

If you FIND a dog ...

- Look around the area and see if there is anyone obviously looking for their lost pet.
- Report to the local council (dog warden); it is the law and they may already have had the
 dog reported as missing. You can find details of your local dog warden on-line here:
 www.gov.uk/report-stray-dog
- If you can, take the dog to a local vets for them to scan for a chip.
 In most cases they will then be able to call the owner if dog is chipped, or call the local dog warden to collect if not.
- In Scotland you should also report to the police.
- Also check in the 'Lost' section of the DogLost website to see if this dog has been reported as missing. www.doglost.co.uk/dog-search.php?status=Lost
- Many of our volunteers in the area do have scanners so may be able to come out and scan the dog for you. You can ask on local DogLost pages if anyone can help or call our head office for more information.
- Register the dog on the DogLost website: www.doglost.co.uk
 and share on Social Media such as Facebook / Twitter, local DogLost pages and groups.
- You can also print posters from this dog's page using the View Poster button and put up around the area that he / she was found. Don't forget to laminate in case it rains.
- If you can, put Posters in local shops, pubs, garages, supermarkets; everywhere that there
 are a lot of people. Spread the word to try to find the owners . . .


Yomelelani Bridge Day Tuesday 26th November 2019

Dangers of posting on social media while on holiday

POLICE have warned that some home insurance policies become invalidated if you post that you are away from home on social media.

Police are warning people not to 'check-in' on social media at the airport, avoid tagging others who are on holiday and wait to post your holiday photos until you get home.

Does it really matter?

Yes. Various police forces have issued warnings, and so has the Financial Ombudsman.

The Ombudsman says you wouldn't put a poster up on your front lawn saying you're going on holiday, so why would you post the same thing online to a bunch of strangers?

Advice from insurance sites say home insurers expect you to take 'reasonable care' when it comes to security.

Examples of not doing this would be leaving a window open or a door unlocked at night.

Another could be advertising your absence. In every case, you could find your insurer quibbling any claim you made, either reducing the pay-out or even not paying out at all.

What else shouldn't I do?

If your contents insurance limits the number of consecutive days your home can be unoccupied without invalidating your cover, then you reveal in Facebook post that you're on a two-month long cruise, any claim could be invalidated simply by clicking on the 'post this status' button.
