

- + The Annual Remembrance Service at the Three Villages War Memorial, sponsored by Little Braxted Parish Council will take place as usual at 2.30pm on Sunday 10th November. ALL WELCOME.



HISTORICAL NOTE

The War Memorial can be found at the junction of Kelvedon Road, Braxted Road and Tiptree Road. It commemorates Charles Oscar Wilson who lived at Heath Cottage in Little Braxted Parish, just a few yards away. His parents, William and Elizabeth Wilson, made a major donation towards the Memorial and Charles has a whole panel personally dedicated, "To the Memory of Our Son".

The War Memorial is a Listed Building.

Commemorating those who have served and died in the World Wars, the Memorial becomes the focal point of the Parishes of Great Braxted, Little Braxted and Wickham Bishops each Remembrance Sunday. The parishioners of these three villages join in with the traditional service on this day and with the laying of wreaths.

Killed in action on 26/3/1917 Lt Wilson was interred in Gaza.

Y5 First Aid

Maldon Life Savers came to our school to teach us about CPR. They brought

some replicas of humans to practise with, and taught us to press down on the middle of the person
who was having a cardiac arrest. This was around the chest area. They taught us to check our
surroundings for dangers and how to successfully call 999, 911 and to ask for an ambulance. We
were told how to locate ourselves using an app that gave you three words (like Butter, Turtle, Tree)
that you told the emergency service so they can find you. They said we should state our emergency
and repeat our location so they can definitely find us. After being told about this we practised doing
mouth to mouth, and how we should do 30 chest compressions and 2 mouth to mouths. We learnt
how to use an automatic defibrillator and to stand clear when it's shocking the casualty. We learnt
the recovery position and to shout for help and listen to breathing. Written by Lucas









Year 5/6 Football

In October, we attended the first part of a year 5/6 football tournament in Colchester. There were 16 teams playing in 2 pools. We played 7 games against the other teams in our pool, throughout the day.

The format was a 7-a-side team with a squad of 10 players.

Our team was a little nervous to begin with, but they soon got into the flow of the games. We won every game and



only conceded one goal the whole day! The squad worked so well as a team, they were supportive of each other, showed great sportsmanship to each other and opposing teams if a player got hurt or fell and played some exciting football!

Goals, 22 of them (plus an own goal), were scored from many different players: 7 from Lucas, 6 from Ralphie, 3 from Oscar and 2 from Stanley, Henry and Zachariah.

The top 4 schools, of which we were one, from each pool were awarded a place in the finals, which will be played on 22nd October.

It was a great day in the rain and the chilly air didn't seem to bother the players! Thank you to Rachel Harwood, for her help and all the parents for their support.



Year 3/4 Tag Rugby Tournament

We organised a Tag Rugby event for local schools in the Maldon Schools Sports Partnership. Eight teams played in 2 pools with a Great Totham team in each pool.

Our red team lost the first game but this led to them gaining confidence and they went on to win and draw further games. We were unlucky to not go through to the semi-final as we had the same number of points as All Saints with the same number of tries scored, but we had one more try scored against us, so unfortunately the tournament ended at this point for the reds.

Our yellow team played some very exciting games with lots of fast runs and tries scored and a whole lot of opposing team players tagged! The yellows made it

through to the final playing Maldon Court for the trophy. The game was so close and thrilling to watch, and it came to just one try between the 2 teams, giving Maldon Court the victory.
