There was a touching tribute to the late Captain Sir Tom Moore on Great Waltham Royal British Legion's noticeboard, after the Army veteran who raised almost £33 million for NHS charities died in early February.

Meanwhile, the Legion's Poppy Appeal collection for 2020 in the Parish amounted to £2,424.69. This includes £974.48 collected in Pleshey. The sum

was made up from static point collections, sale of wreaths and donations. The total is less than last year as, due to the pandemic, there were no house-to-house collections.

However, considering the difficult times, it is felt that this is an excellent result. The Branch Committee would like to thank everyone who helped them to achieve it.

Important notice from Little Waltham

and Great Notley Patients' Participation Group

The aims of the Patient Participation Group: "To work with their practice to provide practical support, to help patients take more responsibility for their own health and to provide strategic input and advice. PPGs are based on co-operation between the practice staff and patients."

Purpose of a PPG

- To give practice staff and patients the opportunity to discuss topics of mutual interest in their own practice.
- A forum for patients and staff to improve and develop services within the practice by co-production.
- To provide an opportunity for patients to make positive and constructive suggestions/ideas about the practice and specific medical conditions as an 'expert' or 'experienced patient'.
- To encourage health education activities within the practice.
- To involve further patients from the wider population.
- To involve patient participation in future commissioning of Health Provision.

Benefits for the patient:

- Patients will be more responsible for their own health.
- Patients will have a better understanding and knowledge of the practice and its staff.

This allows up-to-date information to be given to patients and will inform what decisions can be influenced and what cannot. It will also allow the practice staff to gain an understanding from the patient's perspective. It may also be useful for the chair to have meetings with the Practice Manager on a regular basis or attend management meetings of the practice. This ensures that two-way communications are achieved.

- Patients will have a forum to suggest positive ideas and voice concerns
- Patients will benefit from improved communications between patients and staff





News from Great Waltham C of E VC Primary School


We are half-way through the school year and this past half-term has seen the vast majority of our pupils learning at home. Schools were already experienced in the implementation of 'Remote Education' as it was used during the first lockdown in March 2020. The main difference this time for most schools was the roll out of 'live' lessons. The Great Waltham Primary School teaching staff have quickly embraced this new way of teaching, even if they were a little camera shy to begin with!

Throughout January and February the children have received a mixture of live and pre-recorded lessons to supplement the daily learning assignments sent home via our digital platform 'The Google Classroom'. The children have enjoyed uploading their work, sending messages via the class stream and being able to see their classmates



The recent snow did cause some safe transport issues for school staff but, with pupil numbers in school being less 20% of the number on roll, we were able to ensure we stayed open for children of critical workers. I think we can all agree the snow was a welcome sight for our children, adding something fun to the days that have been challenging for all.





We are hoping to see all the children back in school in March and the subsequent return to 'normality'. We can then share some school events with the Parish News readers – we hope you are all keeping safe.

Latest Covid-19 data for Essex shows continued decline in rates

The latest Covid-19 data for Essex shows a continued decline in rates across all districts, although with the average case rate for the county currently 112.7 per 100,000, it remains high.

Covid-19 data for Essex (excluding Southend and Thurrock) is published online here: https://www.essex.gov.uk/local-outbreak-control-plan

Media outlets are encouraged to use this latest data to ensure the most up-to-date and complete figures are shared with Essex residents.

Cases and rates

- In the seven days up 11 February 2021, there were 1,679 confirmed cases of Covid-19 in Essex. This is the latest date for which complete data is available.
- Up to 11 February 2021, the weekly case rate for Essex is 112.7. This is the latest date for which complete data is available.
- Up to 11 February 2021, the highest weekly case rates were in Harlow and Tendring, with rates of 153.8 and 182.8, respectively.
- Up to 11 February 2021, the area with the lowest weekly case rate is Brentwood, with a rate of 81.8.

Cllr John Spence, Essex County Council Cabinet Member for Adults and Health, said: "A continued decline in case rates is of course welcome news, but the rates for Essex are still high. The worst thing we could do now is assume the pandemic is over and undermine all of the hard work it's taken to get us to this point.

"We recognise the impact that the pandemic has affected people in lots of different ways and that people are eager to get back to some kind of normality. The quickest way we will get there is by continuing to follow the guidance.

"I would also urge individuals who are not showing Covid-19 symptoms – especially those who are unable to work from home - to book a rapid test as soon as possible to prevent anyone from unknowingly spreading the virus. This is now easier than ever thanks to a new walk-in option for appointments at our rapid test centres."



Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic

At the time of writing Essex, like the rest of the UK, remains in lockdown and even the most optimistic forecast suggests that there will be no change in this situation until sometime in March, at the earliest. This year and throughout the last, the County Council has sought to manage much of the impact that the pandemic has had on all our residents. This has meant direct involvement from sourcing PPE for care homes and hospitals to the provision of funding for food banks and the provision of meals (vouchers) for vunerable children and families.

Council funding has been supplemented by £157million from Central Government to support care homes and care services as well



as businesses and bus services, including "home to school" transport. I am circulating weekly data updates to Parish Councils, City Councillors and other community organisations in the Broomfield & Writtle Division. However, if you wish to view this data and for more information relating to getting tested, support for residents and businesses and what rules apply for "staying at home" please see https://www.essex.gov.uk/topic/coronavirus

From early January, vaccination centres were set up in our area at Broomfield Hospital and Melbourne Medical Centre and more recently the City Racecourse was opened. The initial tranche of 15 million of the elderly, vulnerable and key workers have received their first vaccination and progress is being made to roll out the programme to the other vulnerable people and those over 60.

REMEMBER: -

- The NHS will contact you when it is your turn to have the vaccine, so please do not contact the NHS or your surgery beforehand.
- Please act on your invitation when it comes, and please do make sure you attend your appointment.

Whether you have been vaccinated or not, it remains important that every one of us should observe the "lockdown" rules and be safe to yourself and others by maintaining social distancing at all times, wearing a mask when with others whilst shopping or going to work and wash your hands as often as possible.

Laptops for Schools

In my last newsletter, I advised that the Council had introduced a scheme to provide students with laptops for home working online. To date, together with 2,000 funded by Central Government, 5,000 laptops have been delivered to schools across the County and 251 of these were in the Chelmsford area. You can still donate an old or unused laptop. All laptops will receive a thorough clean inside and out with all data and programmes removed securely before re-issue. No data on the device will be accessed during this process.

County Council Elections ~ Applying for a Postal Vote



The current plan is that the Essex County Council elections will occur on 6th May 2021 (along with the election of the Police, Fire, and Crime Commissioner for Essex). You might want to consider casting your vote by post, given the Covid situation. To do so, you need to download a postal vote application form from the City Council website, fill it in sign it and then either scan and upload it, or post it to Electoral Services, Civic Centre, Duke Street, Chelmsford, Essex, CM1 1JE (by 19th April)

The following is a summary extract (by Mike Steel - Chair) of the Parish Council Meetings of 15th Feb 2021. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council Notice boards and at the Parish Website https://e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish/

The PC agreed to co-opt new member Cllr H Micklem and welcomed him. The ECC Cllr report included an update on the Army and Navy options (2-way flyover ruled out), 5,000 laptops given to schools, e-Scooter trial in Chelmsford, additional Locality fund grant to GWPC for pavilion refurbishment, and a positive GWPC meeting with Highways Cabinet member on the subject of FE Average Speed cameras proposal.

The planned litter picks for March to go ahead as normal in Howe Street, Ford End, North End. Great Waltham to investigate whether it might be appropriate to align with "Keep Britain Tidy" initiatives and also check with volunteers who go out monthly.

It was reported that, following a request by the City Cllr, the disused oil tank and building, in GW has been inspected and made safe. This included strengthening the boarding over the access and making sure any mains connections are safe.

The PC agreed allotment rates at £3.75 per rod plus a fixed service charge of £3.20 per plot pa (£3.75 plus £4.40 from Sept 2021). This still means subsidising the allotments, which was confirmed as a matter of policy. The next Parish Council meeting will be held **7pm Monday 15th March 2021**, details on the agenda, which will be published on the Parish website and notice boards before the meeting.
