



The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel – Chairman) of the Parish Council meeting of **19th March 2018**. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website to <a href="https://www.greatwaltham.org.uk">www.greatwaltham.org.uk</a>

Cllr Steel reported that Ford End Road Traffic Committee (FERTC) had produced a "hotspots" report which requested options from ECC for safety improvements. GWPC endorsed the report for action by ECC. Cllr Aldridge (representing ECC) acknowledge receipt of the report and will address.

Cllr Micklem tabled a number of changes to finance arrangements following the resignation of the RFO. These included account signatory tidy up, on line banking, dual authority, new format for the budget, payroll payment method change and also confirmation of annual return for Local Govt pension scheme.

Cllr Huggins, Community Network representative, raised a request to hold the Inter Pub Football tournament in May 2018, on the GW Recreation ground. Permission was granted. No objections were raised to the possible request for an alcohol licence for the day but the PC stipulated that any licence conditions must be followed. Following issues last year, the teams will play down the centre of the pitch.

It was reported that the designer, architect and planning consultant had met with residents of Howe Street at the Green man. The potential development for the adjacent field is for 15 mixed units and possibly a community centre. A second meeting is planned later in March

A paper was discussed concerning the move by Stansted Airport to increase the passenger capacity to 43m. Current cap is 35m. It was agreed that GWPC would write to Uttlesford Council to oppose the planning application.

A new Table tennis facility will be installed at the Great Waltham Recreation Ground on the 20th March. Bats and balls will be left nearby for free use.

The PC continue to look at options for a replacement Parish Office. Favoured option is a revamp of the Recreation Ground changing rooms to include office, meeting room and new changing facilities. Next step is to consult neighbours and to highlight at next Annual Assembly.

The next Parish Council will be held at GW Parish Office, **Monday 21st May 2018** commencing at 7.45pm; the Public and Press are welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
