

I have raised this as a matter for urgent repair with Essex County Council and it is receiving urgent inspection. You may have read in the local news about Maldon District Council passing the plans for the Heybridge Garden Village. This is something that as a councillor, I had to take a long-term strategic decision upon. The development is part of the 5-year housing allocation, the council is obliged to meet. This obligation comes from central government.

By passing the development it ensures that we are able protect the villages from any speculative development This will mean that we keep the integrity of our villages. It also means that long term there will be new infrastructure and facilities which will help our community. In the long term will help meet demand for services, which are currently under pressure.


Maldon District Council raise alert over council tax scam



LOCAL WALKS Wickham Bishops & Little Braxted via Goat Lodge Lane

(approx. 2.5 miles soft ground, slightly overgrown)

This pleasant walk starts at **Wickham Bishops Village Hall**, cross the road to **Snows corner** and proceed down **The Street** passing on your left a **parade of shops** and the former **Chequers Pub**, carry on passed **Handleys Lane**, when you reach The **Onestop shop** turn left down **Great Totham Rd**, pass most of the houses until you see a **public footpath** sign that runs through the playing fields and Tennis court area, follow this **public footpath** until it takes you onto **Kelvedon Rd**.

Once on **Kelvedon Rd**, you should see another **public footpath** sign directly opposite, proceed up the shared driveway, and you will see ahead the continuation of the **public footpath** to the left of the property boundary, follow this **public footpath** passed the fields where currently miniature ponys are kept, through a stile and gate, and onto a small wooded area, follow this **public footpath** until you pass through a final gate onto **Goat Lodge Lane**.

Turn left on **Goat Lodge Lane** and keep an eye out for the slightly hidden **public footpath** sign on the left, next to the entrance to a property called **Woodlands**, follow this wooded **public footpath** behind some fine properties, until you exit onto **Beacon Hill**.

Turn left on **Beacon Hill** and look out for the **public footpath** sign on your right, follow this **public footpath** until you near the exit onto **Braxted Rd**, do not exit onto **Braxted Rd**, but veer to your left following a second adjoining **public footpath** until you exit onto **Kelvedon Rd**, at this point you have a choice of having a quick pitstop in **The Green Man**, by turning right on **Kelvedon Rd** and you will find **The Green Man** a short walk on your left, after having visited **The Green Man**, double back to the **public footpath** you left earlier, or if you did not visit the pub, on exiting the **public footpath** turn left and follow **Kelvedon Rd** upward until you reach the junction and the **War Memorial**.

When standing at the **War Memorial**, you will see opposite the junction the entry to the rest of **Kelvedon Rd**, as you enter this part of **Kelvedon Rd**, you should see almost immediately a **public footpath** on the right that runs between the houses, if you follow this **public footpath** it will lead past the rear of **The Black Houses designed by Arthur Mackmurdo** and on to **Handleys Lane**, at the bottom of **Handleys Lane** turn right and walk back up **The Street** until you see **Wickham Bishops Village Hall** where your journey began.
