# New on-demand electric minibus service for residents in the Braintree and Chelmsford area



Residents in south Braintree and north-west Chelmsford areas can now access an exciting on-demand, fully electric minibus service called DigiGo. One of the first of its kind in the country, the service responds to demand rather than having set routes, with minibuses able to divert on and off journeys for passenger collection and drop off.

DigiGo connects rural communities in north Chelmsford, including Felsted, Little Dunmow, Barnston, Leaden Roding, Good Easter, Pleshey, Great Waltham, Little Waltham and Great Leighs to popular locations such as Chelmer Valley Park and Ride, Broomfield Hospital, and Writtle University College.

Meanwhile, the service in south Braintree connects villages, including Great Notley, Black Notley and Rayne, to Braintree Bus Interchange, Braintree Railway Station, Braintree Community Hospital, Springwood Industrial Estate, Great Notley Country Park and many other locations.

The new service operates seven days a week, from 7am to 10pm and caters for everyone; students, families, the elderly, and people travelling to work, with accessible minibuses available for people with disabilities, providing a flexible and environmentally friendly service for people who do not live close to public transport routes.

To book an on-demand journey, residents can download the TravelEssex planning app via their phone's app store or visit <a href="www.digigo.uk">www.digigo.uk</a>. After ordering, passengers can pay for their journey via the app and track the location of their minibus in real time. Tickets for the service can also be pre-booked up to seven days in advance. #### A message

May this year is not quite such a busy month as usual in the Church calendar. Because Easter fell late we will be in the Easter season for most of the month with Ascension Day falling at the back of May on Thursday 26th, 40 days after Easter Sunday. Then comes period of change uncertainty, excitement, anxiety and reflection in June Pentecost and Trinity Sunday quickly follows. In fact, a very appropriate time of year for our Churches to be in vacancy.

During the Easter season we celebrate Christ's return from the dead, but for the first disciples I have the impression that the resurrection was a bit of a rollercoaster experience - yes, they rejoiced to see Jesus again, but he came and unexpectedly, they never knew when or if they would see him again. And Jesus hadn't come back in power, so was this 'the day of the Lord'? What were they supposed to do now?

And then he tells them he's leaving for good, at the Ascension and we see that they have been learning and growing quite a bit. Instead of hiding in a locked room in fear, they gather in prayer and expectation, waiting as Jesus has told them to for what is to happen next - waiting for that coming of the Spirit which we celebrate at Pentecost and then go out and take the GOOD NEWS to the world.

Are we feeling a bit like those disciples after the resurrection change. uncertainty. anxiety. Our world has been turned upside down, another huge jolt just as we have been recovering from the years of the pandemic. How are we to handle it? We can follow the disciples waiting and praying but at the same time be ready to act to support one another, reflecting in the pastoral care we can provide for our community. Keep a watch out for the vulnerable and be ready to help.

We are all in this together -God Bless







# Are you ready for RideLondon?- Friday 27 to Sunday 29 May

On the 28th and 29th May 2022, RideLondon event will come through Howe Street. Great Waltham and Breeds Road.. The professional women's cycle race on the 28th will mean short road closures of around 3/4 an hour, but the amateur event on the 29th, will mean longer closures of up to 8 hours. The 29th event will comprise 25,000 cyclists, setting off in stages from London, for a 100 mile round trip. By the time they pass through here, which is 3/4 along the way, the cyclists will be spread out over an 8 hour period! These roads will be closed to all vehicles from approx. 7.30am to around 3.30pm. The children have returned after a two-week Easter break with much to look forward to in the summer term – trips, class assemblies, sports day to name just three!

Tha following is a summary extract by Peter Jackson (chair) of the Parish Council meeting of March 21st. The full and approved minutes are published on the Parish Council notice boards and at the parish website.

Because a previous resolution to cease service and repairs of the mower kept at Brookmead allotment site had not been relayed to the plotholders it was agreed to continue this service for one more year and to inform the plot holders. We have been gradually updating and reformatting parish council policy documents and the process is nearing completion. The reviewed policies will be placed on the PC website.

We will have held our first PC monthly meeting in the refurbished Pavilion by the time you read this summary. In addition to kitchen, toilet and meeting facilities, a hearing loop will be installed in response to a parishioner's suggestion. Good news: quite a large group of volunteers and children from Ford End school met recently at the recreation ground in Ford End to continue work on the trees which were planted last year and to plant wild flowers along the edge of the copse. A lovely morning with a lot achieved.

Bad news: someone uprooted some of the wild flowers within 24 hours. A truly mindless activity. Of course more community minded residents have quickly re planted them

After a long discussion about the proposed extension of the double yellow lines in South Street it was agreed to ask for the tactile dropped kerb to be removed and to ask for the proposed changes (double yellow lines on both sides of the street and a 20m extension on the school side) to be discontinued. Greater use of the public parking spaces in Blossom Way to encouraged.

The presentation by Ride London was less than satisfactory as it failed to treat seriously the legitimate concerns raised by councillors. If you have a business on the route, if you need visits from carers, if you are carers travelling to clients, if you live on the route and need to travel eg for work then you may find difficulty on the day of the event (29th July), as the route will be subject to a road closure for much of the day. Please if you are affected then contact the organisers of Ride London or their partners Essex County Council. The Pc has written a strongly worded letter of concern to the organisation. The event was agreed between ECC and Ride London without consultation with Great Waltham Parish Council and is likely to be repeated annually for about 5 years.
