### NORTHERN LIGHTS OVER WITHAM?


The below picture was taken at around 10pm on Saturday 6th April, looking toward Witham from Great Braxted, and the green light seen in the sky does not seemed to have made the news, but all sorts of theories were expressed locally as to the reason, or source for the strange light, such as Aurora Borealis (although sometimes seen from the North Norfolk coastline, it has not been reported that the northern lights have been seen so far South), or perhaps an alien invasion or an attempt at contact from extra terrestrials!



# Gourmet Hand Made Raw Dog Meals









### 34-YEAR OLD CRISP PACKET FOUND

Ocean rower and marine police officer Dawn Wood, from Burnham, said she has been doing her bit to clean up the Essex coastline for more than a decade, she recently found a crisp packet dating back to 1985 in the water.

Tests in the River Blackwater found 15.1 pieces of tiny plastics per litre of water.

They used fluorescent lighting to identify particles less than 5mm in size such as fragments, fibres and film.

It's an example of how not looking after your property while enjoying the Essex coastline can result in the pollution of our oceans. Dawn found the crisp packet on the bank of the River Crouch near to a storm drain. It is in perfect condition other than the print has faded.



Dawn said "This goes to show just how long our plastic waste lasts. It's frightening that every piece of plastic ever produced since the 1950s still exists today. After time the plastic will break down forming tiny fragments called microplastics so it never actually goes away – it just breaks down into tiny bits.

"Next time you are at the beach, grab a handful of sand, look through it very carefully and you will almost certainly find tiny fragments of plastic. The microplastic causes a whole other issue as it attracts toxins which live on it. It is then eaten by smaller sea life and eventually gets into our food chain"

"In Essex, we have 400 miles of coastline and everyone needs to do their bit to protect it."









### If you FIND a dog...

- Look around the area and see if there is anyone obviously looking for their lost pet.
- Report to the local council (dog warden); it is the law and they may already have had the
  dog reported as missing. You can find details of your local dog warden on-line here:
  www.gov.uk/report-stray-dog
- If you can, take the dog to a local vets for them to scan for a chip.
   In most cases they will then be able to call the owner if dog is chipped, or call the local dog warden to collect if not.
- In Scotland you should also report to the police.
- Also check in the 'Lost' section of the DogLost website to see if this dog has been reported as missing. www.doglost.co.uk/dog-search.php?status=Lost
- Many of our volunteers in the area do have scanners so may be able to come out and scan
  the dog for you. You can ask on local DogLost pages if anyone can help or call our head
  office for more information.
- Register the dog on the DogLost website: <u>www.doglost.co.uk</u>
   and share on Social Media such as Facebook / Twitter, local DogLost pages and groups.
- You can also print posters from this dog's page using the View Poster button and put up around the area that he / she was found. Don't forget to laminate in case it rains.
- If you can, put Posters in local shops, pubs, garages, supermarkets; everywhere that there are a lot of people. Spread the word to try to find the owners . . .


