Better together From the Vicarage

I was talking to a neighbour of mine recently and she said that our area is not what it used to be. She has lived there for over 50 years and I have been there for almost 9 years, so I asked her specifically what has changed? Her reply was, "people are in such a hurry and when they're home they live behind closed doors. In my days after the war we didn't have a lot, but what we had we would share and you could always turn to a neighbour for help."

My road is a tight-knit community and most of the residents have lived there since the sixties with a few new families, like ours, moving in. When we first moved into the road we were really blessed by having an opportunity to connect with our neighbours and get to know them. It was the year of the Queen's Jubilee and we had a street party. A few years later this was followed by the Royal Wedding and another street party. We have had coffee mornings and also hosted a gathering at Christmas. All of these moments have built our sense of community and belonging in the place we live.

It is such a gift when our neighbours are those who could lend a hand in our time of need. However, it isn't always our immediate neighbours who we build community with. It may be with those who we work with, a social club we attend, a hobby we take up or a group of friends from a particular time in our lives. Being together and being community is how God created human beings to flourish. He created a helpmate for Adam, for it was not good for man to be alone.

Loneliness is a big problem in our society today and many people experience a sense of isolation at some point or another. Loneliness is not to be confused with being alone or solitude which can be beneficial to us, but rather a sense of being left out, forgotten, overlooked or unable to connect with others. If this feeling persists over time it can have a negative impact on our mental health and well-

So how do we come back together and join up the dots? I believe the early church as written about in the book of Acts had a lot to say about what a healthy community looked like.

Now I'm not suggesting we sell our houses and give away all we have to build a commune but we can become more intentional with the way we connect. We can identify things we have in common with each other, we can stop to notice the people around us and if we haven't seen someone out and about we can ask why? We can offer to share a cup of tea or even better a meal with a neighbour or a friend and give ourselves fully to that time together without the interruption of our phones. We can look someone in the eve and ask them how they are and even be real with how we're doing instead of putting on the 'I'm fine' face. I also believe in bridging the gap between the generations. Younger people offer the older generation a link to the future, but older people offer younger people a connection to the past and a pool

We are stronger when we're together, we have more when when we share, we are blessed when we are navigate. a blessing.

News from Great Waltham C of E VC Primary School

Thanks to the 117 parents / families that complete the online parent survey—the results are very positive and give us valuable feedback. Well done to Kian and Brooke for representing Chelmsford at the county Cross Country Finals at Hadleigh Park in April – quite an achievement. Congratulations to the school football team, they



defeated Great Leighs 8-0 on 27 April to compete a 100% record in league fixtures and finish top of the table. They will now enter a play-off game against teams from another league. The netball team played in the finals

of the Chelmsford Competition after qualifying from a previous round. They won 2, drew 1 and lost 2 pool matches and proceeded the next 2

play-off matches to finish 5th overall, a superb achievement given that is all the schools in Chelmsford. Mrs Wilkinson, their coach was extremely proud of them all. Tigers were crowned Intra-House Rugby Champions a tournament for children in Y3-6.

The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel – Chairman) of the Parish Council meeting of 23rd April 2018. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website to www.greatwaltham.org.uk

GWPC have received two applicants for the vacant Cllr position. Cllrs Steel and Burton will carry out interviews with the two applicants and make recommendation to the next meeting.

We have now received a second licence from Chelmsford City Council (CCC) for the Banbury Square garden area, including the requirement for bollards (as both the garden and bench are on Highways designated land). CCC decided to split the licences in to two and previously sent a licence for the talking bench, which GWPC signed. Whilst the main objective was to ensure that the talking bench was legitimised, it was agreed that GWPC should also look to signing the second licence and the item was deferred to the F&GP committee to see if budget was available to fund the required circa £1,000 for bollards.

The Clerk is unable to attend the Parish office on Wednesday afternoons. There was a desire to try and keep the office open on these days by a rota of Cllrs. However, the few Cllrs who might be available couldn't give a firm regular commitment and given few public visitors were recorded on recent Wednesdays, it was decided to limit the published opening times to just Friday afternoons.

GWPC are trying to improve the "cobbled" area by Brook Mead. It is privately owned and the PC have offered to refurbish it in exchange for a right to use. The Landowner has agreed, but requires the PC to contribute to the cost of setting up the lease. However, GWPC have been unable to obtain a firm quote for the cost of the refurbishment work in spite of contacting several suppliers. Alternative quotes will be sought. The next Parish Council meeting will be held at GW Parish Office.

Monday 18th June 2018 commencing at 7.45pm; the Public and Press are welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
