Each year group bubble held their own remembrance assembly and observed two minutes silence to remember those who have fought and died at war.




New Intake September 2021

Essex Highways, Parish information: Emergency Road closure - Little Braxted Bridge, Little Braxted Lane

Please be aware an emergency road closure has been implemented on Little Braxted Lane at Little Braxted Bridge (No. 416) following reports that the newly-repaired parapet has been demolished by passing vehicles. Temporary safety barriers have been put in place however the bridge, which is located near the A12 and passes over the River Blackwater, is currently unsafe for use by vehicles. Access will be permitted only for pedestrians and cyclists.

The bridge is expected to remain fully closed for a minimum of 5 weeks from 17th November due to the current high water levels which need to reduce to allow access, and due to the minimum timescales relating to the supply of any materials that would be needed to carry out repairs.

In the meantime a diversion is in place. Details will be reflected on one.network in due course.

The Great Braxted Parish Council has purchased some 30mph self-adhesive vinyl warning signs, which would have been distributed to specific households by now, and we hope you will stick these on your black / green / food / glass waste wheelie bin(s). (x3 per household)

The GBPC is acutely aware of the occasional visitor exceeding the speed limit in our parts of the village that are restricted to 30mph, and as there are more children, pensioners, cyclists and walkers in general using the road and playground in the village than there has been for some years, we are keen to find solutions wherever we can, and these wheelie bin stickers are a small first step to making drivers more aware.

We appreciate that wheelie bins go out on a rotational basis however we feel the stickers are a great visual reminder to motorists to drive safely.

It is believed that temporary signs of this nature have a great effect of disseminating the message of sticking to the speed limit along our village roads.

The stickers are screen printed onto high grade self-adhesive vinyl using UV stable inks.

We hope you will be on-board with this initiative and the GBPC will continue to push through more initiatives to improve our villager's safety on village roads, as a paramount objective.
