## From the Vicarage

## Christmas in a pandemic

Despite what you might have heard, Christmas has not been cancelled! Whether or not we are able to gather for worship, Christians all over the world will celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, God with us.

The Advent themes of darkness and light seem especially relevant this year. 2020 has felt like a journey through the dark, with us fumbling our way along an unmapped road. We will all have had moments of anxiety and uncertainty. Some will have felt loneliness, fear and sorrow, or experienced illness and loss.

But despite all difficulties, there have been moments of light in the darkness. In our pared down lives many of us have become more aware of what is really important to us. We found a sense of togetherness, even when we have had to be apart.

The Christmas Gospel (John 1:5) tells us 'the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it'. Jesus comes as the light of the world. We don't know the date Jesus was born but it seems appropriate that we celebrate Christmas when the weather is coldest and nights are longest.

By a cosmic coincidence, on the longest night of this year, 21 December, there will be a rare event between Jupiter and Saturn - their closest conjunction since 1623. The two heavenly lights will almost converge, becoming a single bright light. The 'star' the Magi followed to Bethlehem might have been a similar planetary conjunction.

When you look up at the night sky on 21 December, the light from Jupiter will have taken about 50 minutes to reach you, and the light from Saturn about 85 minutes. The Andromeda galaxy, the furthest object visible with the naked eye, is 2.5 million light years distant. Celestial distances are mind-boggling. But the light of the stars still reaches us, bringing hope and joy to those who look up.

We may be socially distanced, but God is with us.

Why not put a Christmas star in your window during December? It may remind you that God is with us even in this difficult time – the light shining in the darkness.





## **Exciting Changes at Ford End CE VC School**



The term has started well at Ford End Primary School. We have had a good attendance from all our families in often difficult and challenging circumstances. School is different and presents its own set of problems in trying to keep children in their 'bubbles' whilst keeping school as normal as possible. As always, the staff have been brilliant in supporting our children and their families.

On December 1<sup>st</sup>, Ford End Primary School will become a member of the Life Education Trust (LIFE). After researching many multi academy trusts (MATs) and the possibility of federating with other schools, we realised that LIFE matched the ethos and values that we hold so dear. With a reduction in funding for small schools coming into force in 2022, we realised we could not continue to stay as we were and would need the support of either another school or a MAT. After meeting with Julian Dutnall, LIFE CEO, it was agreed by staff, governors and our school community, that LIFE was the way forward.

LIFE believes that 'Learning is for Everyone', and through the breadth of specialist services and education expertise, offers high academic achievement and outstanding leadership support. Ford End will become the 7<sup>th</sup> school in the Trust.

The values of the Trust are strong and are evident in all their schools and these are:- **Courageous Optimism**, **Boundless Creativity** and **Heartfelt Compassion**.

Every member of the LIFE community is encouraged to champion a can-do attitude, stimulate innovative thinking and embrace difference and

individuality. LIFE is devoted to supporting whole schools, from the pupils to the Headteacher and wants to empower school leadership teams and teachers to enhance the quality of education for their pupils.

The Trust has a broadly Christian ethos but recognises and welcomes those of any faith and none.



## News from Great Waltham C of E VC Primary School

The children have returned to school after half term at the same time the second lockdown was implemented. Thankfully, schools remain open this time. Sadly, we are seeing cases in local schools. One Chelmsford Primary School recently shut entirely due to multiple cases.

Collective Worship has focused on the British Values, Strength, The Bible, Symbols - always lovely to share with the children. Each class is able to attend these whole school assemblies via a video link.

In class, EYFS have settled brilliantly and are really enjoying playing and learning. Their current topic is



Celebrations and they made lanterns to learn about Diwali. KS1 children are learning about Special People, with a focus on Florence Nightingale - quite apt that they are learning about nursing in the current climate.

KS2 pupils' topic is the Ancient Greeks, where they have learned about Gods and Goddesses, the difference between Sparta and Athens and made Greek pots to name three activities they have participated in. Y6 are enjoying learning about the human circulatory system in science.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the autumn term would normally see the children prepare to share Christmas with the community - including the nativity play at church, helping with the Community Network Christmas Concert, our Carol Service at church and the Christingle Service. Sadly, due to obvious restrictions these events cannot take place. The classes, however, are planning on re-telling the Christmas Story and sharing these via a video link. We will have a Christmas Service in classes via our Google Classroom video link. Christmas dinner this year will be in 6 sittings!

The children enjoyed Careers' Week at school, the original plan was to invite adults in to talk about their careers. Thankfully, brave parents recorded videos to share with the children, including nursing and banking.

As we move towards December, we will run Enterprise Week - each class will be given £1.50 per pupil and the class' challenge is to make Christmas decorations ready to sell so that the children learn about planning, production, sales etc. They hope to make a profit to spend on classroom resources! Take care all.

## **Update on Ford End Recreation Ground**

Following a period of public consultation, the work has now commenced with regard to the tree planting at the Ford End Recreation Ground. Unfortunately, due to the second national lockdown, the date for the tree planting has had to be rescheduled to February 8th. This date is obviously subject to further change.

The Parish Council will be publishing information on how local residents can get involved with the planting nearer the time. Social distancing measures will need to be in place which means we will be looking for volunteers to commit to a set period of time and work in small manageable groups. The Parish Council are working with Chelmsford City Council and will provide further details for how residents can register to take part.

For the time being, the area which has been designated for trees has been treated in order for the grass to be killed off ready for planting in the new year. The treatment used was animal and wildlife friendly.

There's 'a lot' to be said for having an allotment and we are pleased to say our Parish allotments are 'growing' with newcomers.

This year has seen a significant increase in plot uptake on both sites and there's room for more. The allotments are provided by the Parish Council with sites at Brookmead (behind the shop) and Bury Lane. The rent is very reasonable and the Brookmead site also has the 'hut' for purchasing supplies (managed by GW Hort Soc).

We have welcomed complete newbies, experienced growers, gardeners and a plethora of ages. Newcomer Kyria, 23, says: "I'd always loved the idea of an allotment and lockdown gave me the opportunity to explore growing all the things I have, but also gave me a place to be with my own thoughts and learn about the incredible world we live in through watching everything grow."

It has been great to see villagers who may never have crossed paths before do so. Our allotments were and are a safe place to be and we share knowledge, ideas and produce too.

Renting an allotment plot has so many benefits, mentally, physically and socially. It doesn't have to be a seasonal hobby either, Autumn activity is taking place with garlic, onions and broad beans being planted and sown, and beds prepared for springtime too.

The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel – Chair) of the Parish Council Meetings of **19th October and 16<sup>th</sup> Nov 2020.** The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website <a href="https://e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish/">https://e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish/</a>

**19th Oct -** The ECC Cllr explained the move to Covid Tier 2 – least economic damaging actions whilst aiming to get R below 1. The City Cllr stated that he was trying to get the police to be more definitive on what residents can do to report Anti-Social Behaviour so that the police will take action.

The PC is unaware of the view of CGR residents on its green spaces and their use for car parking. The area is owned by City Council and the PC could only lobby for its preferred position. It was agreed that a door-to-door survey would be conducted when Covid regulations allowed.

Remembrance Sunday – Covid restrictions require that this is run by the Local Authority. The PC are keen to organise a "Covid compliant" event at the GW war memorial on the basis that it is invitation only and undertakes the required Govt risk assessment. (this was subsequently cancelled because of the new lockdown)

Signposts that point motorists to M11/Stansted from Sheepscote roundabout via the A130 were put in by the LHP some years ago. These were removed in recent upgrade thus diluting an initiative to point M11 traffic to bypass Ford End. The PC resolved to write to the ECC Cabinet Member to ask that the signs be reinstated.

The FE Cllrs had consulted with residents and agreed to create a Carbon neutral woodland walk scheme on the recreation ground. Planting date 27th November. The event is being advertised for volunteers. Whips – 600 to 700 would be provide by City Council along with planting resource. It was also thought that more mature trees would be provided but the PC would need to purchase these at £150 per tree (including maintenance). The will purchase such additional trees. Note – the area will be fenced (as part of the contribution form City Council) to restrict wildlife damage to the trees but is still open to the public.

**16**<sup>th</sup> **Nov –** Cllr Bloomfield offered her resignation as she is moving out of the area. The PC gave a vote of thanks for her service.

The ECC Cllr stated that the traffic surveys that had been done at Ford End would be repeated further out at the Northern end. Footpath 88 would have signs installed, but the use by horses is a trespass issue and the PC would pass onto the landowner. The City Cllr reported on Anti-Social Behaviour in GW – call being set up with CHP, City Council ASB & Police to determine what more can be done to address frequent incidents. City Council Covid-19 - essential services continue to operate. Children's play areas remain open. Cafés in parks remain open for takeaway. CVS support will continue and there are five foodbanks in operation in the Chelmsford area.

Further meeting with residents taken place on the Ford End woodland walk and the scheme will still go ahead. Planting is delayed until 8th Feb due to Covid-19 restrictions.

The 21/22 budget of £53,180.40 was agreed representing a 6% increase. The impact on individual council rates depends on the taxation basis (current number of dwellings). The Reserves are allocated to specific projects except for a £17,000 General Reserve retained to cover unexpected costs.

The GW MUGA will proceed following a 50% CIF grant. Also a new set of junior goals will be installed with sufficient sockets to enable the goal posts to be moved to avoid wear patterns. The next phase of the improvements to the Changing Rooms (henceforth to be called the "Pavilion") was approved comprising a single accessible toilet, a kitchen area and a large single open space.

Review of the data supplied by Highways did not show a speed problem through Broads Green but did determine that the HGV volumes were around 1% and the LGV/MGV around 11%. The survey is not able to determine whether this is traffic traversing the hamlet, or accessing it. On the basis of these volumes it is highly unlikely that a weight restriction will be granted but we may be able to get "Unsuitable for Large Vehicles" signs.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held in **February 2021 date TBD**, details on the agenda, which will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
