## Making a difference in the community

Litter may be a scourge of the countryside, but in Great a Waltham and Howe Street, residents have been doing their bit to help keep the area clean.

Samuel Smith (below), who lives in Howe Street, has been very busy collecting and disposing of the litter in and around his home. He has already completed a three-

month period of volunteering and has been awarded Bronze Duke of Edinburgh.

During this time

he collected around 20 bags of litter and several boxes of glass bottles. He now starts his next period of volunteering - this time for his Silver Duke of Edinburgh. He will be litter picking for the next six months in and ground Howe street with the support of his parents.

Meanwhile, the Parish Clear Up took place on a very blustery Saturday 16 March. Mike Steel, chair of the Parish Council, thanked the volunteers who turned out on the day. There is also a Monthly Volunteer Litter Pick team who concentrate on a

selected area each month and Mike says: "No wonder our Parish looks so clean! The Parish Council recently made a grant to the monthly team to purchase a 6 foot litter picker and what a difference it makes."

The Parish Council supports both the monthly litter pick group and the six monthly Parish Clear ups held in March and October. If you spot any fly tipping please contact the Chelmsford Street Clean team on 01245 606606.

## Do you want to see a Speed Watch group in Great Waltham?

We have been running a very successful Speed Watch in Ford End for the last year. I have just had a Great Waltham site registered with the Community Speed Watch group and we went out last week – myself plus a couple of Ford End people. I chose a site where we know speed can be an issue and where residents have complained. The end objective isn't to catch people but, through awareness, to get them to slow down. It also demonstrates that residents are concerned and helps when trying to get ECC Highways to implement speed measures – as we have done at Ford End – ECC are installing 20mph (variable voluntary) past the school and 40mph buffers soon. If anyone in GW wants to join the group, I can arrange training - a short course of about an hour - mostly about objectives, safety, etc. Contact mike.2.steel@btinternet if interested.

#### From the Vicarage,

#### War and peace?

Something happened in a school that I think has relevance and is food for thought for us all.

A friend of mine went into a Church of England school at the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday and invited children who wanted to to be marked with a cross on their forehead by other children with the words, 'This sign of a cross shows that God loves you.' Most of the children clustered round and were keen to have a cross on their heads. The day before a girl had said excitedly, 'It's tomorrow you come and put a cross on our heads.' When asked at a different time of the year another child had mentioned how much this meant to them. Given they go and do assemblies and do everything they can think of from video clips to re-enacting stories it was interesting that this was what stuck in children's minds.

As she left the school she walked through the playground. A little boy came up to her, crying and said, 'Dannie is hitting me with his coat and the boys are running away and making fun of people with a cross on their heads'. They went to talk to the boys in the group and he said, 'But Freddie went to kick me'. A little girl said, 'While they were fighting I was praying'. They went over to a teacher and explained what was going on. She was naturally concerned and they talked to the boys about it, and she said they would talk about it in circle time. She later told me it was a bit more complicated, and I don't want to be over dramatic that it happened to be around people with ash crosses on their heads — it could have been anything.

But I was struck by how a group of 7 year olds were reinacting what is happening in our world, how intolerant we can be of difference, how easy it is to be fearful. In some areas of the world Christians are killed for their beliefs, and it is too easy for there to be fear of people from different religions, especially Islam.

This week Revd Jackie and I went into Great Waltham school and did an assembly about difference. I've got short hair and Jackie has longer hair so we got all the kids with shorter hair to sit on my side of the hall and all the children with longer hair to sit on Jackie's side. I started by saying that people with shorter hair are better than people with longer hair, and Jackie obviously said people with longer hair were better. The kids were laughing at the absurdity of our argument. We got the kids cheering for their different sides, and then we ended up being able to say and see that differences don't matter and give us more richness. Children were able to see that it's fine for people to have different length hair - and then think where else this applies in life. Mr Burden even said he would bring in a photo of himself with long hair - which I am dying to see! It is important that 2 primary school children can learn to live together with their differences and be friends. It is important that we can value those who are different from us. How can we calmly listen and find out what makes them tick. There is a lack of moral debate in our society about so many things. Everyone seems to be shouting at each other. We find it so hard when people are different from us, to value that difference, to be interested in it rather than threatened.

I won't use the B word, but I think what I am saying is clear. We have to learn to live well together with those who disagree with us.

This is my prayer this Lent. Revd Caroline Brown

We were then treated to some aspects of Gill and Adrian's recent trip to the state of Kerala In India. We had a most interesting talk about the tea growing and the many spices that were grown there, as well as sampling the chocolate that was made from the cocoa they produced. ### Great Waltham Parish Office - an open letter

I am writing this open letter to the Parish Magazine to try to promote further debate as to the future of our Parish Office in the run up to our Parish Council Elections in May.

Parishioners may know that the lease on the current Parish Office in the Old Fire Station is soon to expire and our Parish Council are in discussions to either relocate the office to Great Waltham Village Hall or to build a new facility, possibly adjacent to the changing rooms on Great Waltham Recreation Ground.

Both alternatives have their 'pros and cons' and I will leave it to those standing for election to inform parishioners of their views on this issue. In my opinion, relocation to the Village Hall would be the preferred option, in that the rent that is currently paid to a private landlord, will in effect, be paid back to the parishioners of Great Waltham - the Village Hall using the rental to maintain and improve a valuable village asset. When one bears in mind that over the term of the lease, the Parish Council will have paid approaching £80,000 to rent the current facility, this is a considerable amount of money which could be re-invested back into our community.

May I finish this letter with a word of thanks to our current Parish Councillors who give their time freely and work tirelessly for the benefit of our Parish. We are fortunate to live in such a wonderful community and this in part is due to their efforts for which I for one am very grateful. Andrew Tinsley

The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel – Chair) of the Parish Council Meeting of Monday 18th February 2019. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website https://www.essexinfo.net/great-waltham-parish/

The PC reviewed a letter received from the GW VH Committee and information relayed in the public open session. The VH committee stated that they are reviewing the future use, and invited the PC to comment especially in regard to public car parking. It was noted that the PC had previously discussed, in 2016, on how the car park might be made open to the public, but these had not reached a satisfactory conclusion. Given the invitation to re-open such talks, the PC agreed to meet with the VH Committee to see if a viable solution could be reached

The poor state of the GW football pitch was recognised. Discussions with maintenance contractors had resulted in conflicting advice and it was decided that independent professional advice would be sought.

The previous PC meeting had been looking at options to pay for a refurbishment or new build of GW Changing Rooms combined with Parish Office. An unsolicited proposal from Waltham United to refurbish the Changing rooms by using local voluntary labour had been received prior to this meeting, with a target to extend the life to 20 years to match the remaining lease on the land at the Recreation Ground. It was agreed that the PC needed to find out whether the lease can be extended as this had a bearing on any decision.

In regard of the offer of leasing 14 car parking spaces on the GW "garages" site; the last meeting had agreed in principle to this subject to an acceptable level of cost and removal of certain conditions. Cllr Steel had spoken to CHP and received reassurance that these terms could be removed. Cllr Steel had also investigated potential maintenance costs of block paving areas, and reassured the meeting that the levels were within acceptable limits. The PC thought that they should engage professional legal support in order to respond back to CHP. Ford End VH are unable to compete the toilet upgrade prior to the end of March. when the part grant from the PC expires. It was agreed that the grant would be rolled over to the next Financial Year and given in the original proportion as the work was completed.

The PC considered a complaint by a Ford End resident in relation to the placement of the warning Speedwatch signs on the 9th Feb. The PC concluded that their was no evidence to support the complaint. Furthermore, they agreed to write to the Speedwatch group and congratulate them on their hard work on behalf of the community

The next Parish Council meeting will be held 15th April 2019, at Ford End Village Hall. The Public and Press are welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
