





## Hiring the Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground

The Parish Council is able to offer for hire the recently refurbished Pavilion at Great Waltham Recreation Ground. The facility is available for small events (up to 30 people) for educational, recreational and leisure purposes. It has the added

> attraction of immediate access to the playing field and children's play area.

> It is a single-level, fully accessible building with a kitchen area for making refreshments and disabled toilet with baby-changing facilities. Tables and chairs are available and can be arranged accordingly to hirers' wishes. Bespoke

requests for other requirements, such as bringing in equipment for an event, will be considered.

Hiring requests from Great Waltham parishioners or groups are given priority, as well as being offered subsidised rates. For local users, prices start at £9.45 for the minimum two hours single session. Discounts are also available for block bookings of four or more separate events

booked at the same time.

#### The Queen's Green Canopy



The photo shows the tree that has been planted on Pump Green at North End as a lasting commemoration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. It is an Acer platanoides Princeton Gold (also known as a Yellow Norway Maple) and will form one small part of the Queen's Green Canopy. It was supplied and planted by Graham Oakley of North End Nursery. Ray Fielding has provided a large deer guard - essential in North End, due to the very large herd of deer that roam the village. We are most grateful to the Parish Council for a grant to fund this purchase. In addition, most of the proceeds from the Village Plant Sale in May were used to purchase an official Queen's Green Canopy plaque which has been beautifully mounted in hardwood by Darren Crabtree. Finally, a neighbour is providing the tree with regular buckets of water (daily at the moment!) to ensure its survival.

In the Autumn, the tree's location will be 'pinned' onto the on-line map showing the official Queen's Green Canopy. Thanks must go to everyone involved in this project.

The following is a summary extract (by Alan Martin – Vice Chair) of the Parish Council meeting of 13<sup>th</sup> June 2022 held in the Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground. The full and approved minutes are published on the Council's notice boards and at the Parish website <a href="https://evoice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish/">https://evoice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish/</a>. Two members of the public attended, one to request the use of the Pavilion for the Great Waltham year 6 leavers event on July 20<sup>th</sup> (which was agreed), the second provided an update on the planting of the North End Jubilee tree – an Acer purchased and donated by the Parish Council.

County Councillor Mike Steel reported that the RideLondon events on the 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> May were well managed although complaints had been received from some residents and businesses. A full review will take place before any commitment to future events is made. East Anglia GREEN Project – ECC, our MP and about ten local parishes (who have formed a North West Group) all oppose the proposed route. At the time of the meeting 864 guests had arrived in the county under the Homes for Ukraine scheme. Each parish has been invited to nominate their three worst pot holes for repair before the end of the year. Essex Highways have been asked to contact the DfT requesting the B1008 is removed as a backup route for the A120. Ringtail Green traffic calming option enquiries are ongoing. Mike's full report is available on our website under Parish Council Agendas.

The Council considered a recent application for agricultural storage structures off Hyde Hall Lane, Great Waltham and agreed to oppose the use of the protected lane for vehicle access to the site.

We agreed to submit our response to the East Anglia GREEN consultation strongly opposing the route.

After being informed that the current Great Waltham Village Hall trustees would be standing down next year we discussed the implications of taking over the management of the building and agreed to seek further advice on the matter.

The Blossom Way parking area was discussed following a complaint regarding inappropriate vehicle parking – it was agreed that the parking regulations for the car park would be posted on the nearby fence.

It was agreed not to purchase the replacement bench for Howe Street Recreation Ground at the current time. Similarly, it was agreed not to proceed immediately with the external refurbishment of the Pavilion, although the external shutters will be replaced and any exposed joints re-pointed this year. After being previously deferred, the request to crown lift the lime trees at Broad's Green was discussed – councillors who had visited the site felt they did not

Also, a previous request for double yellow lines at the end of Duffries Close was discussed and again councillors who had inspected the site did not feel they were necessary at this time, but it was agreed to monitor the situation.

present an immediate hazard but agreed to monitor future growth.

It was decided that the second stage of tree works recommended in a report previously commissioned by the Council should go ahead. The trees affected are within Great Waltham Recreation Ground and one at Banbury Square.

Our next monthly meeting is Monday 18<sup>th</sup> July, starting at 7:30pm at Great Waltham Pavilion. As always members of the public are very welcome. Alan Martin, Vice Chair
