From the Vicarage EARWORMS, DREAMS AND PROMISES

Do you ever wake up in the morning with a song in your head that you then can't get rid of for the rest of the day? I do too, and when that happens, I like to ponder on why that song in that moment? Perhaps our mood or events going on in our lives 'earworm' influence songs, our subconsciously we are trying to work something out in our lives? My dreams too can shine a light on what may be bothering me, needs attention or is out of kilter in my life.

Less frequently, but more significantly, I might have a bible passage on my mind, one that then stays with me for weeks and then seems to crop up in conversations or books I am reading. Similarly, I have learnt to pay attention whenever this happens, because God is usually speaking to me through these 'earworm' bible verses.

This is the passage that has been cropping up for me since the start of 2022;

So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. (Isaiah 41 verse 10)

Each generation that has gone before us has welcomed new life, enjoyed abundance, experienced joy yet has also known grief, endured difficulty and at times felt immense sorrow. Being human means we will all experience these things in our lifetime. We enjoy the good times but when more challenging seasons roll in, we can become despondent, or even really fearful of the future or feel overwhelmed.

This short passage invites us, whatever hardships the world may be experiencing, to dare to dream of a brighter future, filled with possibility and hope. The whole world has suffered a common grief in varying degree, with some feeling that grief harder and much more directly and personally than others. The pain is real. We are living through extraordinary times, which will go down in history and be read about by those who follow us into this beautiful, sometimes terrible, world. There has been much sorrow and selfish behaviour, but we need to remember that there has also been much generosity, selflessness and kindness.


I am certainly not naïve about the challenges we face this year, both as individuals, as church, and as community - and yet these words from the the prophet Isaiah are a comfort and just the encouragement we need in such a time as this.

So, whatever is going on in your life right now, why not slowly read those words again and allow their promise to sink into your heart, and look forward to how the Lord will bless us - and others through us - in the months and years to come.

Here we go again!



On Saturday 15th Jan, residents of North End and Onslow Green woke up to discover that they had no phone lines and no internet! This situation was made much worse by the fact that our mobile phone reception varies from very poor to non-existent! Reporting a fault is no mean feat these days as customers are advised to go online – How? The providers insist that you must be at home when reporting the fault so they can run line checks etc. although most people have no means of accessing the internet, even on a mobile phone, without standing in the garden or walking further down the road until you get a signal! Even the suppose voice phone numbers to report a fault rapidly revert to a text system, thus excluding anyone without the skills to operate it.

The reason for the problems soon became clear; around midnight on Friday, someone had driven so hard and fast down Mill Road from Felsted that they failed to make the sharp bend at Absol Bridge and cannoned into the telegraph pole so hard that it split in half and snapped the phone and fibre cables! (See photo). By morning, there was no sign of the driver and most of the vehicle, but there was a very large dent in the base of the pole whilst the rest of the pole was folded in half, leaving broken cables decorating the

verge. Even the BT engineer who came out said that he had never seen a pole quite like that before – and it is quite a new pole because something very similar happened about five years ago.

With kind permission from the Marriage family, a temporary repair across the field gateway was made on Sunday, resulting in some residents being in the unusual situation of having superfast broadband but no phone. The copper phone cables were reconnected on Monday; but this is all temporary and, at some stage, it will be necessary to close the road, fit a new telegraph pole and make a permanent reconnection.


This is the point at which it all went wrong the last time this happened for although most people were reconnected, they were not connected to the correct numbers! For several weeks whilst BT Openreach tried to sort out the mess, people were taking messages for their neighbours, someone was even taking orders for a local business and relaying them via mobile phones! We are hoping for better luck this time......





We ended the autumn term with many staff and pupils off school due to Covid 19. Thankfully, we have seen an improvement post-Christmas and attendance is on the rise

The children are excited to be learning new topics.
