Over the last 10 weeks NCSN volunteers have done much to be proud of:

- shopped, collected and delivered food and medicines for those in isolation during Covid19
- made somebody's day with a caring and thoughtful phone call or doorstep call
- delivered a surprise gift on VE Day to lift the spirits
- Listened to those that needed an ear
- Reassured those who are finding this time anxious
- Taken book bundles to households that are missing the libraries

This week they provided the 374th instance of support to neighbours. Almost 100 times each in Wickham Bishops and Great Totham South, 35 times in the Braxteds and a whopping 149 times in Great Totham North & Little Totham - but each act of assistance as valuable as the next.

Unsurprisingly, food shopping continues to be the top request (188 times) closely followed by prescription related activity (114 times) but they have also helped with rarer tasks such as:

- putting out bins
- post office and banking activities
- collecting unwanted government food parcels for redistribution





A circular walk of 2 halves for both Braxted villages

I have recently been inspired by the below pictures of the bell at Scripts Chase, and other villagers to create a brief guide to a circular walk, that takes in the beautiful countryside that we are surrounded by.





Have some fun. Another lock-down experience to try out using the above contraption found at Scripts Chase to ring the bell for the NHS

<u>The Walk in brief:</u> I am deliberately starting at the top of Goat Lodge Lane at the junction with Beacon Hill, as it is easy to find, and dependent on which village you are in, you will use different routes to reach here. While you are here, take in the great view across Scripps farm and on a clear day the Blackwater in the distance, maybe even make use of the bench on Beacon Hill that overlooks the view.

When you are ready walk down Goat Lodge Lane, and use the first unmade road/bridleway you come to on your left, which is a public right of way.

Follow this path past the farm house, and you will find the above pictured bell ringing device just at the side of the path to your left. After that brief interlude, continue all the way to the bottom of the path, that will bring you onto the Colchester Rd, then if you are circling back to

- 1. Great Braxted, cross the road and proceed down Beckingham Rd, at the first fork in the road keep to the left proceeding up Totham Hill Green, until you reach the junction with Chapel Rd and Mill Rd, proceed up Mill Rd until you again reach Colchester Road and cross over into Braxted Lane following this to the top back into Great Braxted.
- 2. Little Braxted, cross the road and turn right, this will take you past The Bull Pub, of which there is a public footpath to the left of the pub that takes you back to Goat Lodge Lane, or continue on until you reach the Post Office, and cross over at the Zebra crossing and proceed up Walden House Road, and take the first turning on your right back into Goat Lodge Lane, proceeding to the top of the road back to the starting point of this walk. The longer walk would be No.1 and is approximately 4 miles.

Advice and tips to spot the scams

We are reminding people in Essex to be vigilant following reports that fraudsters are attempting to take advantage of the current climate by carrying out crime online and at people's doorsteps.

Sadly fraudsters will look to take advantage of any situation. This means tricking people into parting with their money and information, including posing as government officials, bank or other financial services employees by text message, online or by knocking at doors.

While we have only received a handful of incidents, it's important that people be mindful before handing over money or personal details.

Some simple steps you can take are:

- Do not assume or believe a call, a knock on the door or a deal online is genuine.
- Take five minutes before taking action and trust your instinct. If it doesn't feel
 real or genuine, it probably isn't.
- Challenge any calls, visits or messages you may receive.
- Never click on links and never divulge personal information the police and government departments will never ask you for these details.
- If you receive any fake gov.uk/coronavirus messages, please report these to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.
- · Contact your bank immediately if you think you are a victim of a scam.



No to North Essex Garden Communities

Time for Braintree Council to start asking residents what THEY want for the future of the district.

Both new towns proposed in Braintree District have been thrown out by a planning inspector. 24,000-home West Tey and 10,000-home 'West of Braintree' garden community were found unsound in a letter this week. The inspector said that a garden community East of Colchester could be made sound and advised either withdrawing the plan or dropping West Tey and West of Braintree. This is amazing news for residents who have lived in the shadow of the loss of 5,600 acres of countryside and car-dependent dormitory sprawl on an enormous scale.

Delays to Braintree's Local Plan have been a disaster for the district. Developers have had carte blanche to develop, under a government clause which allows development if there is no plan in place (or no five-year supply of housing land). Our money has been wasted, with around 8 million diverted to the garden communities project.

Now CAUSE (Campaign Against Urban Sprawl in Essex) believes it is time to do things differently. It urges Braintree Council to do three things:

- 1. Involve local people. Engage properly & listen to feedback;
- 2. Put the environment & sustainable travel at the heart of a new plan;
- 3. Plan for what we need. Revisit all assumptions about infrastructure and affordable housing.

Oh, and Stop wasting money on NEGC Ltd.
