The May meeting of the Little Waltham Gardening Club was a talk by Margot Cooper concerning Food & Flower Customs around the world. Margot is a very well travelled lady, having flown to the States when just a young woman. The following is a summary extract of the meeting of 24th April 2017. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website <a href="www.greatwaltham.org.uk">www.greatwaltham.org.uk</a>. The Chair of the Parish Council, Mike Steel, presided over the meeting, which was held at Ford End Village Hall.

Ford End residents attended to hear that the 2 schemes were in "validation" with ECC Highways but there was some doubt about the need for both 40mph zones and the refuge crossing would be prohibitively expensive as it would require land purchase. ECC Cllr Aldridge said that he was awaiting a formal response for non-mandatory 20mph past the school. The residents proposed that the PC hire an independent highways consultant to challenge ECC on these and the lack of future improvements. The PC will investigate this possibility.

A letter from Springfield Planning and Development dated the 6th April 2017 was read out in full, proposing a housing development scheme, at King's Farm in Ford End, including suggestions for additional facilities like a new Village Hall, shop, play facilities and allotments (the full letter is included in the minutes). Local residents contended some of the claims in the letter. After consultation with members of the Ford End VDS at the meeting, the Parish Council stated that they do not support the proposed development.

The adopted phone boxes are in need of painting and volunteers are required. Cllrs Johnson and Huggins volunteered to do the one in GW one and a member of the public has volunteered for Howe Street.

The PC declined the webmaster's offer to continue to run the Parish website for a monthly fee and the PC decided to call for a new volunteer.

The controller of Parish Watch reported that the flow of information had dropped off and he wants to pass on to a new volunteer.

The proposal to add further bollards around the green at Broads Green was rejected because of the cost of £920 and the perceived reduction of the lack of benefit with them as Highways require them to be at least 0.5 m from the road.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held at the Parish Office, **Monday 19**<sup>th</sup> **June** commencing at 7.45pm; the Public and Press are welcome to attend. The agenda will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
