Blossom Way Affordable Homes in Great Waltham

After a pause in construction, the 10 Chelmsford Housing Partnership (CHP) dwellings in Blossom Way are complete and the new residents have moved in. I am sure you will join with me in welcoming our new neighbours. Half of the dwellings were designated for those on the Housing Register who also had a local connection to Great Waltham (i.e., live in the parish, have relatives or work there). The plan was to have an opening ceremony in April with an invitation for anyone from the local area to come and have a tour of the site, but that plan got waylaid by Covid-19. The opening ceremony would have included 8 year old Zoe Hunter (pictured) from Cherry Garden Road, who suggested the name "Blossom Way".

The site originally belonged to City Council and was sold to CHP. CHP have generously built a car park of 14 spaces and are handing them over to the Parish Council. These will be operated as a public car park for anyone to use, but a condition of the sale was that four of the spaces must be reserved for use by the Scout Group (the 4 nearest the hut). It is a legal requirement that cars are taxed and roadworthy (and does not include commercial vehicles). It would be appreciated if people could stay off the newly seeded areas until the grass is well established.

CHP would like to thank the local community for their understanding for any disruption and continued support throughout the development. Mike Steel. City Cllr

From the Vicarage July 2020

After many weeks of Lockdown we are slowly being given more freedom; we're not out of the woods yet but thankfully there are positive signs that enable us to step out into a 'new normal'. As we begin this journey, able to do some of the things we took for granted before, I think each one of us will discover that the Covid-19 Virus has changed us in some way. Some have tragically lost loved ones through this time, some have lost jobs and incomes, some have been furloughed whilst others have been working harder than ever. Some have lost precious milestone events, celebrations, baptisms and weddings have had to be re-scheduled. End of year proms, exams, holidays and a whole host of other things precious to us have been lost too like hugging our loved ones... and that will



have taken its toll on us all. But in the midst of Lockdown some may have found some positives too. Many of us have gained a new appreciation for the countryside around us; spent more time in the home; noticed nature and wildlife in a way we'd not noticed before. Changes to Essex County Council Services in response to easing of lockdown

- 1. The County Council has been allocated £57 million funding for track and trace support which will develop outbreak control plans, working with local hospital trusts and other partners. This provision is additional to the national activity and is specifically to respond to identifying and containing potential outbreaks in, for example, workplaces, housing complexes, care homes and schools. https://www.essex.gov.uk/news/essex-county-council-underlines-importance-of-social-distancing-and-regular


Annual Report - 2019/2020


The 2019/2020 Parish Annual Assembly was planned for 1st June 2020. However, it has been suspended under the Coronavirus Act 2020 regulation 3. Normally, we produce a 4 page report which goes to every household in the Parish. This year we have decided to produce a short report and include it in the Parish News. - Chairman of the Parish Council, Mike Steel

Financial Information

GWPC gets income from several sources, with the main one being the precept. The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge on new dwellings for which GWPC gets 15%, but it must be spent on capital projects. In 2019/20, GWPC spent less than its total income which meant it was able to carry forward a larger amount for reserves and future capital projects. However, we increased our services to the community, including making 9 public car parking spaces available in GW, by renting them from GWVH. (note - we are also negotiating, with CHP, to take over the newly built car park in Blossom Way, which will provide a further 14). We also moved office from the Old Fire Station to the Village Hall. Whilst it incurred some one-off expenses, in the actual move (exit fees and new decorations), the ongoing saving will be over £5,000 pa. In addition, GWVH will get the benefit of additional income. We awarded over £4,500 in grants to the British Legion and Ford End Village Hall for improvements to their premises..

£51,586 was carried forward into 2020/21 which comprised £17, 214 of general reserve and £34,372 of CIL/Capital Works, allocated to projects which include the refurbishment of GW Changing Rooms, new playground facilities, and a contribution to speed cameras in Ford End (the latter subject to grant funding from other sources)

19th May: Update on City Council services (previously reported that all services are being delivered, some with modifications)

- Hylands House Car Park is now open, but play areas are still closed. City Council have handed out 95% of £31m business grants (leisure, hospitality, retail). City Council continues to work with CVS to manage the Chelmsford Hub distributing food parcels, etc to Cat A, Cat B shielded people and other direct enquiries and referrals from EWS. With local groups, Hub (CVS + CCC), EWS and Goodsamapp, the volunteer numbers significantly outweigh the requirements. Recycling centres across Essex are opening. Queues are likely, and use is limited. Country Parks are open with limited parking due to distancing restriction. Sheepcotes roundabout works complete.

The Parish Council considered a request from a resident for a weight restriction through Broads Green. Such applications have failed previously and the PC considered whether an "unsuitable for large vehicles" might have more chance of success. 2 Cllrs agreed to carry out a volume survey to gauge the actual usage by HGVs.

The results of a consultation with Ford End residents (12 attended) resulted in a conclusion that a more modest project for a woodland at the lower end of the Recreation ground would be preferred. To be followed up with a new design.

The VE committee reported that they had cancelled all events but promoted self-isolation own garden parties. The nationwide celebrations will be moved to August (VJ Day and end of WW2). It was agreed to transfer the approved £150 PC contribution to VJ day.

Normally the May meeting is the Annual Meeting when the Chair and other roles are elected. These were suspended under the Coronavirus Act 2020 Regulation 4, and the current members will continue until next May.

15th June: The City Cllr reported that the Chelmsford Local Plan was adopted on Wednesday 27 May. Public consultation on Warren Farm, will go on until Friday 3 July 2020.

The Parish Council considered complaints about Blossom Way lighting. Meeting to be arranged on site with CHP and also discussed with City Council light pollution team. It was agreed to request that the Local Highways Panel consider options for improving the steep slope at the end of Cherry garden Road.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held Monday 17th August 2020. Likely that this will be an online meeting. The Public and Press are welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting and will include joining instructions (or contact the Clerk).
