

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ST NICHOLAS, CHURCH LITTLE BRAXTED

(In the Ecclesiastical Parish of Wickham Bishops with Little Braxted)

With some easing for public services we are resuming the 10.30am Service of Holy Communion Sundays in St. Bartholomew's Church starting on the 26th July 2020. The first part of the Service will also be streamed via Face Book Live as happens now. Numbers for this service will be limited to 36 maximum taking into account required social distancing. More details of how we plan to adhere to the guidelines and safely manage expectations will appear in notices and the Pew Sheet over the coming weeks. The guidelines received from the Government also indicate that those over 70 remain in the vulnerable bracket and are advised not to attend public worship services.

Still under discussion is our ability to re-open St Nicholas for either private prayer or public services under the guidelines. For the present time and until further clarification or relaxation of the guidelines St Nicholas will remain closed. However St Bartholomew's will be open for private and individual prayer on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2.00pm to 4.00pm until further advised.

If you want to join, it is quite a simple process but you need to let me know so that I can add your email address to the invitation list.

The Sunday Service 'script' as well as the weekly Pew Sheet, double the usual size, with the Collect and Readings for the day and other information about other podcast or online services is available on our Website to read or download.

This continues to be a challenging time for all of us so may we assure you of our love and prayers; that we are thinking of you. We look forward to making the house of God a 'home' again! Rev. Hilary

Message from District Councillor

In the budget speech presented by the leader of Essex County Council, it was announced that every county councillor would be given a sum of money that could be awarded to projects in their respective divisions. Despite the considerable financial strain that the county council is experiencing with the Covid 19 pandemic, these funds are still available.

Every division has been allocated £10,000 for the year 2020/21 and it is my intention to spend this amount before the end of the calendar year. Clearly there are some criteria for the fund that need to be satisfied, but in the main, the decision where the money is awarded is down to the member. The guidance suggests that there are three main ways where the money can be spent. 1. making a grant to a registered charity, parish council, community or voluntary body. 2. buying goods or services. 3. Commissioning services from ECC.

There are of course several areas where the money may not be spent, for example to an organisation that the councillor has an interest, any political use or any profit making organisations etc.

I am therefore seeking bids for this funding from parish councils and other qualifying bodies in my division. I am open to any proposal that qualifies for any sum up to and including £10,000. It would be nice to spread the money across the division, but I am willing to look at all requests.

There is not a formal application form, but ideally I would like a short description of each request giving details about the project, who will benefit from the grant and the amount being applied for. I would like to receive applications by 1st September so that I can make the decisions and submit my bid to the Democracy Team at ECC. This should enable the grants to be paid by the end of 2020.

NHS TRACK AND TRACE

With the development of Track and Trace, many people have been asking for advice around how this works.

Please find below the official advice from the <u>GOV.UK website</u> on how the system works and advice on how to avoid being the victim of any possible scams as a result of the implementation of this system.

When we contact you

If the NHS test and trace service contacts you, the service will use text messages, email or phone.

All texts or emails will ask you to sign into the <u>NHS test and trace contact-tracing</u> website.

If NHS test and trace calls you by phone, the service will be using a single phone number: 0300 013 5000.

All information you provide to the NHS test and trace service is held in strict confidence and will only be kept and used in line with the Data Protection Act 2018.

Contact tracers will:

- call you from 0300 013 5000
- · send you text messages from 'NHS'
- ask for your full name and date of birth to confirm your identity, and postcode to offer support while self-isolating
- ask if you are experiencing any coronavirus symptoms
- provide advice on what you must do as you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus

Contact tracers will never:

- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to us (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- · ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind
- · ask for any details about your bank account
- · ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- disclose any of your personal or medical information to your contacts
- provide medical advice on the treatment of any potential coronavirus symptoms
- ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS
