Call to engage villagers in phone box future

Residents of Howe Street are being asked to come up with ideas for the newly-refurbished phone box at the top of Parsonage Lane.

Thanks to a group of volunteers, the phone box is now looking spick and span in traditional Post Office red, soon to be complete with its shiny gold crowns.

Now the hunt is on to find a use for the kiosk that can be shared by the local community, with a call for ideas to be submitted to Great Waltham Parish Council by the end of September. Gill Mitchell, one of the painting volunteers, said: "Everyone has done a terrific job in coming together to make the phone box look like new again. We'd love to see it making a worthwhile contribution to the village, so we hope people will put their thinking caps on and come up with suggestions which will keep it at the heart of Howe Street."

Joining Gill with their paintbrushes have been Paul Church, Adrian Mitchell and Rachel Housden. The Parish Council adopted the phone box from BT in summer 2016, along with a number of others across the parish.

Elsewhere in the country, ideas have included using phone kiosks as a local tourist/information booth, a mini library or book sharing scheme, an exhibition space and even a coffee shop.

Shame is powerful in limiting us. Most of us I'm sure has a memory as a child or more recently, when we have been shamed, our wings clipped. We look down, we look away, we don't want to be seen, we want a hole of open up and swallow us.

When I helped in the foodbank yesterday, one of the things that struck me was the shame of a number of people who had to come so they had food for themselves and their kids, and how people took this situation personally when there was a gap in their benefits and they had nothing, had used up all their savings, were struggling under the weight of debt, and debt getting worse.

One man Pete (not his name and circumstances changed) hadn't managed to talk to anyone including his 25-year-old daughter because he felt such shame. His business had gone belly up and he was in massive debt. His first wage in his new job had gone to pay debts and now he had nothing to live on. He had got depressed, unsurprisingly and gone to his doctor who had sent him to the foodbank. He got food to get him through about 3 days, a cup of tea, a listening ear and he was able to tell me what he couldn't tell anyone else, of his shame and pain and tears, of days when he doesn't want to get out of bed but knows he must keep going. He saw how easy it would be to give up. We told him about a debt organisation Step Change that would help him, manage his debts and debtors so he'd have money for food and the basics in life and get back on his feet. And we prayed together, we offered a little sliver of hope, a sense that he is loved and accepted and valued by God. Thank you to all of you who have responded to Revd Sandra on facebook by leaving food and toiletries at the back of St Johns Church, Little Leighs. We have been so overwhelmed we have had to make extra trips to the foodbank. If you can add an extra item or two to your ordinary shop, that would be great, and bring it along – there is a box at the back of church. The list of items is on the Braintree foodbank website, but here are the items they most urgently need.




Unfortunately due to some technical issues we have absent from the parish news recently, hopefully this is sorted now and we will be posting each month.

The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel – Chair) of the Parish Council Meeting of **Monday 18**th**June 2018**. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website to www.greatwaltham.org.uk

The PC considered the issue of the GW rec ground car park which floods when it rains. A single quote to add road planings and gradient causing water to run off, was considered. The Clerk was instructed to seek alternative quotes and solutions.

An update was given on the refurbishment of the area between shop and Beehive. The Landowner has decided to withdraw support for this initiative. The Council recorded their disappointment with this decision as it has been raised several times by the public. The item is now closed.

Ford End Road Traffic Committee (FERTC) have volunteered to look after the Ford End SID. However, they do want the new SID to be deployed on the downward slope on Sandon Hill and data collected on what is considered a faster stretch of the road. They have also registered for Speedwatch training. Discussions continue with ECC pushing for clear answers on 4 questions in regard of ECC or DoT policy. A follow on meeting has been set up with the ECC Highways Network Assurance Group Manager.

Response from the pubic on the Parish Office options paper strongly supported the GW VH option. Cllr Steel was asked to arrange a visit to the VH for the sub-committee.

Following responses from CCC on the questions in regard of 14 parking bays to be installed on the garages site in GW, it was agreed that CCC would be requested to move forward on the lease from CHP to GWPC for the 14 spaces.

The PC reviewed how it could get ECC to abide by GWPC preferences for verge cutting every year, which often lapses back to the full cuts. It would appear that the PC needs to send regular reminders. A proposal for GWPC to join the Plantlife.org.uk Campaign to protect wildflowers on roadside verges was agreed and best served by members of the PC signing up as individuals to provide Plantlife with the leverage to lobby ECC. Cllr Jackson will provide an article to the Parish News to get parishioners to also sign.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held at GW Parish Office, **Monday 20**th **August 2018** commencing at 7.45pm; the Public and Press are welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
