It is with great sadness that we report of the passing of Roy at Broomfield Hospital on 14th April 2021. He died of pneumonia, not Covid 19. He was 86 years old.

He was a stalwart of Braxted for very many years and an active member of the community. He served at one time as a Parish councillor; he ran the Braxted Whist club; he had been a member of various village clubs including the Garden club; and at one time looked after the playground, and cut the grass there.

He was an active member of All Saints Church and supported his wife Sue who was a Churchwarden and latterly the Verger. He also was responsible for managing the building of the extension of the church including the provision of toilets and a small kitchen.

He had many interests which included gardening, golf, model railways, etc. He will be greatly missed and all our prayers and sympathies are with Sue, Stephen, Dawn, Simon, Ian, and all the grandchildren, great grandchildren and family and many friends. HOW TO TREAT CORONAVIRUS SYMPTOMS AT HOME

TEMPERATURE



✓ Get lots of rest.



Drink plenty of fluids (water is best) to avoid dehydration - drink enough so your pee is light yellow and clear.



 Take paracetamol or ibuprofen if you feel uncomfortable.

COUGH



 Lie on your side or sit upright instead.
 Avoid lying on your back.



Try having a teaspoon of honey to help ease a cough. But do not give honey to babies under 12 months.

If this does not help, ask a non-isolating friend or family member to seek advice from a pharmacist on your behalf.

BREATHLESS



✓ Keep your room cool. Try turning the heating down or opening a window. DO NOT use a fan as it may spread the virus.



Try breathing slowly in through your nose and out through your mouth, with your lips together.



 Sit upright in a chair relaxing your shoulders.



Lean forward slightly support yourself by putting your hands on your knees or on something stable like a chair.

Try to stay calm if you're feeling breathless. Anxiety can make it worse.

Call 999 for an ambulance if you or someone you care for:

- are struggling to breathe
- are coughing up blood
- have blue lips or a blue face
- feel cold and sweaty, with pale or blotchy skin
- have a rash that does not fade when you roll a glass over it
- collapse or faint
- become confused or very drowsy
- have stopped peeing or are peeing much less than usual

Tell the operator you might have coronavirus symptoms.

DO NOT GO TO A PHARMACY

If you or someone you live with has coronavirus symptoms, you must all stay at home.

If you're concerned about your symptoms and need medical advice, use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service.

GETTING HELP WHILE YOU'RE STAYING AT HOME

The Essex Wellbeing Service can help you while you have to stay at home (self-isolate).

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If you FIND a dog ...

- Look around the area and see if there is anyone obviously looking for their lost pet.
- Report to the local council (dog warden); it is the law and they may already have had the
 dog reported as missing. You can find details of your local dog warden on-line here:
 www.gov.uk/report-stray-dog
- If you can, take the dog to a local vets for them to scan for a chip.
 In most cases they will then be able to call the owner if dog is chipped, or call the local dog warden to collect if not.
- In Scotland you should also report to the police.
- Also check in the 'Lost' section of the DogLost website to see if this dog has been reported as missing. www.doglost.co.uk/dog-search.php?status=Lost
- Many of our volunteers in the area do have scanners so may be able to come out and scan
 the dog for you. You can ask on local DogLost pages if anyone can help or call our head
 office for more information.
- Register the dog on the DogLost website: www.doglost.co.uk
 and share on Social Media such as Facebook / Twitter, local DogLost pages and groups.
- You can also print posters from this dog's page using the View Poster button and put
 up around the area that he / she was found. Don't forget to laminate in case it rains.
- If you can, put Posters in local shops, pubs, garages, supermarkets; everywhere that there
 are a lot of people. Spread the word to try to find the owners...
