Little Waltham and Great Notley Patients Participation Group(PPG)





From the County Council



Stop.Swap.Go!

According to the Essex Climate Action Commission a third of greenhouse gases in Essex come from transport and without action to reduce the County's carbon emissions, temperatures are set to rise to catastrophic levels in just 25 years. The impact of such climate change in Essex would lead to water shortages, more flooding and the degradation of agricultural land.

Essex County Council's Stop.Swap.Go! campaign aims to encourage a change in long term travel habits towards walking, cycling and using the bus. To meet the need to continue social distancing,

Stop.Swap.Go have created a suite of online information to support parents and young people as they journey to school and college.

The <u>ECC</u> Website https://www.stopswapgo.co.uk/ has a great deal of information to help families avoid traffic congestion and pollution by walking, cycling or even "scooting" to school, with helpful routes outlined for each school and 'Drive and Drop' zones highlighted to reduce congestion at the school gates. There are also updates for families using school transport provided by the Council.

While buses are still running, there'll be a continued need to socially distance on them, so buses will be running at reduced capacity. To avoid long queues at the bus stop, plan your journey early – you may also be surprised how quick it can be to walk or cycle to school instead.

Green Homes Grants

Homeowners in England can apply for a voucher towards the cost of installing energy efficient and low-carbon heating improvements to homes, which could help save up to £600 a year on energy bills. The government will provide a voucher that covers up to two thirds of the cost of qualifying improvements to your home. The maximum value of the voucher is £5,000. You may be able to receive a higher level of subsidy if you are a homeowner and either you or a member of your household receives one of the qualifying means-tested benefits, covering 100% of the cost of the improvements. The maximum value of these vouchers is £10,000.

Local Authorities will also be making support available for low income households in their local area through the Green Homes Grant: Local Authority Delivery. More information will be available on: https://www.simpleenergyadvice.org.uk/pages/green-homes-grant





We look forward to the school year 2020-21 – something that feels especially welcome given the very difficult second half of the academic year 2019-20, where, sadly, many of our children missed 14 weeks of school – nearly 40% of the school year! It was great to see young smiling faces again as school re opened. I am sure that is a feeling echoed across the land. The majority of schools opened their gates to pupils on 3rd September - it was both an important and

enjoyable day.

Update from your City Councillor

The 4 Leisure Centres opened Monday 27th July, with special hygiene measures in place. You need to book in advance for gym use and swimming, so need to have an OurChelmsford card. As a regular gym users, I was back in the gym on the first day and I was impressed by the cleaning and distancing regime. Having to book in advance is very easy and most of the time I can get the next session,

Ford End traffic

The 40mph zone at the Southern end of the village has been in place for several years and I have been pushing for similar at the Northern end. This has been on hold pending traffic surveys at both ends which will judge the impact of the 40mph buffer at the Southern end and asses the degree of the problem at the Northern end. The traffic surveys were delayed because of the reduced traffic levels during the peak of Covid, but with traffic levels approaching pre-Covid levels, the surveys can now go ahead.

Pavement Parking

I have received a few comments about pavement parking. The Government is currently running a consultation to tackle this at a local authority or national level. 3 options are being proposed:

- 1. Improving the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) process, under which local authorities can already prohibit pavement parking.
- 2. A legislative change to allow local authorities with civil parking enforcement powers to enforce against 'unnecessary obstruction of the pavement'.
- 3. A legislative change to introduce a London-style pavement parking prohibition throughout England.

Annual General Meeting 2020

So many aspects of our lives have been disrupted as a consequence of COVID-19. Sadly the AGM of the Friends' Trust cannot take place as its venue would become a place of assembly thus banned by Government's directive. As a consequence, trustees have decided the most appropriate alternative would be to make a written presentation of the chairman's report as agreed by the trustees with reference to the accounts as produced below. Hopefully you will accept that trustees have fulfilled their objective of public accountability by this means. Minutes and matters arising will be considered by the Trustees at the first appropriate date following the Government's withdrawal of the restrictions imposed as a result of the pandemic.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 March 2020 The objectives of the trust are to raise and hold funds and to make grants for the preservation, repair, maintenance, restoration, improvement, beautification and extension of the churches and of the monuments, fittings, fixtures, stained glass and furniture in the churches and churchyards.

Donations and tax recovered during the year amounted to £1,330. The net profit of various fundraising activities was £272 and the net investment income for the year was £984. Total income for the years therefore amounted to £2,586 net.

As regards grants made to the churches, Great Waltham was awarded a grant of £7,453 for new guttering and £871 for the purchase of a robust safe.

Our independent examiner has analysed our accounts and declares our accounting records accord with the legal accounting practices. The annual report and Accounts were agreed by the meeting.

Progress is being made as regards increasing the Trust's publicity and the need for a colour brochure and display in the churches. Michael Proctor agreed to look at this along with Roger Bearman. There continues to be a need for new members to join the Fundraising Committee. Anyone interested to contact the Chairman of that committee, Michael Proctor on 01245 360483.

The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel – Chair) of the Parish Council Meetings of **17th August 2020.** The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website

The County Cllr stated that he had arranged a Broads Green traffic survey to log speeds and type of traffic following complaints of HGVs using the route.

The City Cllr outlined that Government has published its white paper on the future of the planning system - to streamline and modernise the planning process, bring a new focus to design and sustainability, improve the system of developer contributions to infrastructure, and ensure more land is available for development where it is needed. People may respond by going to

https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/planning-for-the-future. It is unclear how this will affect Chelmsford, especially as they have just adopted a local plan.

City Council have started an informal consultation on parish Councils closing 25th Sept — covering current boundaries and possibility of central Chelmsford parishes.

Following a public consultation and a revised plan, the PC agreed to proceed with the proposal to implement a tree planting and a woodland walk in the Ford End Recreation Ground. City Council will fund the trees, fence and planting. GWPC need to maintain the area including keeping the water buckets topped up.

The PC considered complaints from the public in relation to cars blocking the pavement on Chelmsford Road. The PC will approach the Landlord of the pub to discuss options to alleviate the issue. (See page 7 for update)

The PC considered a request from a member of the public to extend the double yellow lines on South Street slightly beyond the point where the road starts to widens and agreed to make the request to South Essex Parking Partnerships.

The PC agreed to the proposal from GW Village Hall to jointly fund a larger collection of general waste and Dry Mixed Recycling.

The October litter picks are planned to go ahead adhering to social distancing rules. Each Village or Hamlet will coordinate its own litter pick and where any equipment is shared it will be disinfected or new. Please see notice.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held 19:00 Monday 19th October 2020, with joining details included in the agenda, which will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
