District Council news

The Local Government Association (LGA) has confirmed that the Council's work with the Community Volunteer Service will be highlighted as good practice in supporting people during the cost of living crisis. The Council worked with partners to support the community during the Covid-19 pandemic but as that situation passed it was obvious that the need for help had not gone away.

Residents now need support with the cost of living crisis and our storage container is a key part in that support. An example is, Moat Housing Association recently bought slow cookers as these use less energy to run than an oven. They can be given to residents struggling with the rising energy costs over the winter but until then can be stored in the container. If you need support then please let me know and I can pass your information onto the council.

After a resident brought it to my attention that there was no waste bin by the bus stop on the north bound side of the B1022, I arranged a survey with officers and one now has been installed. I am also chasing Essex Highways about the damaged B1022.

In Little Totham we now have 30mph painted on The Street and School Road, along with improvements to the road side reflectors. I am hoping that other highway schemes will also be implemented over the next 6 months.
