

Update from Maldon District Council

We have had problems again with the work at Westcombe Park leaving mud on the surrounding roads. I have made sure that the developer increases the road and pavement cleaning when we have wet weather. If you do see a problem like this or any kind of littering and fly tipping, then please let me or Jade know, as unlike the road conditions and potholes, the district council does have responsibilities in these areas.

We have been awarded a grant of £3000 to create activities as part of a Community Activation for the upcoming Ford RideLondon event. This will serve as a focal point for local activities, offering a diverse range of opportunities for residents. These will include:

- Free bike maintenance sessions to encourage residents to attend the RideLondon event by bike, and also get their bikes looked at
- Places Leisure will be promoting cycling activities at their centre, providing membership offers and a taster fitness class at Promenade Park before the start of the race.
- A programme of free spin classes at Blackwater Leisure Centres
- Parish Councils will be offered either a bike maintenance session or lead ride.

Wickham Bishops Parish Council has been awarded £750 from the Active Maldon Fund to support a project aimed at promoting outdoor activities and social interactions within the village. This includes a redesign and update of the Six Walks booklet, which I am sure Great Totham ward residents will be interested in accessing. The revised booklet will be easily accessible, both online through the village website and in hard copy format
