

GREAT BRAXTED IN BLOOM 2022

In July 2021 requests were invited for funding from the 2021-22 ECC Locality Fund (bids up to £1000).

The GBPC asked for support in 'brightening up the lives of our community' through an initiative the Parish Council called 'Great Braxted in Bloom 2022'.

Our vision is to bring a bright and colourful display to the village during spring and summer 2022 through this autumn's planting of 8,000 bulbs of various varieties. Not only did we want to brighten up the lives of residents after a very tough and dark 18 months of the covid pandemic, but (by co-incidence) also ensuring the village is truly in colour as we approached the forthcoming Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations in June 2022. (More about the Parish Council planning for a local celebration will follow in early 2022).

The Parish Council 'bid for bulbs' was successful, the funding received and 8,000 bulbs were ordered. They arrived at the very start of November and a voluntary village team very kindly offered to do the hard spade work, namely the planting, at the weekend of 6/7th November.

My thanks go to those residents in Bung Row, Sextons Lane, Granville Close, The Willows and Tiptree Road who turned out with their spades to plant the bulbs.....we hope for colourful results next year and for many years to follow.

Rector Brings Choir and Organ on Ice THE THAW BEGINS

WITHAM, (Essex), Sunday.

Insistent tinkling of a bell summoned a party of Essex skaters to-day to take part in a church service conducted in the middle of a frozen lake.


About fifty skaters obeyed the call, and, spaced out at intervals to avoid cracking the ice, joined in half an hour's devotions.

This unusual scene was staged on the lake at Braxted Park, near Witham, the residence of Mr. W. W. Boulton.

The Rev. Russell Brown, rector of Great Braxted Church, which is within a stone's throw of the lake, foreseeing the likelihood of skating proving a strong counter-attrac-tion, decided to substitute an open-air service on the lake for one inside the church.

A harmonium was pushed to the middle of the lake, and a male choir led the singing of hymns, with which the whir of those who were still skating and the cracking of the ice blended eerily.

"It was picturesque," one of the participants told me, "to see the white-robed clergyman, ringed by skaters with glowing cheeks, against a background of frost-spangled trees."
